



A few weeks ago we referred to the record set up by J. Dickinson, the Portsmouth and former England half-back, and hope to have the privilege of seeing him in action today, and also to meet some old friends amongst the Committee of Portsmouth Supporters' Club.

We offer our good wishes for Christmas to all at the County Ground, Directorate, Management and Players, and trust that this will be preceded by a return to winning form today.

To our supporters and members we extend similar greetings and thanks for their patronage of our efforts. We shall hope to merit their continued support during the second half of the season.

As a result of representations made by a section of supporters, the announcement "Here they come!" was dropped before a recent match, but restored prior to the following game, at the request of another faction.

The matter seems very trivial, but we think that an appeal for better behaviour by some of the younger element might be justified.

It is ill-mannered to greet the visiting team with boos and jeers and the small minority creates a bad impression of the crowd in general; we hope that this thoughtless conduct will cease immediately. It has led to adverse comment by visiting officials, players, supporters and Press representatives on several occasions.

We last met at the opening game of Season 1960-61, when we lost 3-1.

Pen pictures of players from whom today's team will be selected are as follows:—

#### JIMMY DICKINSON (Left Half)

Must be the most consistent player and one of the best servants any club has ever had. Now in his 18th season has played 650 games in the League, 40 F.A. Cup Ties, 48 full Internationals, inter-League representative games, League Cup games and many others. In all the total must be close on 800. A fantastic record when one considers that at 32 years of age he broke his right ankle. He confounded all the critics and the very next season played in all first team matches.

#### JOHNNY GORDON (Inside Right)

A local boy who joined the Club as a youth; was transferred to Birmingham for £16,000. Portsmouth bought him back to help stave off the drop into the Third Division in March 1961. The Club were relegated but he played a big part in helping the Club to regain 2nd Division status last year.

#### RON SAUNDERS (Centre Forward)

Portsmouth paid a large fee for this player in September 1958 to Gillingham. Started his professional career with Everton, and remained with them for several years. Had a short spell in the Southern League with Tonbridge before joining Gillingham.

#### ALBERT McCANN (Inside Right)

Joined the Club September this year from Coventry. Learned his football with his local club Maidstone United. First football league club was Luton Town. Transferred to Coventry during the summer of 1961.

#### BOB CAMPBELL (Right Half)

A Liverpool lad who joined his local club as a school boy. Spent seven years with Liverpool, playing many times in the first team. At the end of season 1961 was listed. After two months with Wigan Athletic jumped at the opportunity of coming back to League football.

#### PETER SHEARING (Goal Keeper)

Joined the Club from West Ham United in the summer of 1961. Played at Wembley in the Amateur Cup Final for Hendon when they beat Kingstonians 2—1 in season 1959-60. Gained the first team position at the start of this season, when Dick Beattie was transferred to Peterborough United.

#### CYRIL RUTTER (Right Back)

Until two years ago he played all his football as a centre-half. Regular in the team that won the 3rd Division Championship last season. Joined the Club as a schoolboy 12 years ago. Played for England in Youth Internationals.

#### ALEX WILSON (Left Back)

A Scot from Aberdeen. Joined the Club direct from school 12 years ago. Regular choice in last year's Championship team. Has represented Scotland in full Internationals.

#### ALLAN BROWN (Right Half)

Probably best remembered as a goal scoring inside forward with East Fife, Blackpool and Scotland. Transferred from Luton Town before the deadline date in March, 1961. Another very good example of a top inside-forward being converted to a good half-back.

Joined Fulham as a schoolboy. Made rapid progress, and won his way into the Fulham first eleven whilst still in his teens. Transferred to Notts Forest for a large fee, but never maintained his true form; was transferred to Portsmouth at Xmas 1961 and played a big part in the Championship. Scored several valuable goals and appears to have regained his youth form; has been ever present since joining the Club.
