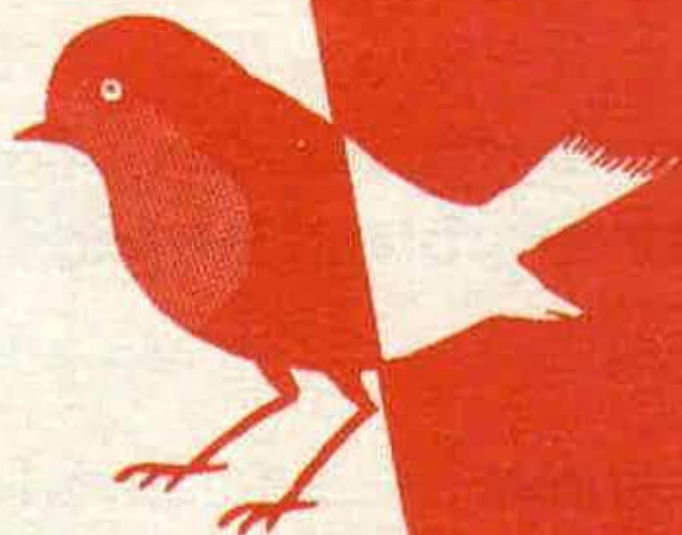

CLUB NOTES

Three weeks have elapsed since the publication of our last programme, and much has happened during that short period of time—the sudden postponement of a London Combination game, due to a quick development of fog; the cup-tie at Aldershot, with its hair-raising last fifteen minutes; the win in the Youth Cup at Brighton; and the heavy defeat at Sunderland.

The fourth round cup match was witnessed by a large body of our supporters, probably five thousand in all, so we feel little comment is necessary, except that every one of us heaved a sigh of relief as the final whistle was blown.

The following week-end brought the long journey to Sunderland, a round trip of 560 miles. The Roker Park team is certainly on the crest of the wave, full of confidence, thirsting for further triumphs, and playing skilful, fast, determined football. It was certainly value for the six-goal victory, which might have even been greater in number.

Sunderland was right on top form and Swindon really had one of its worst off days. Nevertheless, it was a delightful game of football, with hardly a foul, and thoroughly enjoyed by the large crowd present at the match.

He was a colleague of Harold Fleming in the days when they played amateur football for St. John's and St. Mark's. He well remembered many names—Jock Walker, Bert Davies, Canon Christelow, and many members of the old "Johnnies'" Club. His brother, Ernie Hayson, still lives in Eastcott Hill after a spell at York Road and Chiseldon. He was for a number of years scorer for Swindon Cricket Club 1st XI.

A party of players and directors visited an open prison near Aylesbury, on Sunday, 23rd January. Everyone was thrilled with the experience, and undoubtedly did a wonderful job.

There is no doubt that a visit from Swindon Town made a great impression on the unfortunate inmates.

The club has also received appreciation from the British Railways regarding the two excursion trains to Aldershot. The organisation went extremely smoothly, and trains were right on time. CLUB NOTES—CONTINUED

We hope all supporters will be able to obtain a ticket. Whatever scheme operates, we cannot please everyone. Even at Sunderland, where 63,000 tickets will be sold, dissension has already arisen. We quote from the local paper: "Details of ticket allocation for the Everton tie will bring the usual stream of complaints by those who are not suited by the arrangements. Then there are the others who complain about the shortage of seating accommodation. The answer here, of course, is that practically all the seating is taken up by season ticket holders for League games, and with Everton entitled to a quarter of this, the result is that season ticket holders are not assured of getting seats. Obviously, clubs with large grounds get the same trouble as ourselves when a big occasion occurs."

This afternoon we welcome once more to the County Ground, Northampton Town, real friends of ours ever since the very early days of the Southern League. Like us, they were promoted last season, they play at the County Ground and in red jerseys and white shorts.

We therefore have much in common. Swindon has a score to settle because it was Northampton who inflicted upon us our first defeat of the season, and a 4-0 victory at that. However, we trust that everyone present will enjoy a real thrilling game of entertaining football.

The Club lost another loyal servant in the death of Mr. C. Daniel. Cyril played in the 'twenties, and after the last war was responsible for the first Colts team run by Swindon. Many well-known players developed from that team (G. Hunt, E. Painter, R. Onslow, and even Maurice Owen had his first game for the Colts), due to his hard work.

