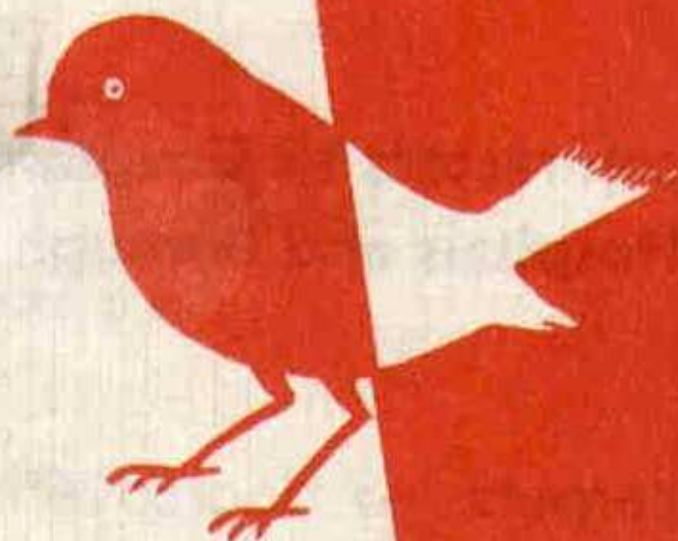

Michael Bailey (Left Half)

Comes from Gorleston and served on the ground staff at "The Valley", becoming a professional in March, 1959. Made his League debut at Plymouth, December 27th, 1960.

Michael Kenning (Outside Right)

Cost Charlton a big fee when they secured him from Shrewsbury Town in November, 1962. Was previously with Aston Villa. A Birmingham native.

Fred Lucas (Inside Forward)

A product of North Kent schools football, who has been at "The Valley" since 1949. Equally at home at wing half.

Former London policeman and Dulwich Hamlet amateur, who became a professional early in 1963, following a series of successful games as an amateur.

Brian Kinsey (Outside Left)

Born within sound of "The Valley" roar. Former Bromley amateur. Can also play at wing half.

Cliff Durandt (Wing or Inside Forward)

Cost Charlton their record fee when they secured his transfer from Wolves in March, 1963. Born in Johannesburg and left South Africa to join Wolves in 1957.

Dennis Edwards (Inside Forward)

Born at Slough, Bucks, and earned England amateur international honours with Wycombe Wanderers before turning professional with Charlton in February, 1959.

Roy Matthews (Inside Forward)

Born at Slough but learned his football at Arbroath, Scotland. Made his League debut in April, 1960. Can fill most forward positions.

David Stocks (Full Back)

Born at Dulwich and graduated through Charlton's junior teams. Became a professional in 1962.

Brian Tocknell (Right Half)

Gained international honours for South Africa before joining Charlton in July, 1959. Born at Pretoria. Is equally at home at centre-half.

Frank Haydock (Centre Half)

Secured from Manchester United in August for a five-figure fee to replace Hinton, now with Chelsea.

Jack Kennedy (Inside Forward)

Signed from the Scottish junior club, Galtcoats Victoria, in March last year.

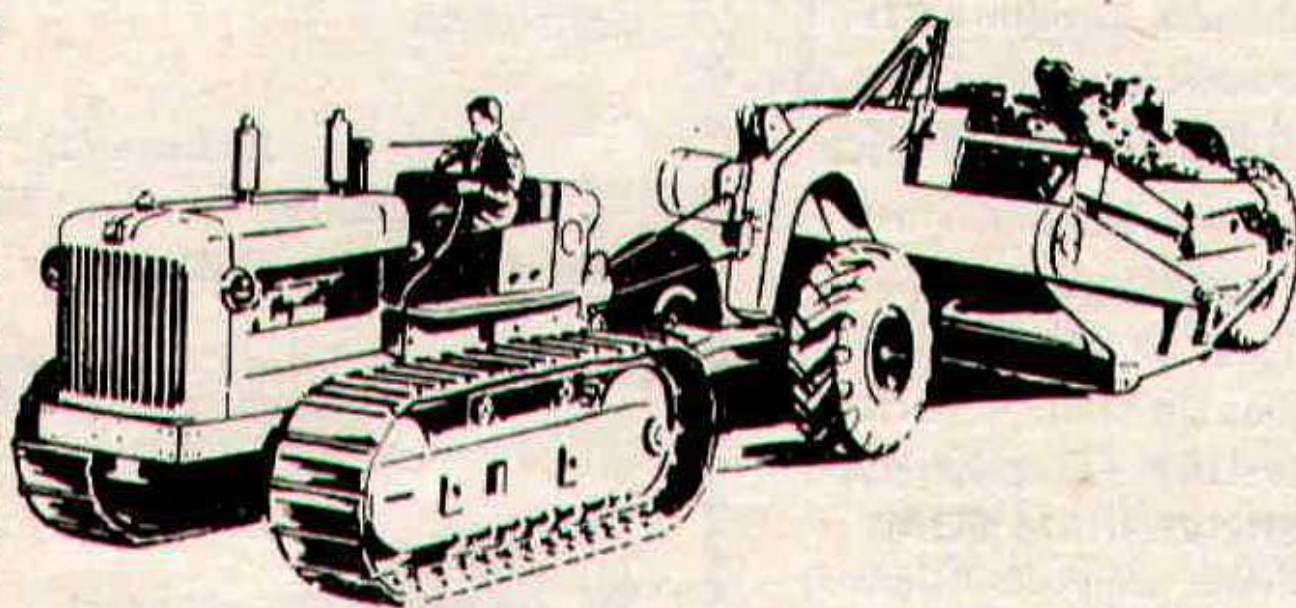

Our readers will be interested to know the results of the collections at the Manchester City and Sunderland matches in connection with the Benefit Funds for Bob Woodruff and Keith Morgan respectively.

