# FROM THE BOARDROOM

Two points against Sunderland at home and an away point against Cardiff City since we last went to press makes very heartening reading.

It is interesting to note that after today's match with newcomers Swindon Town we will have played all the teams above us in the League. Of the four maches played we have won two, drawn one and only suffered defeat at the hands of Leeds United away from home. Points have been taken from Charlton and Preston away from home and Sunderland at Avresome Park. We hope that today will result in maintaining our unbeaten home record, and improve our already notable record against teams in the promotion race.

LONG SERVICE. Today marks the completion of five years service to the Club by Ray Yeoman since he joined us from Northampton. During these years he has played over 220 games for the first eleven and for four years played every game in League, F.A. Cup and League Cup to say nothing of friendly matches. A wonderful record by a wholehearted and loyal player.

HOOLIGANISM. In common with clubs throughout Britain we are perturbed at the adoption of the most recent "improvement" to British Football imported from the Continent. Fortunately at Ayresome Park we have not been plagued by the behaviour reported from grounds in other parts of the country, but the suggestion that certain grounds should be fenced as on the continent and in South America for the protection of players and officials is most alarming and one which we would oppose to the utmost. For the majority of spectators to be penalised because of the behaviour of the few is in our view unthinkable. Just as we have seen certain players developing the shirtpulling obstructionist tactics of other nations, we are now seeing a few spectators imitating their continental counterparts by constantly invading the field of play.

Rarely has this happened at Ayresome Park, in fact on only two occasions can we trace spectators coming on to the field, apart from the odd general overflow due to overcrowding and on one occasion to barriers breaking. On both occasions a single individual was involved which is not a bad record in 60 years football on the ground.

Cynics may say that spectators have had no reasons to show their enthusiasm or disapproval by invasions of the pitch, but we believe that the main reason is in the construction and general lay out of the field.

We have always made special arrangements for boys and witnessing various overflow meetings on other grounds it would appear that it is the youngsters who start these ridiculous and unseemly demonstrations, and that on the grounds in question either no provision is made for these youngsters or they are allowed to occupy positions which give the fullest possible scope for their exhibitionist desires.

We do feel that the first step to be taken on any ground is to see that adequate provision is made for boys in a position where they have a good view of the game, but

are prevented from interfering with the enjoyment of others.


