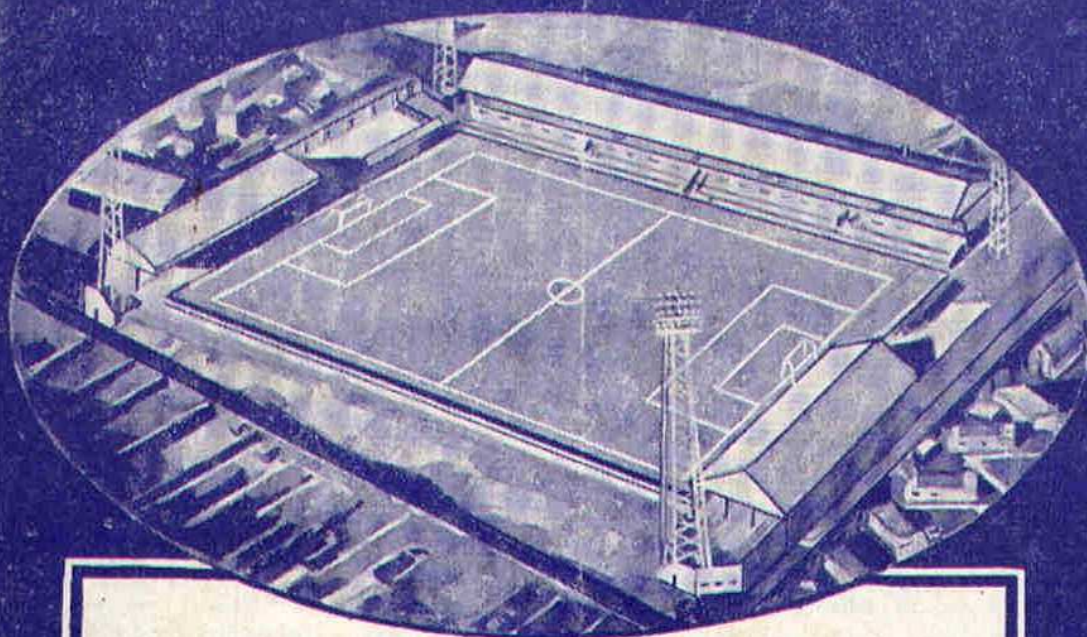

CLUB CHATTER

At the time of going to press Swindon Town are commanding a lead in the Third Division, and have been playing with a consistency that suggests they will take a little moving from the top. From reports received, Swindon Town have developed a flair for switching from defence to attack with the minimum of movement, and it is quite usual for us now to read that against the run of play Swindon pulled off another game. No one should let these reports kid one. Swindon Town have earned every point they have acquired, with a skill, and efforts which are quite deceiving. They are a young team, brought along gradually under the supervision of my old friend Bert Head. The achievements of Swindon Town have not just come to pass. It is ironical that today he faces his Uncle Jack's team, when so much is at stake. That he will play his heart out, I know, and so he should, for my team will be playing theirs out to prevent Swindon Town getting even one point.

players. May the best team win, and the game be played in the sporting spirit this vital promotion clash deserves.

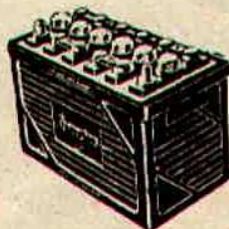

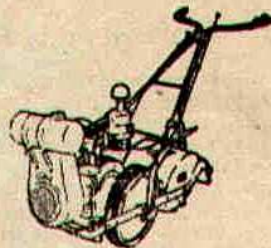

tain and oldest member of the team. Formerly a centre-forward he has had a long and outstanding period of service with the club. Has played in several representative games.

Ernie Hunt (inside-right). — Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A member of the first team at 16 years old, he is a player of outstanding ability for whom the club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal scorer 1960-61 and again last year.

Mike Summerbee (outside-right). — Born in Cheltenham, he is another product of the Swindon Youth policy. Formerly played at centre-forward, but has now made the outside-right berth his own. Another of the players wanted by several clubs.

Cliff Jackson (inside-forward). — Swindon born he joined the club direct from school. He was a schoolboy international and he made his debut in Swindon's first team at the age of 17. Has a very powerful shot.

Bob Woodruff (wing-half). — Another local born player who came to the town direct from the Swindon Schoolboy's team. Has played at

centre-forward and inside-forward in the senior side and his performances have made him a target for several transfer offers.

Ken McPherson (centre-half). — Signed from Newport County in Aug., 1961, he is a player with a reputation for hard work. Originally a centre-forward he has proved he has the ability to take over in defence.

Jack Smith (centre-forward). — Joined the Robins from Watford during the 1960-61 close season. He was formerly with Hartlepool United. A strong, forceful player with the ability to get the unexpected goal.

We have no top match at London Road until Saturday week, 27th April, when we play Notts County. We shall probably stage a Peterborough League match next Saturday when our 'A' team are due to meet Chatteris Town and again on Wednesday, 24th April (first team at Crystal Palace) when they are due to meet Newmarket Town Res.
