CLUB NOTES

This is the last league programme of the season. May we thank all our supporters, and especially those who purchased programmes, for their very loyal support.

This has been a most disappointing and frustrating season. Sometimes we really hit the high spots, with splendid football and tremendous enthusiasm — Coventry and Northampton are two games which spring to mind. Others we seem to be right down, something which no one can understand. The talent is there, the team spirit, the fight and the will to win. Maybe the ball has run badly — it always does when you are down — but, nevertheless, the season has run less smoothly than for a long time. However, we feel sure everything that can be done will be done, so that we remain in Division II of the Football League.

This afternoon we entertain one of the greatest clubs in football — known affectionately as “Proud Preston”, “the old Invincibles” and the “Lily Whites”. They were one of the original members of the League formed in 1888 and first Champions. In Season 1888-9 (the invincible season) they won

the league without losing a match and the F.A. Cup without conceding a goal against. A great feat, never likely to be equalled.

Many great players have been associated with the club — Jock Goodall (a famous right back), Joe McCall (the prince of England's centre-halves), Andy Beattie (now manager of the Wolves), Frank O'Farrell (Weymouth) and Tommy Docherty (present manager of Chelsea).

The one person, more than any other, whose name seems synonymous with Preston is, of course, Tom Finney — the wizard of the wing, holder of over 70 England caps and "Footballer of the Year" 1953-4 and 1956-7.

Many of us still recall the great Final of last season, Preston v. West Ham — a game which neither team deserved to lose. Twice Preston were in the lead, only for West Ham to gain the vital goal two minutes from the end of the match, the only occasion on which West Ham were in front. Everyone in the vast Stadium that day sympathised with Preston.

The results of last season's games were: Preston 1, Swindon 0 (12th October, 1963); Swindon 1, Preston 4 (22nd February, 1964).

In this, our last programme of Season 1964-65, we thank the Supporters' Club for supplying the sellers, and their efforts in selling such large numbers.

A special "Thank-you" to our real friend, the writer of the Supporters' Club notes, a most difficult and onerous task in this season of mixed fortunes and disappointments.

To our printers, The Borough Press, the Director (Mr. L. Newman) and the Works Manager (Mr. N. Hancock) our best thanks. They have been most interested, kind, helpful and considerate. Even if the contents arrived at the works late, the programmes were always delivered on time, ready to begin selling early.

In our last programme we gave full details of the World Cup Competition. May we remind supporters that if they wish to apply through the Club before bookings are open to the public, they must make postal application enclosing a stamped addressed envelope to the Secretary S.T.F.C., County Ground, Swindon. They will then receive a official application form which must be returned, along with the necessary cash to the Club by 10th May, 1965. Applications cannot be dealt with after that date.

This year many suggestions have been put forward regarding "substitutes" — a matter frequently discussed. Surely the International match at Wembley proved the point. For 100,000 people to pay prices of 7/6, 15/-, 25/-, 30/-, 55/- and 110/- per seat, should guarantee a football spectacle, not a depleted side of nine struggling to hold on to a draw. The two injuries (both accidental) completely ruined the game.

SUPPORTERS' CLUB NOTES

These notes bring us to our final appearance of the season — one which has brought many disappointments and frustrations, for, although there have been brief bright spells, they have been overshadowed by long cloudy periods.

We cannot say at the time of writing whether or not the team will figure in the Second Division again next season.

Whatever the results of the remaining matches, we as a Supporters' Club, have again enjoyed an extraordinary measure of loyalty and support from our own members and workers, in our various activities, and we are very grateful for this sustained interest, in spite of many disappointments.

During the close season we recommend that supporters watch the local Press for announcements that may be made concerning meetings and activities of the Club generally.

Once again we have enjoyed a great measure of support from our friends living in the country districts around Swindon, and to these, our programme sellers, and to all our workers, we offer our sincere thanks.

We are very grateful to the Directors and Officials of the Football Club for allowing us to use this space to report on our activities.

