Today is the first time the City senior team has been at home since 28th December and in the meantime we lost a League game at Coventry, were unluckily knocked out of the Cup at Bournemouth and won the League points at Halifax last Saturday. Right winger David Corbett joined the Town from Marshfield and his partner, Les Marshall, a Scottish player, was with Bradford City before going to Swindon in 1958.

Centre forward Layne is a newcomer this season and his inside left partner, Jimmy Cauld, is a soccer personality who used to be with Charlton Athletic, from where he moved to Everton and then to Plymouth Argyle, from whom he was transferred to Swindon Town.

Left winger Arnold D'Arcy has been with Swindon since 1956, joining them from Wigan Athletic. Before that, he was an amateur with Accrington Stanley.

On Monday, 15th February, a championship match will be played under floodlights at Bootham Crescent. Middlesbrough Reserves, last season's champions of the North Regional League, will play a team representing the Rest of the League, and we expect to have two players in the Rest side.

City Reserves have arranged to play Rotherham United Reserves at Bootham Crescent next Saturday.

CLUB ASSOCIATED WITH FAMOUS PLAYER

Swindon Town, who today make their first visit to York, will always be associated with the name of a famous player of many years ago, namely Harold Fleming, England international. Just within the official entrance to the County Ground, the home of Swindon Town, there is a bust of Fleming to commemorate his association with the club.

Founded in 1881 by a clergyman, the club became a professional concern in 1894 and entered the Southern League, where it played until 1920. Then, on the formation of the Third Division, the club became members.

It has never been out of Third Division football, though it has finished fourth on five occasions. Three years ago Swindon struck a bad patch, finishing bottom of the Southern Section in 1956 and last but one in the next season, but since then they have steadily improved.

Besides Harold Fleming, the club has turned out other internationals, including Irish goalkeeper N. Uprichard.

Before the first World War, Swindon established a reputation as cup fighters and they reached the F.A. Cup semi-final in 1910 and 1912 as a Southern League club, and the quarter final in 1911 and 1924. Their last big cup feats were in 1929, when they defeated Newcastle United and Burnley.

Manager of Swindon is Mr. Bert Head, and other personalities who have occupied the managerial chair there are Neil Harris, Louis Page and Ted Vizard.
