### Visitor's Page SWINDON TOWN

Mike Turner. (Goalkeeper). Just demobbed from the R.A.F. he joined the Club whilst still in the Services from Dorchester Town. Took over in goal following the injury to O'Hara last season and has held his place ever since.

Owen Dawson. (Right Back). Signed during the close season from Portsmouth. Was a former Youth International and has commanded a regular first team place this season.

John Trollope. (Left Back). A local boy who joined the Swindon Ground staff from School. Was selected for the first team at the beginning of the Season 1960-61, when he was 16 years old and has been an ever present ever since.

Keith Morgan. (Right Half). A strong, attacking wing half, who joined Swindon as a Youth Player from Westbury. Played in every first team game during 1960-61 and missed only three games last year through injury.

Ken McPherson. (Centre Half). Signed from Newport County in August, 1961. He is a Player with a reputation for hard work. Originally a centre forward he has proved he has the ability to take over in defence.

Bob Woodruff. (Left Half). Another Local born Player who came to the Town direct from the Swindon Schoolboys' team. Has played at Centre forward and inside forward in the Senior side and his performances have nade him a target for several transfer offers.

Mike Summerbee. (Outside Right). Born in Cheltenham, he is another product of the Swindon Youth policy. Formerly played at centre forward, but has now made the outside right berth his own. Another of the Players wanted by several Clubs.

Ernie Hunt. (Inside Right). Joined the Club's ground staff from School. A member of the first team at 16 years old, he is a Player of oustanding ability for whom the Club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal scorer 1960-61 and again last year.

Jack Smith. (Centre Forward). Joined the Robins from Watford during the 1960-61 close season. He was formerly with Hartlepools Utd. A strong, forceful Player with the ability to get the unexpected goal.

Cliff Jackson. (Inside Left). Swindon born, he joined the Club direct from school. He was a Schoolboy International and he made his debut in Swindon's first team at the age of 17. Has a very powerful shot.

Arnold Darcy. (Outside Left). Joined the Club in November, 1956 from Wigan Athletic. In spite of his lack of inches he is a strong forceful winger with a powerful shot.
