Our Visitors

BRENTFORD F.C.

The post-war years have not been happy ones for Brentford and they have slumped from First to Third Division status. But since Manager Malcolm MacDonald took over three years ago, their fortunes have improved and they have not finished below sixth position, twice missing promotion by only one place. Most of the present team are products of the fine Junior side the Club fielded some ten years ago. One of Mr. MacDonald's first tasks was to reorganise the recruitment of local talent with the result that a new flow of youngsters is coming on into the Reserve and 'A' teams.

PEN PICTURES OF THE

GERRY CAKEBREAD (Goalkeeper).

Former Junior who turned professional in June 1955. An ever-present last season, Gerry is a part-time player who works as a draughtsman in the Admiralty. Has made over 200 League appearances.

KEN COOTE (Left Back).

In his 12th season with the Club which he joined from Wembley Town in 1949, he has been a model of consistency and versatility having operated in eight positions and made nearly 400 senior appearances—a club record.

TOM WILSON (Right Back).

Manager MacDonald's first signing in July 1957 from Fulham. His career has been dogged by illness and injury but he has, nevertheless, nearly 150 League outings to his credit.

Founded in 1888, Brentford embraced professionalism in 1900 and joined the Third Division on its formation in 1920. Six years later, Mr. Harry Curtis became Manager and by a series of shrewd deals built up a side that won promotion in 1933, and only two years later fought its way into the First Division. In the immediate pre-war years, Brentford fielded many internationals including Billy Scott and Leslie Smith (England), Dave McCulloch, Joe Crozier and Duncan (Scotland), McKenzie Dai Hopkins (Wales), and Bill Gorman (Ireland).

In 1947 Brentford returned to the Second Division and seven years later in 1954 to the Third. This season they have changed their colours from red and white to their original strip of amber and blue.

IAN DARGY (Centre Half).

6ft, 2in. tall and very dominant in air. Ian has had several serious injuries but always came back fighting. A broken leg at Easter 1959 terminated a consecutive run of 104 matches. He returned to League action for the last 20 games last season. Signed in 1952 from Tunbridge Wells.

BILLY GOUNDRY (Right Half).

Spotted by Brentford in Army football in 1955 and after playing on wing and at inside forward, switched with success to half back. Billy's native Yorkshire grit is evident in his play and is a difficult player to pass. Over 100 League games to date.

JOHN HALES (Outside Left).

Secured from Glasgow Junior Club, St. Rochs, and is now in his third season. Operates on either flank; scored three times in 18 League games last term.

JOHN RAINFORD (Inside Left).

An ever-present during each of the past two seasons. He holds Brentford's record of consecutive appearances. His brain engineers many raids yet has scored nearly 50 League goals in his career. Signed in October 1953 from Cardiff City.

GEORGE FRANCIS (Centre Forward).

This dashing leader had his best season last term, netting 31 times. Has over a century of goals in 200-odd outings. Another former junior.

JIM TOWERS (Inside Left).

Like Francis an ex-junior and prolific goal-scorer. Holds Brentford record for most goals in club's history and shares record with trainer Jack Holliday of 37 in a season.

TOM HIGGINSON (Left Half).

Signed as an inside forward in 1959 from Manager MacDonald's previous Club Kilmarnock. Converted to wing half and is a 90-minute player.

JOHN DOCHERTY (Outside Right).

Another Scot who made his debut last September. Fast, tricky and not afraid to shoot.
