CLUB CHATTER

Today we commence the second half of the Football League programme with a visit from Swindon Town. In October we suffered a 3-0 defeat on the County Ground and must not present them with the double today. Can we repeat last Saturday's performance, when our Reserves beat Swindon Reserves 7-1? Yet another great victory for our Combination team who could on present form finish the season in the runner-up position.

In the Football League Competition it is interesting at the halfway stage to compare our position with last year's table. After 23 games last season we had collected 25 points, having won 11 games, lost 9 and drawn 3. This season we have collected 24 points, having won 10 games, lost 9 and drawn 4. We could not be much closer than this. At the end of last season we finished eighth from the top of the table. We must put up a better performance this half of the season and improve on last year's final position.

Our attendances are unfortunately down and we look for the turnstiles to be much busier in 1966 than in 1965.

Next Saturday we are without a match either for the First team or Reserves. This is due unfortunately to the 3rd Round of the F.A. Cup being played on that day. We could have re-arranged a fixture but with this January weather there is always the uncertainty of the game being off owing to the condition of the ground, and in any case gates this month are likely to be much lower than in the better weather we hope for later in the season.





Tony Hicks (Goalkeeper). Born Swindon. Another product of Swindon Junior football. Extremely agile and fearless. Signed professional September, 1962.

Owen Dawson (Full-back). Born Hatfield. Signed from Portsmouth June, 1962. Was a former Youth International.

John Trollope (Left-back). Born Swindon. A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the First Team at the beginning of the season 1960-61 when he was 16 years old, and was ever present during that season and season 1961-62. Maximum appearances in the League side during 1962-63-64-65.

Keith Morgan (Right-half). Born Trowbridge.

A strong attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Made maximum appearances during 1962-63-64.

Mel Nurse (Centre-half). A recent signing from Middlesbrough. He needs little introduction to football followers. A strong forceful player. He has many Welsh International caps to his credit. His ability and experience has done much to strengthen the Town's defence.

Gordon Atherton (Wing-half). Born Horwich. Signed from Bury for a substantial fee December, 1964. He is a strong relentless half-back.

Tom Hallett (Centre-half or Left-half). Born Glynneath. Signed from Leeds United July, 1963. Fast and tenacious player.

Dennis Brown (Inside-forward). Born Reading. Joined the club from Chelsea for a very substantial fee in November, 1964. A fast raiding inside-forward, he made several appearances at centre-forward last season.

Keith East (Inside-forward). Born Southampton. Signed from Portsmouth in the close season 1964. A strong forceful player. He scored 20 goals in 26 games for the club's Reserve team which gained promotion to Division I of the Football Combination last season.

Roger Smart (Wing-half). Born Swindon. Another local born player who joined the club direct from Swindon Schoolboys' team. At 17 he made the centre-forward berth in the Reserve team his own, later converted to a wing-half.

Donald Rogers (Forward). Born Paulton. A much sought after player. An England youth player who it seems is destined for further honours.