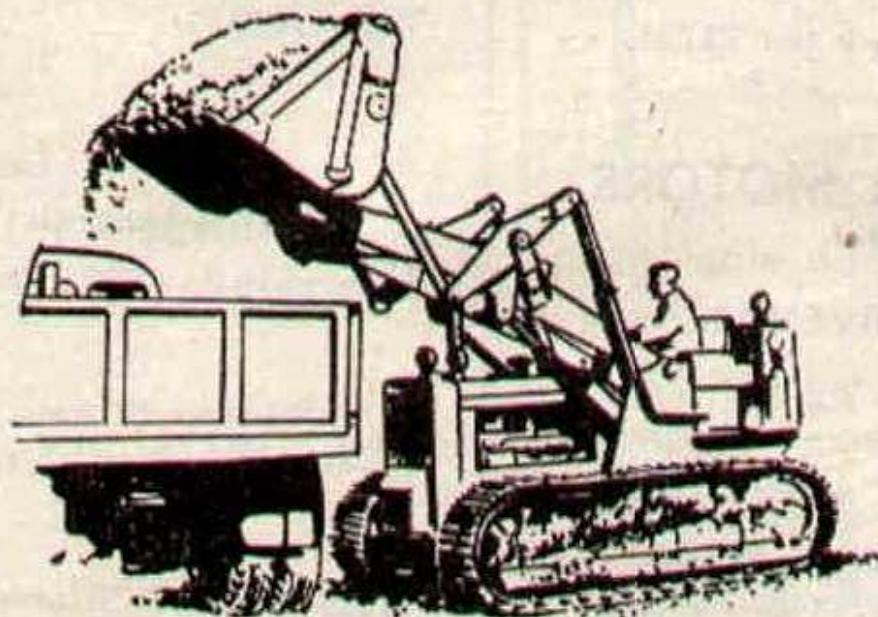

ALAN KELLY (Goalkeeper)

Born Dublin. Joined North End from Drumcondra in April 1958. An Eire international, Alan has proved himself to be a sure handler and is very quick coming off his line to deal with dangerous cross balls.

JOHN BARTON (Goalkeeper)

Born Wigan. Went to Deepdale from school football in May 1957. Was called to make his League debut at Highbury when only 17. Height 5ft. 10ins. Weight 13 stone.

GEORGE ROSS (Full Back)

Born Inverness. Another player who more or less joined North End from school. Very fast for a back, a very fierce tackler and exceptionally clever in his positional play. George was an ever-present in all League and F.A. Cup games last season.

JIMMY SMITH (Full Back)

Signed in 1955 from Scottish junior club Arbroath, where he was born. Played over 100 games in the 1st Team. Played for the British Army, both at centre half and wing half. He is tall and very good in the air. Jimmy is quite versatile, having also played centre forward and half back.

JOHN DONNELLY (Full Back)

Born Glasgow. Now in his third season at Deepdale, transferred from Celtic at a moderate fee. Quick in the tackle and uses the ball to advantage.

NORBERT LAWTON (Wing Half)

Born Manchester. Learned his football at Old Trafford. Plays an attacking type of game and as captain last season was a driving force behind North End's twin drive for promotion and the Cup.

IAN DAVIDSON (Wing Half)

Born East Lothian. Was a bargain buy from Kilmarnock. A tall six-footer who tackles well, Ian has also played at full back and centre half.

HOWARD KENDALL (Wing Half)

Born Washington, County Durham. Went to Deepdale from school. A schoolboy international and last season was captain of the successful England Youth Team. Last season Howard had the distinction of being the youngest player at the age of 17½ ever to appear in an F.A. Cup Final at Wembley.

TONY SINGLETON (Centre Half)

Preston-born player who reached the 1st Team through the junior ranks. He is strong in the air, resolute in the tackle. It was perhaps only right that the only goal Tony has ever scored should be the winner in last season's semi-final against Swansea Town.

STAN LAPOT (Wing Half)

Born Edinburgh. Joined North End from Smeaton Boys Club in June 1962. A strong player in both defence and attack. Has settled down well and now is in his 3rd season at Deepdale. 5ft. 10ins. 12 stone.

DAVID WILSON (Forward)

Born Nelson. Joined North End from school. Originally an inside forward, but converted to a winger. Capped for England Under 23's several times and enjoyed a successful close-season tour with the England Under 23's party. A speedy type of winger.

ALEC ASHWORTH (Forward)

Born Southport. Went to Deepdale from Northampton Town last season. Can play either centre forward or inside forward. Big and strong, always amongst the goals.

