

County Chatter

Welcome this evening to the directors, officials, players and

supporters of Swindon Town Football Club.

Formed in 1881 by the Rev. W. Pitt, they became foundermembers of the Southern League in 1894. In 1900 they fell on very hard times and had to transfer several players, many of whom went to our neighbours, Nottingham Forest Football Club.

However, chiefly by the hard work of Sam Allen, they gradually overcame their difficulties and in 1920 they became founder members of the Football League Division 3 Southern Section.

They have spent all their career in Division 3.

The record attendance at the County Ground was set up in 1952 when Stoke City were the visitors before a crowd of 28,400.

We were very pleased with the attendance at our match with Port Vale on Thursday last, and hope to continue to retain your

support with consistently good displays on the field.

It has been most gratifying to us to have both read and been told how much everyone admires our new floodlighting system, and we of course feel justifiably proud to have such a fine installation.

Our congratulations are due to our former player, Alan Wade who, as you will no doubt have read, has been appointed Director of Coaching to the Football Association, and will take up his duties as soon as he can be released from his post at Lough-

borough College.

On Saturday next we are in London for the third successive away League game and hope to record a hat-trick of away wins in the process. At Meadow Lane we shall be entertaining Peterborough United Reserves, kick-off 3 p.m., and since Nottingham Forest have postponed their fixture with Everton due to International calls our reserve game will be the senior match in the City.

The goal that decided the match against Port Vale last Thursday night was probably the most popular one that has been scored by one of our players this season. Bobby Tait has not been too fortunate with some of his efforts to score this season and therefore it gave him a great thrill to be the first player to obtain a goal under our new floodlights. The Vale are always a difficult side to beat for their well-drilled defence is always hard to penetrate. The match was also a triumph for young Ivan Hampton, for he gave a superb display at right-back and certainly impressed all the scouts that were present. Since his introduction into the team Ivan has improved with every game, and on his present form must be one of the best backs in the League.

Our boys were expected to follow up their success against Port Vale with another victory over Hull City last Saturday, but this was not to be for although our defence once again gave a fine display our forward line seemed rather sluggish against a quick-tackling Hull defence.

Despite the loss of this home point our boys moved up into the second position in the League and this is no mean performance considering the number of injuries we have had and the small playing staff we have at the present.

It was only in the closing stages that our Reserves lost at Luton last Saturday, and according to reports our youngsters were rather unfortunate to leave both points behind. Young Jeff Hollingsworth from the "A" team was given a run at centre-forward in the Reserve team but found the pace rather too much for him, but he will certainly benefit from the experience he gained.

TROLLOPE, John (left-back). A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the first team at the beginning of the season 1960-61, when he was sixteen years old and was ever present during that season and last season.

WOLLEN, Terry (right-back). Another local boy who made his debut for the first team when sixteen years old. He played the majority of first-team games during season 1960-61 and last season.

MORGAN, Keith (right-half). A strong, attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Played in every first-team game during 1960-61 and missed only three games last year through injury.

OWEN, Maurice (centre-half). The team captain and oldest member of the team. Formerly a centre-forward, he has had a long and outstanding period of service with the Club. Has played in several representative games.

HUNT, Ernie (inside-right). Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A member of the first team at sixteen years old, he is a player of outstanding ability for whom the Club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal scorer 1960-61 and again last year.


SUMMERBEE, Mike (outside-right). Born in Cheltenham, he is another product of the Swindon Youth policy. Formerly played at centre-forward, but has now made the outside-right berth his own. Another of the players wanted by several clubs.

WOODRUFF, Bob (wing-half). Another local-born player who came to the town direct from the Swindon Schoolboys' team, Has played at centre-forward and inside-forward in the senior side and his performances have made him a target for several transfer offers.

DARCY, Arnold (outside-left). Joined the Club in November, 1956, from Wigan Athletic. In spite of his lack of inches he is a strong, forceful winger with a powerful shot.

SMITH, Jack (centre-forward). Joined the Robins from Watford during the 1960-61 close season. He was formerly with Hartle-pools United. A strong, forceful player with the ability to get the unexpected goal.
