

CLUB NOTES-CONTINUED

There is much talk of a super-league, something we have always been against. People want to see their own team in action. Swindon people enjoy watching Swindon, and we sincerely hope the desire and ambition of every schoolboy in the town is to play for his own home club.

With the present "set-up" it does appear that the wealthy clubs will acquire all the best players, to form what could be almost an "unbeatable" side. Competition would lessen, because of the weakness of the opposition and eventually some clubs would fall by the way.

One thing is certain: with the removal of the maximum wage limit, some clubs will almost certainly close, while many others will undoubtedly operate with very small staffs.

The wage demands do not at present in the main seem to help the great majority of the players. It could easily lead to the glorification of the few stars and much less football.

Would we in Swindon want to travel to, say, London or Bristol to support a team, even if it contained players of international class? Surely not. Our club is Swindon Town. Watching them means more to us than all the so-called stars. The same applies to Reading, Bristol, Plymouth and all other league clubs.

CLUB NOTES-CONTINUED

Certainly the suggested five leagues, composed of twenty clubs, with promotion for the top four and relegation for the bottom four, would create tremendous interest. A club near the top, in the running for promotion, could easily lose three successive games, and be in danger of relegation or vice-versa. In addition, Divisions 2, 3 and 4 would have eight different clubs each season, and Divisions 1 and 5, four. Certainly there would be variety, and it should really be easier for progressive clubs to climb to higher leagues.

That re-organisation of the league may yet come into being.

However, back to the present. Today we entertain completely new visitors to the County Ground. We cannot remember ever having met them in Cup or League. It is therefore with great pleasure we welcome Middlesbrough. When the teams met on 9th November, 1963 the result was a draw 1-1, and the game was an excellent one. We trust that fact will be repeated today.

The only connection we seem to have ever had with Middlesbrough was the transfer of the famous 'Jock' Walker from Swindon to that club. That was just before World War I. Incidentally, he still lives in Swindon, and although well over eighty years of age, is still very active in his business in Manchester Road. Until this season he was a regular visitor to the County Ground, being one of our oldest season-ticket holders.

Ht. 5ft. 7in. Wt. 10st. 12lbs. Born Cassop. Signed on ground staff in 1957 and became professional in September 1959. Has made quite a number of appearances for the First Team. A good solid defender who possesses a brilliant shot.

ARTHUR LIGHTENING (Goalkeeper)

Born Durban, South Africa. Ht. 6ft. 1in. Wt. 12st. 7lbs. Previously with Notts Forest—signed from Coventry City on 30th August, 1962. Injured in his first match against Newcastle, but later hit top form.

WILLIAM HARRIS (Right Half)

Ht. 5ft. 11in. Wt. 11st. 10lbs. Born Swansea. Played for Llanelly before moving to Hull where he made his debut in 1949. Signed for Borough in 1954. Has played for Wales on six occasions. Although signed as a wing half, has given sterling service at inside forward.

Born Belfast. Ht. 5ft. 9in. Wt. 10st. 12lbs. Recent signing from Linfield. Has appeared at all levels of football for his country—schools, youth, amateur and holds three full caps.

Ht. 5ft. 7in. Wt. 10st. 10lbs. Born Middlesbrough. A signing from the Junior team, is serving an apprenticeship at the moment, and is a part-time professional in his second season.


