We were able to field the same team that had taken a point at Peterborough on Monday last.


This was not a great game to watch and despite Oldham's lowly League position, they played some attractive football.

Dennis Brown—Born Reading. Joined the Club from Chelsea for a very substantial fee in November 1964. A fast raiding forward.


Donald Rogers—Born Paulton. A much sought after player. An England youth player who it seems is destined for further honours.