VIC COCKCROFT

5 ft. 10 ins. 11 st. Born Birmingham. Signed from Wolverhampton Wanderers in July 1962. Another England Youth International player.

5 ft. 5 ins. 10 st. 11 lbs. Born Daventry. An early International Youth player for England. A versatile player who has appeared in eight different positions in the League team. Made League debut in the 1954-55 season.

5 ft. 11 ins. 10 st. 10 lbs. Born Northampton. Signed from Millwall in July 1958. Played as an inside and centre forward originally, but has developed as a successful and regular wing half-back.

JOE KIERNAN

5 ft. 10 ins. 11 st. 4 lbs. 20 years old. A close-season signing from Sunderland, where he deputised for McNab or Anderson. Was unhappy at being a reserve and had rare occasions in Sunderland's first team.

5 ft. 9½ ins. 11 st. 3 lbs. An 18 year old ground staff boy from Newcastle. Captain of the Reserve side and has already played in the first team. An England Youth International.

FORWARDS

JOHN REID

5 ft. 10 ins. 11 st. 7 lbs. Born Newmains, Scotland. Signed in November 1961 from Bradford City, where he had been for four years.

BARRY LINES

5 ft. 8 ins. 11 st. Born Bletchley. An outstanding amateur player who signed in October 1960 for the club. Soon made the outside left berth his own. In two seasons has scored 18 goals in his first year and 19 in his second and has been strongly tipped for England Under 23 side.

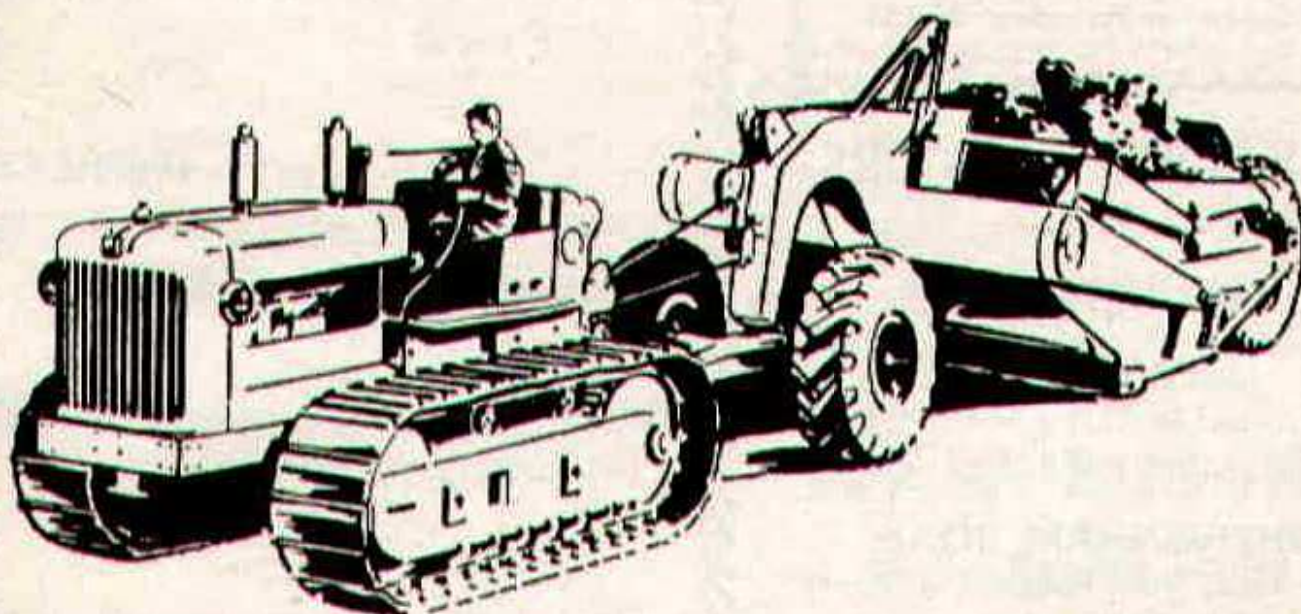

A product of Swindon Schools and local amateur football, he found himself as a contemporary, on Swindon's staff, of three free-scoring centre forwards — Tom Phillipson, Frank Richardson and Harry Morris, in that order, but when called upon to play in the first team, either at centre or inside forward, he could usually be relied upon to contribute to the quota of goals. During these seasons Swindon Town were one of the highest-scoring teams in any division of the Football League.

