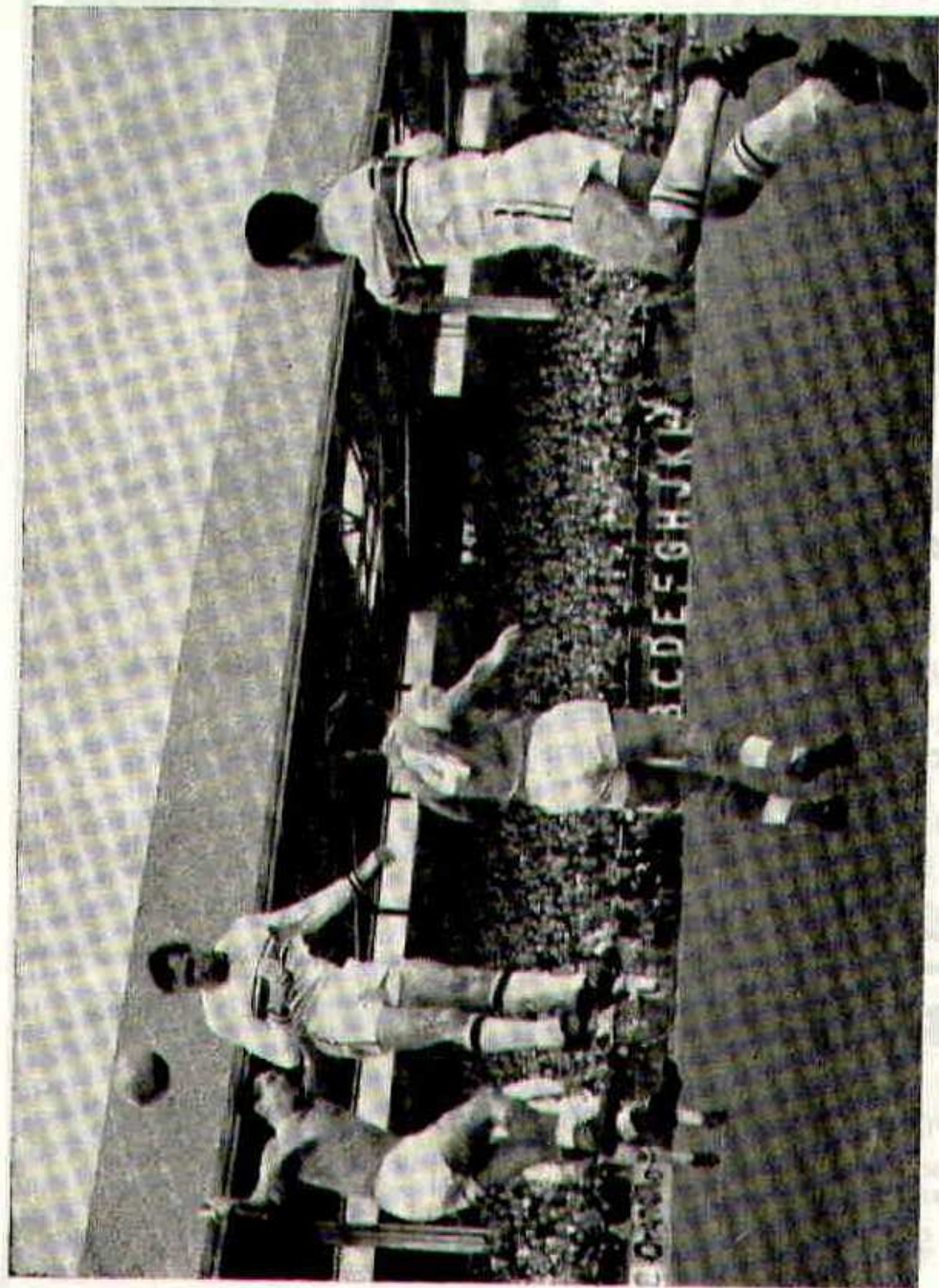

TODAY'S VISITORS

Swindon Town come to Home Park today with the unenviable distinction of having the poorest away record in the Second Division, having lost all their seven games on the grounds of their opponents.

