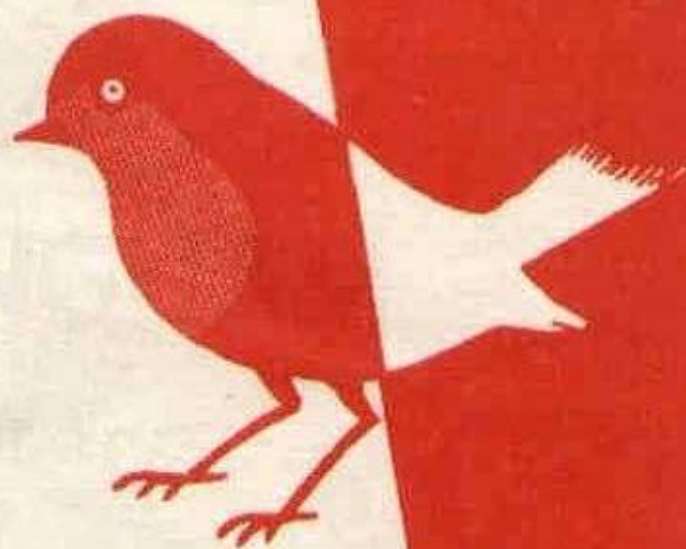

At the end of the season the top twelve of Division III (South) and Division III (North), formed the new Division III, and the other twenty-four clubs, made up Division IV. Unfortunately, Gillingham finished in the lower half of the South Division, and thus became a Division IV team for season 1958-59.

It is interesting to note the clubs in Division IV at its inauguration 1. Northampton Town (now in Division 1), 2. Crystal Palace (Div. 2), 3. Coventry City (Div. 2), 4. Carlisle (Div. 2), 5. Watford, 6. Millwall, 7. Walsall (Div. 3).

CLUB NOTES—continued

This afternoon we play our twelfth game, and yet to many of us it seems that the season has hardly begun, (it is more than a quarter over!) This no doubt is because out of our ten league games, seven have been played away from home. Since the match against Bournemouth, we have played three successive games away from home — Darlington (League Cup), Southend and Watford.

Unfortunately too, in our three home games we have failed to score. (We trust this matter has been rectified in the Bristol Rovers game).

Ipswich paid Swindon a great compliment by fielding their entire first team in the Combination game last Saturday. The Swindon team was somewhat depleted owing to injuries, but our young lads certainly rose to the occasion, and were only beaten by two most unlucky goals against, although they tired somewhat in the second half after their first half determination and fight.

One of the features of the game, was the way young Perry, gave the "run around" to international left-back McNeil. In the second-half, obviously acting upon orders the Ipswich player marked our winger very tightly, and reduced his effectiveness. Another fine point was the form displayed by Keyworth playing at inside-left. Skeen also played very well in the first-half. The attendance 2,794 was most gratifying. The league is still very open, two wins in succession (we hope), could jump us very high in the table. Hull in third place, are only three points in advance of York, who occupy fifteenth position.

Occasionally form goes awry as in the case of York City who defeated Swansea 5-1, only to lose at home on Monday 0-3 to Southend (fourth from bottom in the table). Incidentally, talking of form, Workington won at Swansea 6-1, and then defeated them at home 7-0. Small wonder certain clubs (including our own) are interested in some of the Workington forwards. It is worth noting that prior to the Swansea game Workington had played three games at home, 1 Win, 1 Draw, 1 Lost, Goals for 3, Against 5.

Interesting when we compare it with our record. Remember too, the result when we played them, Workington 0, Swindon 3. Is it our turn to score seven goals at home?

We can obtain some consolation however from the international games played last Saturday.

England, with her great array of talent failed to score against Wales, a team which contained only four players appearing regularly in Division I.

Scotland, considered by many judges as one of the strongest teams in the World Cup Competition, was defeated 3-2 by Ireland, composed mainly of Division II and III players, and even some who perform in their clubs reserve teams.

So much for form. However, with a few more home games coming our way, we sincerely trust we shall enjoy many more goals, subsequent victories, and a rise in the league table.
