- SAM BURTON (Goalkeeper)—Product of local football, joining Swindon in 1945. Played for Wilts. Junior eleven which reached final of counties Tournament in 1944-45.
- PETER CHAMBERLAIN (Right Back) Became a Swindon player in 1957 coming from Leicester City. Peter also plays in the forward line. Born Bootle.
- WALTER BINGLEY (Left Back)—Born in Sheffield. Signed in the early part of the 1958 season, making his league debut then for the "Robins." Walter came from Sheffield Wednesday, previously with Bolton.
- KEITH MORGAN (Right Half) Another teenager produced through the ranks of the "Robins" youth teams. A County Youth player he made his debut last season playing a dozen League games.
- KEN MELLOR (Centre Half)—Joined the "Robins" during the close season from Mansfield Town, converted into a centre half when he joined Mansfield from Leicester.
- BOB WOODRUFF (Left Half) A local lad who joined the "Robins" from the Swindon Schoolboys team that did so well in the National Team Schoolboys Cup.
- ARNOLD DARCY (Outside Right) Born at Blackburn, joining the "Robins" from Wigan during the 1956-57 season. Played as an amateur for Accrington Stanley in 1952-53 season.
- BOB EDWARDS (Inside Right)—Was last season's top goal-scorer. He joined the town in 1956 from Chelsea. Born at Guildford.
- JOHN RICHARDS (Centre Forward)—Signed from the Army during 1957-58 season. A versatile and goal-scoring forward, playing in all inside-forward positions and right wing last season.
- JIMMY GAULD (Inside Left) Was signed at the beginning of this season from Plymouth Argyle for a reputed figure of £5,000. His other Clubs have been Everton and Charlton Athletic.
- JOHN HOSKINS (Outside Left)—Signed from Southampton during the close season, being at that Club for six years, Born near Southampton,

Our Photo Gallery ...

In this issue we present a photograph of Major F. Evelyn Soames, who has been President of Wrexham A.F.C. since the early twenties. Major Soames is the only surviving son of the late F. W. Soames, a former President of Wrexham A.F.C., who was a very keen supporter of football in the Wrexham area. The late Mr. F. W. Soames was responsible for the re-laying of the football pitch when the playing position was altered and for the erection of the old stand on the Mold Road side. Some of the older Supporters of Wrexham will remember the solitary figure standing on the balcony of the Turf Hotel in the far off days.

Major F. E. Soames was prior to the 1914-18 War, a regular officer with the Royal Welch Fusiliers and after services in France during that War, spent some years in Kenya in British East Africa, returning to this country in 1923 to take over the management of his father's Brewery business—F. W. Soames & Co. This business was later amalgamated with Island Green Brewery and is now known as Border Breweries (Wrexham) Ltd., of which Major Soames is Chairman.

Major Soames has followed his father's interest in the welfare of Wrexham A.F.C. and is a frequent attender at Wrexham Home Matches.
