CLUB NEWS AND VIEWS

Manager's Comments.—After a lot of publicity in the National Press and on Television the day has at last arrived for the big occasion. First of all let me say how sorry I am that a lot of people were not able to get tickets to see this game. Naturally we would like everybody to have had the opportunity but the crowd limit of 16,000 made it just not possible. All we hope now is that a good, clean, sporting game is the outcome of to-day's match and may the better team win. Just a recap. Progress of both Clubs at this stage is as follows:

1st Round Sutton Utd. Away 4—0
2nd Torquay Utd. Away 3—2
3rd Aston Villa Away 0—0
3rd Replay Aston Villa Home 2—1

3rd Round SWINDON Man. City Home 2—1

Swindon Town whose present day team is one of the youngest in the country was founded in 1881 by the Rev. W. Pitt and was first an amateur organization, turning professional in 1894. They were one of the original members of the Southern League in 1894 and played on the Croft until 1896 when they moved to the County Ground which is their ground today. They competed in the F.A. Cup for the first time in 1907 and reached the Third Round, three years later they reached the semi-final when beaten by Newcastle United. Many outstanding players have worn the club's colours and to mention a few, harking back to the days of long ago, Grenville Morris, one of the greatest inside lefts the game has seen who represented Wales on twenty-one occasions who with Harold Fleming made a pair of inside forwards not excelled as having been with any one club. John Walker, one of the best backs ever to wear Scotland's colours, and W. Silito, A. Davies and D. Rogers who have donned the England shirt. In the Football League Swindon were members of the Third Division from 1920 until last season when as runners-up to Northampton Town they gained promotion to the League Division 2.

Pen Portraits of the Swindon Players:-

TROLLOPE, JOHN (Left Back).—A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the First Team at the beginning of the Season 1960/61, when he was 16 years old and was ever present during that season and last season.

Morgan, Keith (Right Half).—A strong attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Played in every first team game during 1960/61 and missed only three games last year through injury.

HUNT, ERNIE (Inside Right).—Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A member of the First Team at 16 years old, he is a player of outstanding ability for whom the Club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal scorer 1960/61 and again last season.

SUMMERBEE, MIKE (Outside Right).—Born in Cheltenham, he is another product of the Swindon Youth policy. Formerly played at Centre-forward, but has now made the Outside Right berth his own. Another of the players wanted

by several Clubs.

Woodruff, Bob (Left Half).—Another local born player who came to the town direct from the Swindon Schoolboys' team. Has played at centre-forward and inside-forward in the senior side and his performances have

made him a target for several transfer offers.

ATKINS, BILL (Inside Left).—Joined Swindon from Aston Villa at the end of the 1958/59 Season. A strong ball playing forward. He played several representative matches while in the Army, Was demobbed mid-way through last season, and quickly made the inside-left position his own.

McPherson, Ken (Centre Half).—Signed from Newport County in August, 1961, he is a player with a reputation for hard work. Originally a centre-

forward he has proved he has the ability to take over in defence.

SMART, ROGER (Centre Forward).—Another local player who joined the club direct from the Swindon schoolboys' team. At 17 he made the Centre-forward berth in the Reserve team his own. More recently converted to a wing-half, he made four first team appearances last season.

Dawson, Owen (Right Back).—Signed during the close season from Portsmouth. Was a former Youth International and is expected to challenge for

first team honours this season.

TURNER, MIKE (Goalkeeper).—Just demobbed from the R.A.F. he joined the Club whilst still in the Services from Dorchester Town. Took over in goal following the injury to O'Hara last season and is expected to make strong bids for the first-team position this season.

ROGERS, RONALD (Outside Left).-Another of the many local lads developed by

Swindon. Made seven first team appearances last season.

Supporters' Club Notes.—Here's wishing the team the very best of success this afternoon; may they continue to produce the Cup football which has been brimming with excitement and pulsating moments. It is up to all supporters to cheer them on their way today with the chanting of the Shots' battlecry—Al-der-shot, Al-der-shot. After the Aston Villa game regular supporters said they had never heard such a roar on the Recreation Ground before. They are convinced that it went a long way to urging our team on to victory. The players themselves can feel the atmosphere of the crowd and remarked that it gave them great heart to hear the roars of the supporters. We must not let them down this afternoon, whatever the outcome, we must greet them with a hearty roar, and at the end of the game let them leave the field with our cheers still ringing in their ears.

I should like to extend a warm welcome to all Swindon Supporters. May

they enjoy the game and have a safe journey home.


