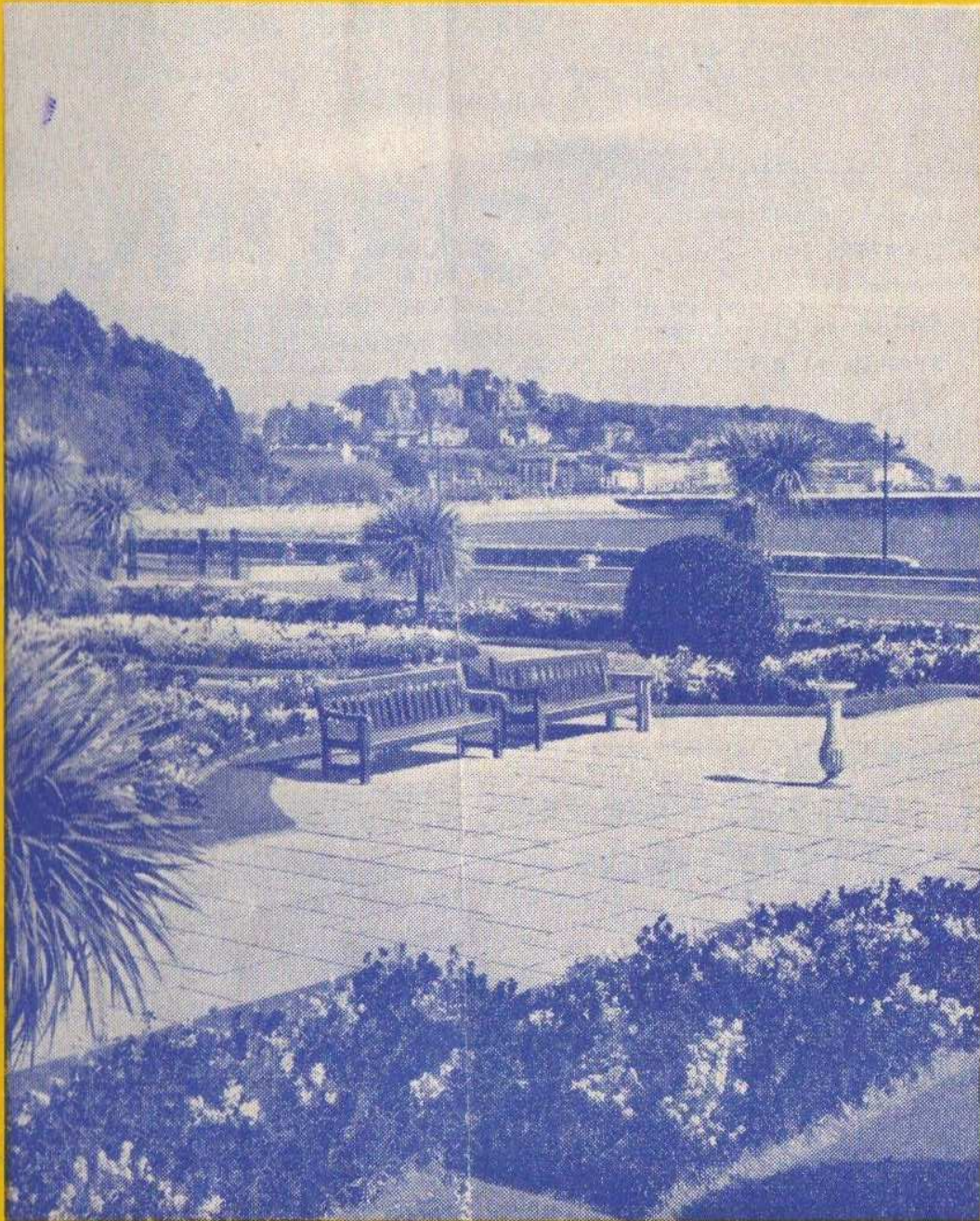

Plainmoor Calling!

BY THE TREKKER

Although so long overdue, Torquay's first away win of the season was no less of a tonic because of that. It was so richly deserved that the most partisan Millwall supporters came away enthusing about the fast, open football played by United and wondering how the South Devon club comes to be where it is. In fact, Torquay could easily have won by a four-goal margin.

The experimental attack, with Larry Baxter at centre-forward, Tommy Northcott at inside left and Ernie Pym on the left wing, paid off handsomely. Larry has, of course, had a few games at centre-forward with the Reserves this season, and played in that position regularly for Norwich City Reserves when he was with the East Anglian club.

COX'S GOALS

Larry provided the pass which led to Geoff Cox scoring Torquay's first goal, after Millwall had gone ahead with a penalty. A Ron Shaw centre enabled Geoff to head Torquay's second.

This away win was Torquay's first since March 30th last year when they beat Queen's Park Rangers at Shepherds Bush. Since then Torquay travelled roughly 8,000 miles and played 18 League and two Cup matches.

But I have no hesitation in saying that only bad luck prevented Torquay from "breaking the duck," much earlier. Their most deserving previous performance was, I think, at Brighton, where they played out a draw with only nine fit men and earned from Brighton Manager, Billy Lane, the generous comment "You deserved to win."

THE FIGHT AHEAD

After the home defeat by Reading, Mr. Eric Webber, the Torquay Manager, stated that Torquay could accept that now there was little chance of getting above the half-way line. Even so, there is still much at stake. Torquay must battle away from the foot of the table.

From the Manager's Chair

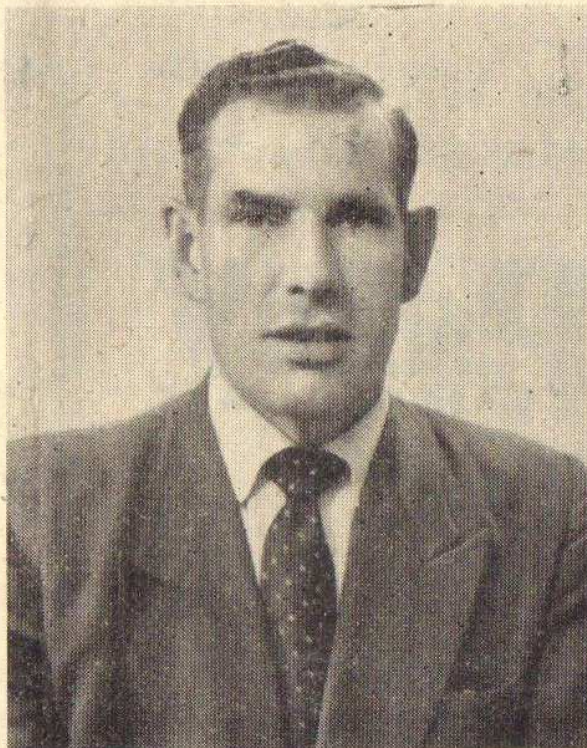
Good Afternoon to you All,