The former realised approximately £152, and the latter £158. The players themselves, in the meantime, agreed to share the collections equally, and in fact have each received cheques for £155-0-8.

We are grateful to all who contributed to make these collections so successful.

The result of the Chelsea (League Cup) match was very gratifying to older supporters of the Town in particular, for the Stamford Bridge club had beaten Swindon on several occasions in the F.A. Cup.

In the other Competition there seems no doubt that Swindon's gate of 17,916, pleasing as it was, would have been increased by at least 10,000.

However, we all enjoyed the game immensely, even including the Chelsea sportsman with the loud voice, who ended the game with a stentorian "Well done, both teams".

The writer of the Official Programme Notes, on 25th September, dealt in detail with recent Press comments concerning Swindon Town, particularly following the Sunderland match.

As he quite rightly said, some were rather surprising, and we had already taken upon ourselves the task of writing to the reporter who said that the Floodlights at the County Ground were purchased **SECOND HAND FROM BRENTFORD!!**

He now has the necessary information to be able to refute himself in detail in the next edition of his paper (a most respectable Sunday one, incidentally), together with an invitation to visit the Town's practice ground and inspect the installation which formerly shed light on the events at Griffin Park.

However, amongst these Press comments there was much wheat among the chaff. We particularly liked the level-headed report published by "The Times" on Monday, 23rd September.

The reporter who said that he was impressed by the way in which the team enjoyed playing together had obviously hit the nail on the head, the operative words being "enjoyed" and "together".

The success of the team is largely due to the great spirit which has developed, not only because of the large number of local boys on the books but because those who have come from other places are now imbued with the same spirit.

We regard them all as Swindonians now, and hope they will long remain so.

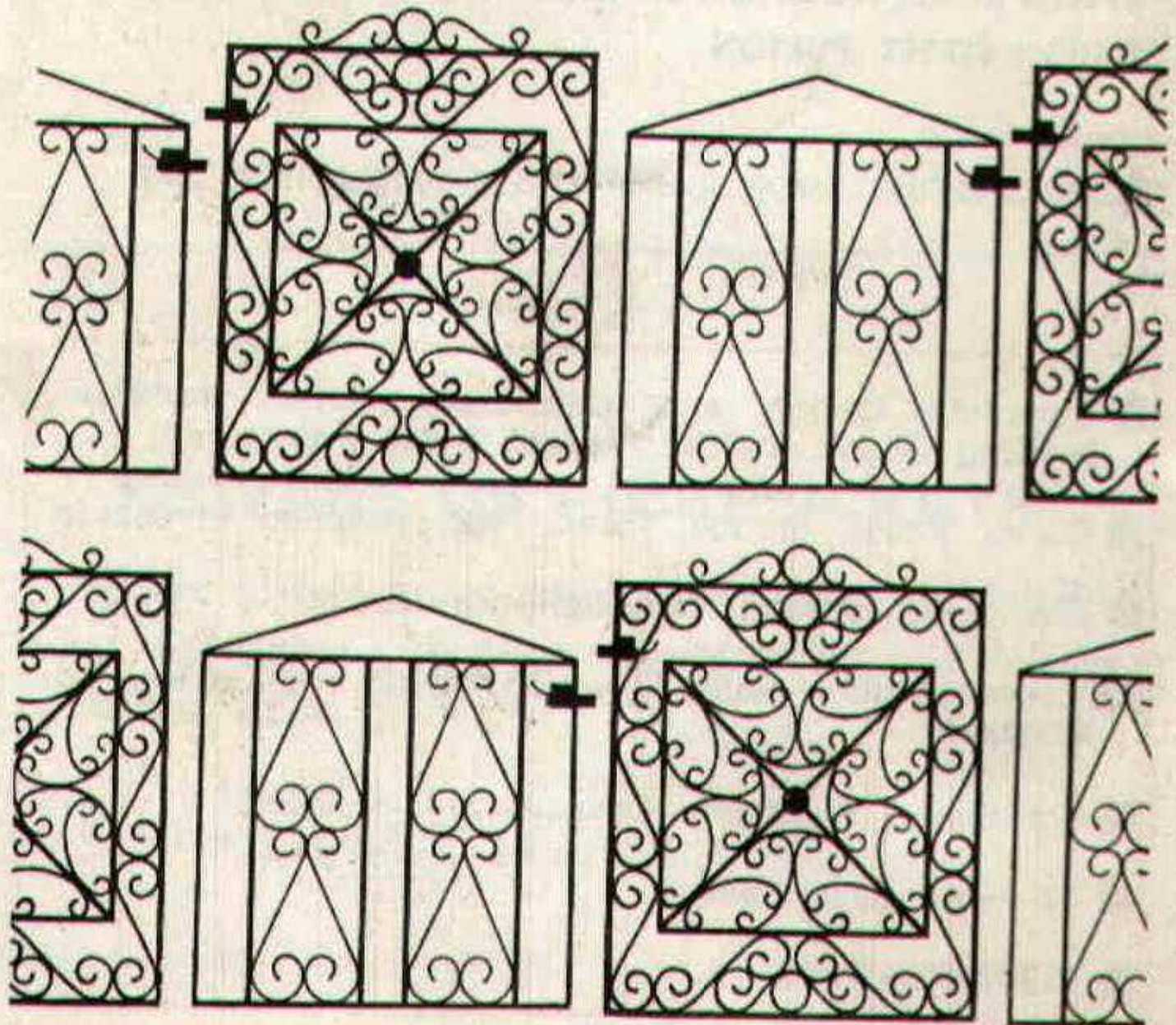