While we sympathise with them at their lack of away success, our players will be all out to make sure, if possible, that their away defeats are extended from seven to eight this afternoon.

The Wiltshire side started with a 1-6 defeat at Bury on the opening day of the season, but there was some excuse for that heavy reverse, for they lost goalkeeper Norman Oakley through injury after six minutes and he took no further part in the proceedings. Right-back Owen Dawson deputised in goal, and although he made some courageous saves, the handicap of playing for so long with ten men was too much. Swindon's six subsequent away defeats have been at Crystal Palace (1-3), Charlton and Coventry (both 2-3), Swansea (0-4), Portsmouth (0-5)—they conceded five goals in the first 33 minutes at Fratton Park—and at Preston (1-2).

Fortunately for the Wiltshire club they have been doing very well on their own ground, and the points gained there have helped them to keep clear of the bottom places in the table.

To add to manager Bert Head's problems he has recently lost the services of two of his best players in centre-half Ken McPherson and inside-right Ernie Hunt, the latter of whom has been the side's leading scorer in each of the last four seasons. McPherson has been out of

action with a knee injury, and Hunt has had an operation for appendicitis.

Norman Oakley, who missed eight League matches after being injured on the opening day—Tony Hicks deputised in his absence—is no longer first choice goalkeeper. He has been replaced by Scottish international Frank Haffey, whom Swindon signed from Glasgow Celtic on October 10. Haffey made his debut against Preston at Deepdale a fortnight ago.

Elsewhere the defence has been subjected to few changes, with left-back Norman Trollope and wing-halves Keith Morgan and Roger Smart all having played regularly. So, too, has Owen Dawson, apart from two games which he missed through injury in the early stages, when Terry Wollen took his place. In the absence of Ken McPherson, Tommy Hallett has been brought in at centre-half, where he had eight senior games last winter.

Hunt's place at inside-right has been taken by Bill Atkins, who returned to the team for the visit to Preston after himself missing seven League matches through injury. Prior to dropping out Atkins had been a regular choice in the other inside-forward position, from where he scored five goals in the first seven games of the campaign.

In the nine opening matches not a single goal was scored by the three Swindon players who appeared at centre-forward. These were Frank Large, Dennis Peapell and Ken Skeen, the latter being a summer signing from Trowbridge. Large had seven outings as leader of the attack, but he is no longer with Swindon, having been transferred to Carlisle United towards the end of September.

Skeen has settled down at inside-left recently, and the attack is being led by Mike Summerbee who has been switched from outside-right. Summerbee has partially ended the centre-forward goal famine by netting four times in his seven games there.

Now on the right wing is Peter Leggett who has already made more senior appearances than in the whole of last winter, when he played only six Second Division games. England Youth international Don Rogers has been a regular choice at outside-left, where his displays have so long been earning considerable praise.

Last winter Swindon completed a double at our expense, so that we have every incentive to beat them this afternoon. They won 4-2 here, and the return on March 7 brought them a 2-1 victory, both their goals being scored by Frank Large, who was making his debut after being signed from Northampton Town two days earlier. Norman Oakley was also playing his first game for the Wiltshire club, whom he had joined from Hartlepool.

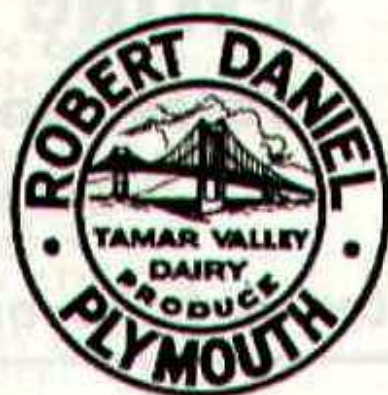
