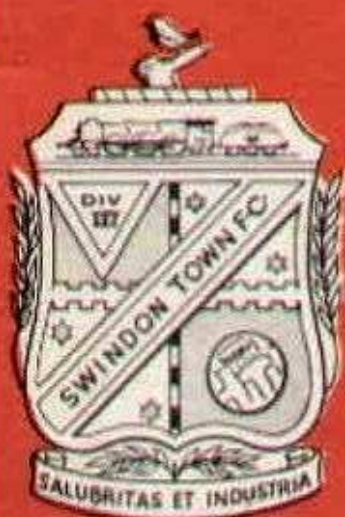

CLUB NOTES

These notes have to be written before the game at Hull. In the past it has been most unfortunate to talk of the form of the team, as almost on every occasion a defeat has followed.

We feel, however, we must comment on the good beginning to the season. After the games against Bristol City (who also have made a splendid start), hopes were, to say the least, not very high, especially as we were faced with one home and three away matches.

The first game against Oxford certainly did not give any indication of what was to follow.

The result at York was excellent, and we fully deserved our victory. This was followed by the splendid draw at Swansea (always a difficult fixture), and the Vetch Field has never been a happy hunting ground for Swindon.

Incidentally, the sports writers were quite wrong in stating this was the first goal scored by Swindon in five visits to Swansea. Although we lost four goals to nil in the league game last year, the following week we were defeated by three goals to one in the League Cup. The scorer of Swindon's goal was Ken Skeen, playing at inside-left.

The Football Combination game at the County Ground against Plymouth last Saturday was most entertaining. Fast, open football, play moving from end to end, with our lads holding the advantage, especially in the second-half. Interest was maintained throughout the full ninety minutes, with Tabor scoring the winning goal five minutes before the final whistle.

Our old player, David Corbett, appeared at outside-right for the visitors, but had little chance to shine against our new left-back, Butler, who made an excellent debut.

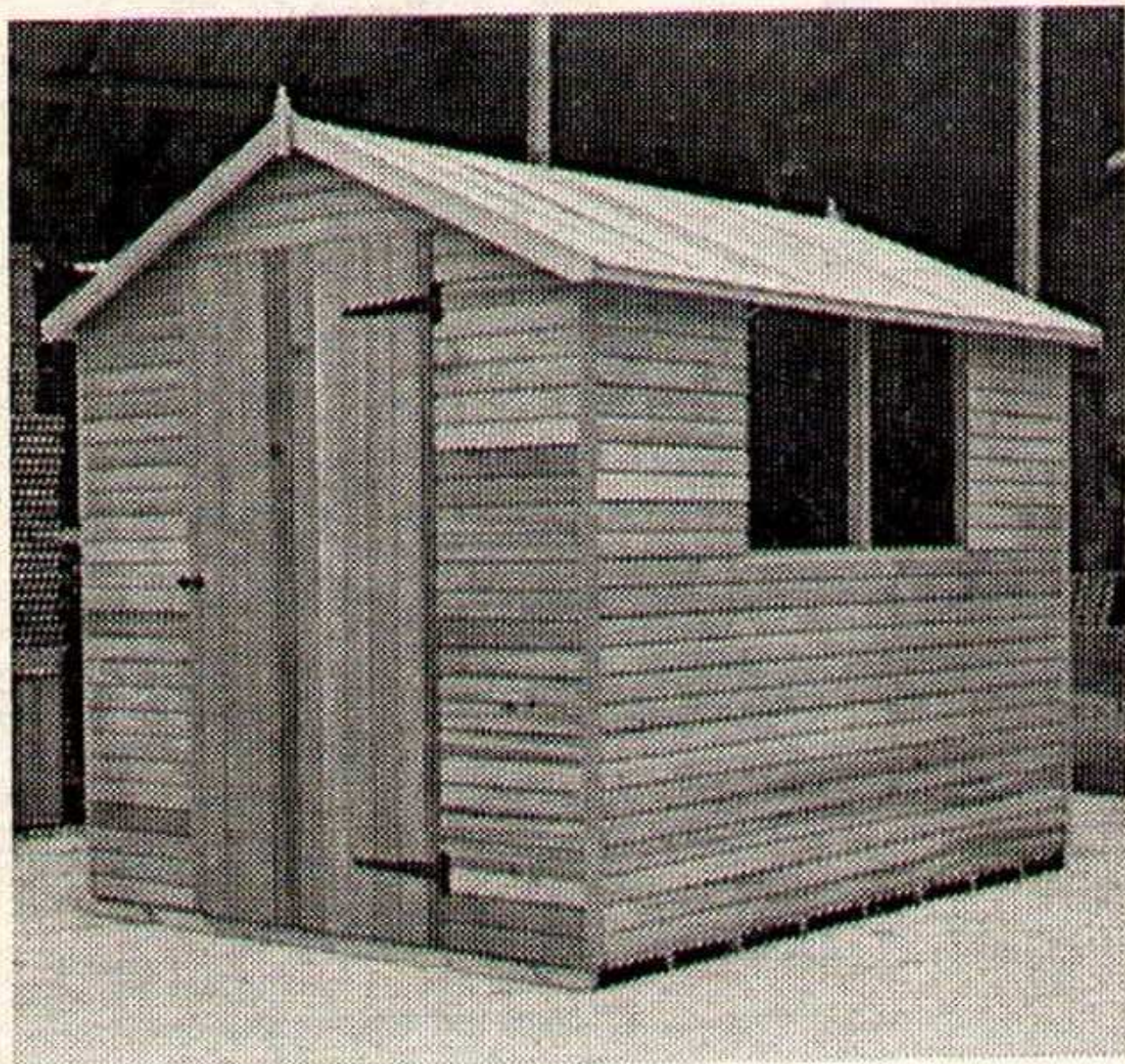
