## **EDITORIAL**

# **First game no goals were conceded**

It was encouraging to see the team strike something like normal form in the return League match last week-end against Swindon Town where for the first time this season we did not concede a goal.

Perhaps it was expecting too much for the same side, after getting a vote of confidence, to repeat the same success against Charlton Athletic at the Valley last week-end. For the facts are that the team did not play nearly as well, although there was only a goal margin in it at the end, thanks to a very competent display by Ron Briggs who must have impressed the Irish selectors present.

An injury to Peter Davies in the first half necessitated a reshuffling, yet in spite of this the side fought hard and twice came within striking distance of snatching an equaliser. In fact with almost the last kick of the match Herbie Williams hit the post with the Charlton goalkeeper well out of position. It was, however, not a good game as standards go.

### **OUR THIRD MEETING**

This evening we meet Swindon Town for the third time this season. On this occasion it will be in the second round of the Football League Cup.

**Our guests, who have been hit by injuries, went down heavily at Portsmouth last week-end. No doubt they will be all out to wipe out the memory of this defeat as well as that on this ground last week.**

Our reserve team continues to show that as League Champions they are playing football in keeping with that position. They scored eight times against Haverfordwest last week-end and the form of some of the younger players was highly gratifying as was the experiment of playing Les Harris at outside left.

The Youth team too is doing very well in the new Welsh Junior League.

### **SATURDAY'S OPPONENTS**

On Saturday we have attractive opposition in Manchester City who have collected eight points from nine games and have had a couple of useful away successes.

Included in their side is Derek Kevan, the former England international and their principal goal-getter.

City took a point from us at the Vetch last season and we can expect another hard fight this week-end.

