THE GROUND TOUR

The Directors, our Manager and our Secretary were all greatly impressed by the keen interest shown by the supporters who came along to the recent tour of the ground and I think also that our supporters were equally impressed by the frankness of the answers given to their innumerable questions by the Directors and Club Officials. Just how many times the questions started off with the words "We have heard a rumour" I lost count, and quite frankly was amazed to know that so many were going around.

Constructive criticism there was in plenty and many suggestions, too. Altogether it served a very useful purpose and many of our supporters went home that evening with a much greater understanding of the intricacies behind the running of a professional football club.

OUR FLOODLIGHTS

pressed the view that the Floodlighting is not so good now as when it was first installed. Some suggested that dirty lamps or tarnished reflectors were the cause. These causes can be ruled out because only two or three weeks ago the whole system was thoroughly cleaned and serviced by the firm of electrical contractors who installed the lights. Whether this deterioration is "fact" or "fancy" we don't know, so the manufacturers of the equipment, the General Electric Company, have been asked to send their experts and make a thorough check on the lighting and give a report.

TRANSFER TO ENCLOSURE

For the convenience of our supporters who enter the ground at the Ellerslie Road turnstiles and prefer to go into the Loftus Road Enclosure transfer tickets will be issued, price 6d., at the gate dividing the Enclosure and the Stand passageway. This will save supporters the long walk all around the ground to the present transfer turnstile.