ALEX DAWSON (Centre Forward)

Born Aberdeen. Joined the North End staff from Old Trafford in November 1961. One of the best "headers" in the game, possesses fire power in both feet. All this is packed into a rugby player's physique. Leading goalscorer last season with 36 goals to his credit.

ANTHONY COLEMAN (Forward)

Born Liverpool. Joined the staff at Deepdale this close season from Tranmere Rovers. Tony is a clever ball-playing type of winger.

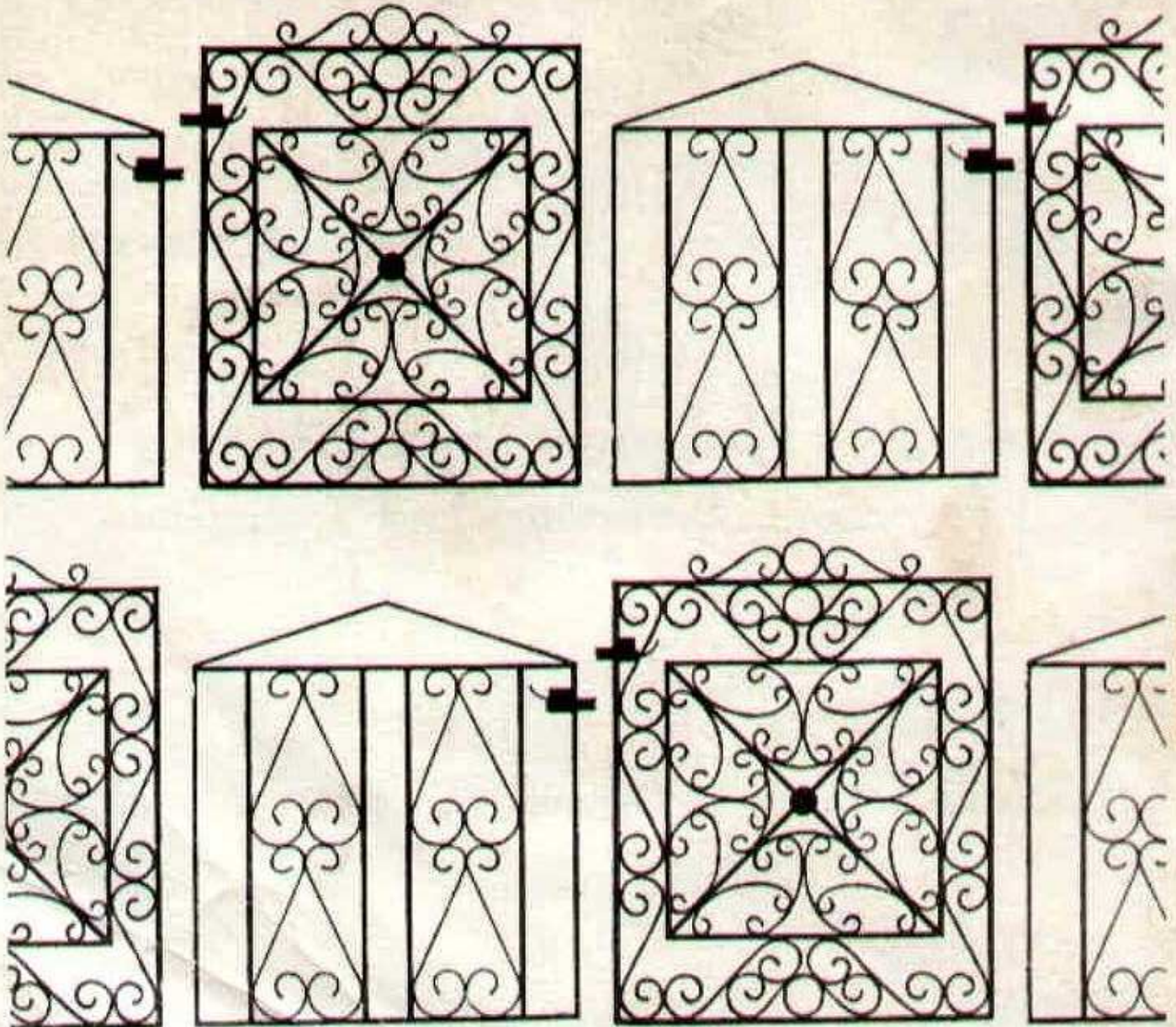
