It is our pleasure to welcome the Directors, Officials and Players of our very old friends, Bristol City F.C.

Pen pictures of the probable team are as follows:-

- cook, ANTHONY (Goalkeeper). Local boy who signed for the Club in 1949 and is now the senior professional. For a long time had competed with Bob Anderson for the 1st team spot, and played regularly last two seasons. Played for first time in League side in November 1952 and has since made 90 Third Division (South) and 127 Second Division appearances.
- COLLINSON, ROGER (Right Back). Joined Bristol City from Doncaster May 1958. Has held first team place since away match with Stoke City in October 1959.
- THRESHER, MICHAEL (Left Back). Born in Bradninch, Devon. Is one of five footballing brothers from Chard, and signed from Chard Town in Summer of 1954. Converted from inside forward to full back and soon became a regular member of the side, appearing 22 times in the promotion team in 1954/55. Has made 213 Second Division appearances in 5 seasons.
- McCALL, PETER (Right Half). Born West Ham, was originally an outside-right with Colts team before joining H.M. Forces. Since becoming full-time has been converted to right half and played in 66 Second Division matches since March 1958. Has recently received first benefit cheque.
- BURDEN, THOMAS D. (Inside Left). Andover born, played for Chester and Leeds United before joining Bristol City in October 1954. Has also played as left half and full back, and was captain for 3 seasons until losing his League place in October 1959.
- casey, Thomas (Left Half). From Culmer, Co. Down, has experience of all grades League Football with Bournemouth, Newcastle and Portsmouth before joining Bristol City in March 1959. Capped while with Newcastle United against all Home Countries and was in World Cup party at Stockholm. Has also played at inside forward.
- TAIT, ALEXANDER (Centre Forward). Born Bedlington, Northumberland. Joined Newcastle United as amateur, and remained with them until transfer secured in July 1960, playing last 6 seasons as part-time professional. Also a Schoolmaster who has specialised in Physical Training after course at Loughborough College.
- BOXLEY, JACK (Outside Left). Rejoined City on a trial period at the beginning of this season following service with Coventry City. At the end of the trial he was signed for remainder of season. Though he was born in Cradley, he is no stranger in the Bristol colours.

ROGERS, JAMES R. (Outside Right). A native of Wednesbury, Staffs., was with Wolverhampton Wanderers when signed by Bristol City in 1950. In a double transfer deal joined Coventry City in December 1956 and re-joined this Club two years later. Can play in any forward position.

CONNOR, JACK (Centre Half). A recent signing from Huddersfield Town where he graduated from the club's junior team. Born in Carlisle.

ATYEO, JOHN (Inside Right). Born Dilton, Westbury, was on Portsmouth's books as an amateur. First signed as amateur by Bristol City in June 1951 and has been a regular player at inside right or centre forward since reaching 1st team. Capped against Brazil, Sweden, Spain, Denmark and Eire. Club's leading goalscorer over a number of seasons, has made 169 Third Division (73 goals) and 200 Second Division (115 goals) appearances. In all matches has appeared for Club in 417 Football League, F.A. Cup and Representative matches and scored 218 goals.







SUPPORTERS' CLUB NOTES

Following the appeal last week, by the Mayor of Swindon, for donations to the Flood Relief Fund, we were asked by many spectators if a match collection might be devoted to the Fund. The Committee will consider the matter at the next meeting, and subject to the permission of the Directors, an announcement will be made when a suitable match has been selected.

In the meantime the Swindon and District Round Table made a collection outside the Ground after last Saturday's match, but, with the divergence of the crowd, it was difficult to approach more than a comparatively small proportion of the spectators.

Until the announcement is made, therefore, collections will, as usual, be for Floodlight rather than Flood, and we hope for the usual generous response.

If the forwards can emerge from their shells and establish a lead at half time, tonight's collection should be a good one.

The Committee are arranging a Dance to be held on 27th January, 1961, of which further details will be announced later. A prominent London Band will be engaged for the occasion.

Supporters' Clubs in inland towns of average size are restricted in arranging social events, as compared with those at the seaside resorts and the larger cities, but it is hoped to make this event a great success.

In places such as Plymouth, Southend and Bournemouth it is much easier for Supporters' Clubs to arrange attractive events for their members, and during the close season there are frequent steamer trips, concerts and dances, which have the advantage of enabling the Committees to keep in touch with their members throughout the year and to maintain a good level of membership.

This prompts us to remind readers that we shall appreciate a further influx of members. Please call and enrol before or after any match. You will find our Office below the stand at the Town End—entrance by the Car Park.

As we have mentioned, the membership fee is sixpence for the season, as a minimum, but higher offers will be gratefully accepted.

Your individual sixpence may not sound very much but, when another 9,999 have paid up, there will be a further £250 for the funds.

As we have pointed out in past seasons, our country supporters, for the most part, are more enthusiastic in maintaing membership than the supporters in the town itself, who are a little recalcitrant in this matter.

Perhaps, therefore, some enthusiasts in factories and offices would volunteer to act as collectors. If so, we can furnish supplies of receipt books, membership cards and badges on application.

We wish the team good luck this evening and hope to see our first win by floodlight.

THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S ROYAL REGIMENT (BERKSHIRE AND WILTSHIRE)

We welcome today, the Band, Drums and Support Platoons of our County Regiment, The Duke of Edinburgh's Royal Regiment. The Band are playing a programme of music before the game, and the Drums are giving a marching display at half-time. The Support Platoons will display their heavy weapons in a mock action at the finish of the match. This will be followed by the traditional ceremony of "Beating the Retreat" by the Band and Drums.

The Duke of Edinburgh's Royal Regiment was formed at Albany Barracks, Isle of Wight on the 9th June, 1959 by the amalgamation of The Royal Berkshire Regiment and the Wiltshire Regiment. It moved to a modernised barracks at Tidworth in October last year and joined the 1st Guards Brigade. Its role is to be prepared to move at short notice to trouble spots anywhere in the world. For this task it is equipped with up-to-date equipment and weapons.

Throughout the Summer the Regiment has been taking the opportunity of visiting the main towns of the County with the object of attracting recruits. These visits were a great success. In August they got 40 recruits, the highest for a line Regiment in the Army, but there are still vacancies for more. They particularly want good footballers, so if you fancy yourself and would like a change from your civilian job why not give it a try?
