Whilst the final score in our away game with Southend last Saturday was 4-1 against us, I must point out that when the score was one goal each there was nothing to choose between the sides, and a draw seemed certain. We were certainly always playing the better football without, however, looking like scoring goals. Our defence was even more in control of the situation than the Southend one was. An unfortunate penalty decision given for hands against George Curtis when he was most obviously pushed in the middle of the back by a Southend player cost us the game. Of this there can be no doubt, This happened twelve minutes from time and was the tonic which Southend so badly needed. Their third goal resulted from nothing but the bounce of the ball when from a long throw-in to our penalty area, the ball instead of coming straight through, bounced high in the air and resulted in a Southend player being left clear to score. I realise that the cynics and "wise guys" will say "what again!", but even so, facts are facts. No one is blind to the fact that our forward line did not function as it should, but even so, we were well worth a point. In our game with Bristol City last Monday night, with our pitch in a treacherous condition and in parts heavy going, some good football was seen from both sides and in spite of the opinion of some of our Press friends, was for the most part an interesting game. I am quite certain that had the game been viewed by these people with a 20,000 gate, it would have been considered quite good and exciting fare. Certainly the larger the crowd, the better and more exciting the atmosphere. One rarely hears of a game played in front of 60,000 people being described as dull and uninteresting. I wonder why! May I take this opportunity of thanking those of you who have consistently supported us and a special word to those six or seven faces which I regularly see at every away matchalmost without fail.


Their Club was founded in 1881; they became a professional club in 1894; they were members of the Southern League from 1894 to 1920 when they were made founder members of League Division III.






