ORIENTAL CHATTER

By "FORESTER"

This afternoon Orient are pleased to renew the acquaintance of Swindon Town, and extend to the visiting club's directors, officials, players and supporters a hearty welcome to Brisbane Road.

Swindon won promotion most deservedly to the Second Division a couple of seasons ago having finished runners-up to Northampton Town in the Third Division, and with the accent being on youth had a most satisfactory initial season in their new surroundings. But the "Railwaymen," like so many other clubs in League football have had to face the almost inevitable ups-and-downs in this day and age of modern soccer, and at the present time are fighting hard for progress. Up to last Saturday, Swindon

had totalled 17 points for 22 matches, being only two points from the bottom club Portsmouth, with whom the Orient forced a 1—1 draw at Fratton Park last weekend. It is most interesting to note that Swindon have yet to capture a point away from home, having lost all their ten matches to date. But perhaps that record may well serve as a stark reminder and precaution to Orient, because, no doubt Swindon will be in full battle cry this afternoon in an attempt to break their "duck". Orient, beware !

This is a return League match, Swindon having beaten Orient by a single goal at the beginning of the season. Last season here, Orient beat Swindon by 2—1 after a grim struggle. Ernie Hunt gave the visitors the lead only after five minutes, but the O's equalised half-an-hour later with a Dave Dunmore penalty following a foul on Malcolm Musgrove. Five minutes after the interval Harry Gregory scored the winning goal for Orient following good work by Malcolm Lucas and Dunmore.

The season is half-over and Orient, up to last Saturday, have played exactly the same number of matches at home and away—11. For 22 games their total is 20 points, and with an approximate half-way position in the League table there is still hard work ahead.

It was a good performance to pick up a point at two successive away games—at Plymouth and Portsmouth. Plymouth are one of the hardest sides to play on their own ground, and only suffered their first defeat of the season at Home Park a week ago, by Coventry City. Orient were a goal down to the Devon men with but seconds to go when Johnny Newman, the Plymouth captain, in trying to clear a shot by Terry Price turned the ball into his own net to allow Orient to snatch a share of the spoils. But by and large, the O's deserved a point as they played some sound football, with Jimmy Scott making his League debut, showing up well in the Orient attack.

Then at Portsmouth last Saturday, the O's again fought back from a one goal deficit to notch another welcome point. The all important goal was scored eight minutes from the end by Scott who streaked through the middle and made sure with a well aimed drive. Well done, Jimmy. He has fully earned recognition by Manager Benny Fenton.

Last Saturday, Orient Reserves were beaten 3—4 by Swindon Town's Reserves here, and the "Railwaymen" have every justification in saying perhaps, "What our Second team can do, so can we!" Well, we shall see. Orient's second string were trailing from a two-goals-in-two-minutes effort by Howarth, but hit back to go ahead. Harry Gregory reduced Orient's deficit after 23 minutes, and Joe Elwood levelled the scores after 32 minutes. Musgrove had a hand in both goals. With only seconds to go to half-time Musgrove again paved the way for McGeorge to put Orient ahead at 3—2.

Swindon Reserves levelled after 61 minutes through Atkins after Howarth had hit the crossbar, and less than 10 minutes later Hand scored Swindon's fourth and victory goal.

TONY HICKS. Goalkeeper. Born Swindon. Another product of Swindon Junior football. Extremely agile and fearless. Signed professional September, 1962.

JOHN TROLLOPE. Left-back. Born Swindon. A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the First Team at the beginning of the season 1960/61 when he was 16 years old, and was ever present during that season and season 1961/62. Maximum appearances in the League side during 1962/63/64.

TERRY WOLLEN. Right-back. Born Swindon. Another local boy who made his debut for the First Team when 16 years old. He played the majority of first team games during season 1960/61.

KEITH MORGAN. Right-half. Born Trowbridge. Team Captain. A strong attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Made maximum appearances during 1962/63/64.

TOM HALLETT. Centre-half or left-half. Born Glynneath. Signed from Leeds United July, 1963. Fast and tenacious player.

KEN McPHERSON. Centre-half. Born West Hartlepool. Signed from Newport County in August, 1961, he is a player with a reputation for hard work. Originally a centre-forward he has proved he has the ability to take over in defence.

ROGER SMART. Wing-half. Born Swindon. Another local born player who joined the Club direct from the Swindon schoolboys' team. At 17 he made the centre-forward berth in the Reserve team his own, later converted to a wing-half.

OWEN DAWSON. Full-back. Born Hatfield. Signed from Portsmouth June, 1962. Was a former Youth International.

WILFRED SHERGOLD. Forward. Born Swindon. Another product of the Swindon youth policy. He is fast and can play in almost any position in the forward line.

MIKE SUMMERBEE. Outside-right. Born Cheltenham. He is another product of the Swindon youth policy. Formerly played at centre-forward, but has now made the outside-right berth his own.

ERNIE HUNT. Inside-right. Born Swindon. Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A member of the first team at 16 years of age, he is a player of outstanding ability, for whom the Club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal-scorer 1960/61 and 1961/62. Capped for England Under 23's during 1962/63.

BILL ATKINS. Inside-forward. Born Solihull. Joined Swindon from Aston Villa at the end of 1958/59 season. A strong, ball-playing forward. He played several representative matches while in the Army. Since his demob, has quickly made the inside-left position his own.

PETER LEGGETT. Forward. Born Newton-le-Willows. Signed from Weymouth May, 1962. He is a fast powerful player who can play in any position in the forward line.

FRANK LARGE. Forward. Born Leeds. Signed from Northampton March, 1964. A very strong forceful player.



NORMAN OAKLEY. Goalkeeper. Born Norton on Tees. Joined the Club from Hartlepoons United in March, 1964.

DONALD ROGERS. Forward. Born Paulton. A much sought after player. An England youth player who it seems is destined for further honours.

ALAN SPROATS. Wing-half. Born Hetton. Signed from Sunderland August, 1963. Ball-playing wing-half.

KEITH EAST. Centre-forward. Signed from Portsmouth in the close season.

CLIFF BALSOM. Full-back or centre-half. Born Torquay. Signed from Torquay in the close season.

EOIN HAND. Forward. Born Dublin. Joined Swindon in the close season. Irish Youth International.

BERNARD GRIFFIN. Wing-half. Born Merthyr Tydfil. Joined the Club in August, 1963. Strong attacking wing-half.

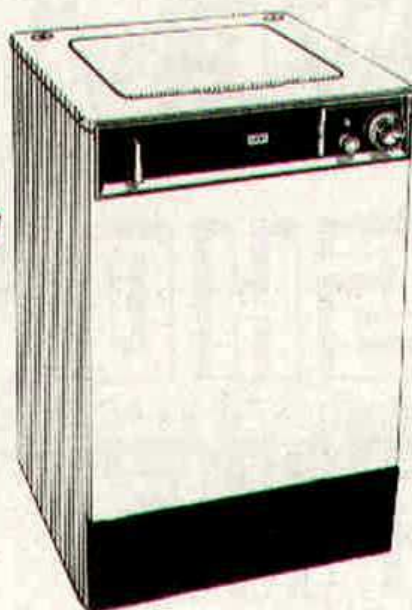

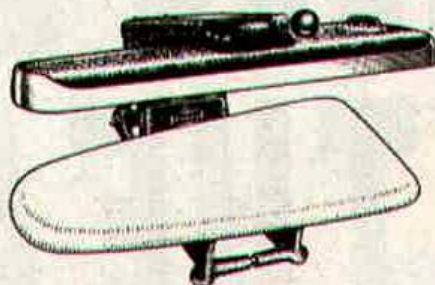