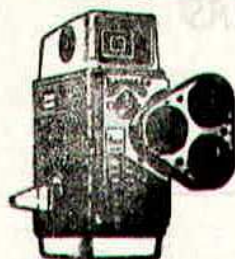

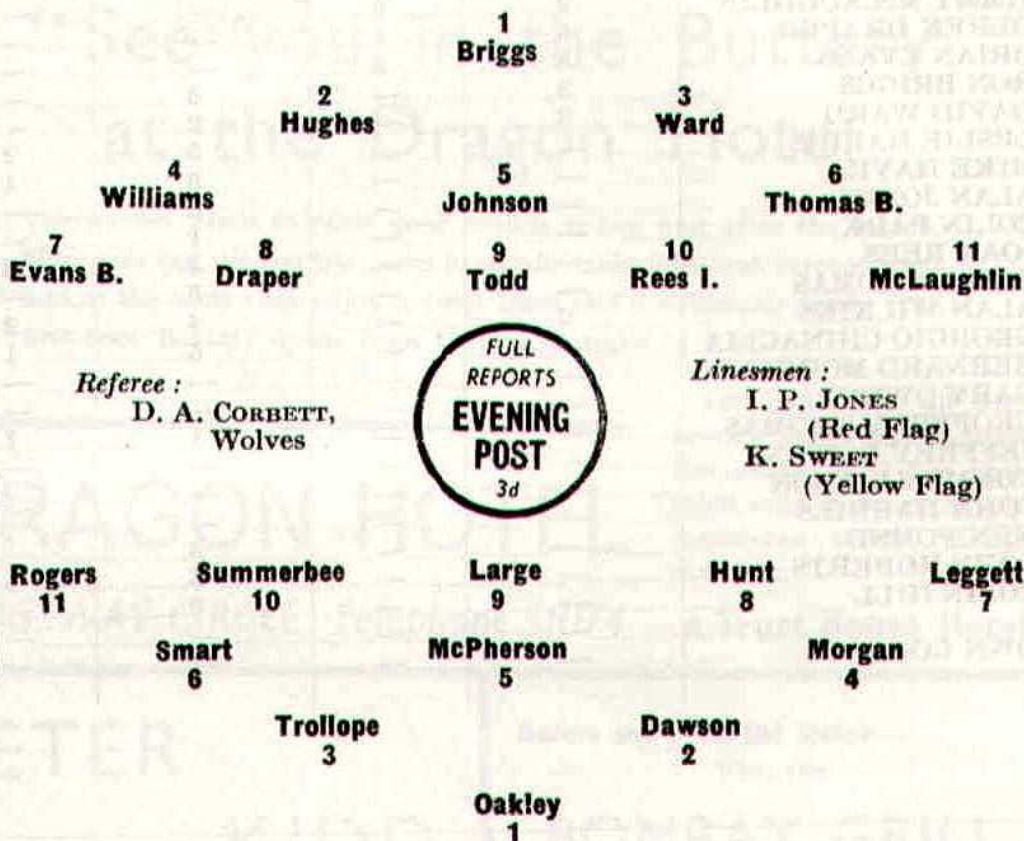

## ANSWERS

1. Stockport County, who, since the start of season 1900-1, have been in the Football League without a break apart from 1904-05. None of the four home countries ever called upon them for a player for an International Championship match.
2. Joe Cockroft, who, born in June, 1910, made his First Division debut on 6th November, 1948, as Sheffield United's left half-back at the age of 38 following West Ham United and Sheffield Wednesday service in the Second Division.
3. Arsenal, in season 1949-50, in which they never left London in defeating Sheffield Wednesday, Swansea Town, Burnley, and Leeds United at Highbury, Chelsea in a twice-played semi-final at Tottenham, and Liverpool at Wembley.
4. Rochdale, in the Third North, in season 1931-32. Of their last 26 games they lost the first 17, then drew at New Brighton on March 19, and lost all the remaining eight matches. They lost all their last 13 home games of the season!
5. (a) That when Bradford City avoided a goal concession in 12 F.A. Cup games in succession in 1910-11 and 1911-12; (b) That when Millwall played 11 consecutive Third South matches in season 1925-26 without conceding a goal.
6. That when seven named Smith were with Aston Villa together in season 1950-51. Leslie, Herbert, Anthony and Jeffrey Smith were four players; Mr. William Smith was their secretary; and Messrs. Norman and Edward Smith were directors.

**Tony Hicks (Goalkeeper).** Born Swindon. Another product of Swindon Junior football. Extremely agile and fearless. Signed professional September, 1962.

**John Trollope (left Back).** Born Swindon. A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the First Team at the beginning of the Season 1960-61 when he was 16 years old, and was ever present during that season and season 1961-62. Maximum appearances in the League side during 1962-63-64.

**Terry Wollen (Right Back).** Born Swindon. Another local boy who made his debut for the First Team when 16 years old. He played the majority of first team games during Season 1960-61.

**Kieth Morgan (Right Half).** Born Trowbridge. Team Captain. A strong attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Made maximum appearances during 1962-3-4.

**Ken McPherson (Centre Half).** Born West Hartlepool. Signed from Newport County in August, 1961, he is a player with a reputation for hard work. Originally a centre-forward he has proved he has the ability to take over in defence.

**Roger Smart (Wing Half).** Born Swindon. Another local born player who joined the Club direct from the Swindon schoolboys' team. At 17 he made the centre-forward berth in the Reserve team his own, later converted to a wing-half.

**Owen Dawson (Full Back).** Born Hatfield. Signed from Portsmouth June, 1962. Was a former Youth International.

**Mike Summerbee (Outside Right).** Born Cheltenham. He is another product of the Swindon Youth policy. Formerly played at centre-forward, but has now made the outside-right berth his own.

**Ernie Hunt (Inside Right).** Born Swindon. Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A member of the first team at 16 years of age, he is a player of outstanding ability, for whom the Club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal-scorer 1960-61 and 1961-62. Capped for England Under 23's during 1962-63.

**Bill Atkins (Inside forward).** Born Solihull. Joined from Aston Villa at the end of 1958-59 Season. A strong, ball-playing forward. He played several representative matches while in the Army. Since his demob, has quickly made the inside-left position his own.

**Frank Large (Forward).** Born Leeds. Signed from Northampton March 1964. A very strong forceful player.

**Donald Rogers (Forward).** Born Paulton. A much sought after player. An England youth player who it seems is destined for further honours.

**Wilfred Shergold (Forward).** Born Swindon. Another product of the Swindon youth policy. He is fast and can play in almost any position in the forward line.
