

Ernie Hunt—Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A player of outstanding ability for whom the Club has had many offers.


Jack Smith—Joined the Robins from Watford during the 1960/61 close season. He was formerly with Hartlepools United.


Cliff Jackson—Swindon born, he joined the Club direct from school. Made his debut in Swindon's First Team at 17.


