EDITORIAL

Today the County and many other clubs commence their Christmas programme of four matches in eight days and it is doubtful whether supporters give much thought to the footballers' lot. It is well to remember that Whitsun is the only bank holiday which they have free. The County team at this festive season will have no time for celebration for within a few hours of the Christmas morning match they leave for Plymouth and return on the Friday. Like any other job it has its good and bad points but it is considered that fixtures could be far better organised. Some people advocate the cancellation of Christmas day matches but the small clubs could lose quite a lot as such matches draw in the crowds but, even so, much could be done to improve the players' lot at this festive season.

At this half way stage of the present campaign, the apathy of some supporters is appalling and yet the County are as well off, if not better, as they were last year. It might be just as well, therefore, to make a comparison. Last season having played 21 matches the County were third with 25 points and four points behind the leaders. This year they have 24 points but in 8th position and 5 points behind the leaders. The big difference is that the County have two matches in hand over our visitors and have

played one home match less than five teams above them. Last year supporters thought of nothing else but promotion but this year it is farthest from their thoughts. Admittedly some precious points have been lost at home but the 4th Division next season and a bigger bonus has made the competition keener. Last season 8 points separated the first seven teams, this year it is fifteen teams—more than double.

The misbehaviour of some spectators last Saturday was totally uncalled for. Supporters can help to make the team collect those vital points if they give the right encouragement all the time in every match.—CIVIC.

Last season they had to seek re-election having finished in 23rd position with 36 points.

This season however, Swindon have surprised everybody and at present head the Section with 29 pts. from 23 games played. Manager Bert Head has been busy during

the close season and new signings include full-back Neal (Hull C.), half-back Clayton (Bournemouth) and forwards Nisbett (Chelsea), Roost (Bristol Rovers) and Moore (Coventry). Amongst last season's players likely to be on view this afternoon are goalkeeper Burton, full-back Earl, centre-half Hudson and forwards Edwards and Maurice Owen.