For several seasons after the last war the late Mr. Daniel gave assistance in coaching and training of the younger players.

As will also be known, he had a national reputation in the bowling world, where he will be much missed.

We offer our sincere sympathy to his wife and family in their bereavement.

We read that one of his footballing and bowling colleagues, Reg. Cooper, has just retired from work, and offer him our best wishes for a long and happy retirement, with many more seasons of bowls, and of watching the Town in action.

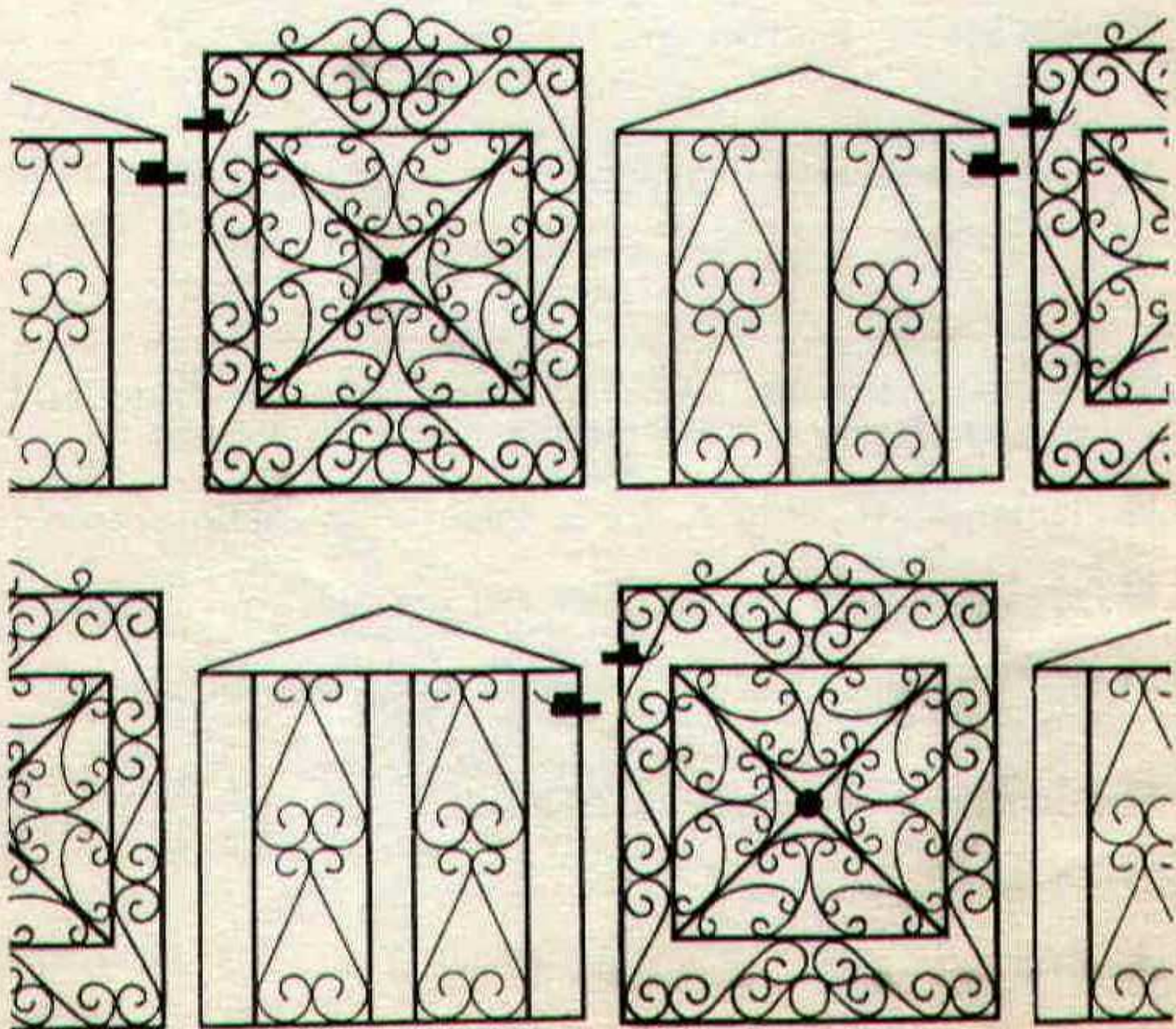
