ment and the people who barrack, do so, because they want us to win, and it is because they are such keen supporters, this treatment does not help the players, rather the opposite, no man can give of his best when discouraged. Remember the most frustrated are the players themselves, they know they are playing badly, and so often the harder they try, the worse the position becomes. The lads felt it very badly on Tuesday last.

We know spectators pay to see and expect a good game of football with hundred per cent effort by eleven men, but a little help and even kindness goes a long way. So please cheer, not jeer.

It is a great pity, because at one period of the year it looked as if Swindon would finish the season in third position. This would have been a great achievement when we consider this time last year. A change of management, administration, players and even directors, causes a certain amount of upheaval. A few days before the season opened we did not know how we stood with players, yet by the end of October, we were playing fine attacking football, with the accent on goals. The season has faded, but taking all in all, after the various upsets, the club has come through very well indeed. No doubt we shall learn from our mistakes of this year.

Our opponents this evening make a welcome reappearance at Swindon. The teams last met early in our first season of Division II—3rd September, 1963. Result: Swindon 2, Grimsby 1. The Swindon team on that occasion was Turner; Dawson, Trollope; Morgan, McPherson, Woodruff; Summerbee, Atkins, Smith, Smart, Rogers. Ernie Hunt was absent, due to one of his attacks of tonsillitis. The gate for the game was 21,800.

Grimsby for quite a long time challenged for the leadership of the league, but since Christmas have fallen from grace and now occupy sixteenth position.

Swindon's scorers were Alan Fowler (later killed in World War II) and Ben Morton (the centre-forward transferred to Swindon from Torquay). This was his first goal for his new club. Included in the visitors' team was the famous English international goalkeeper George Tweedy, and the smallest of centre-forwards to win a cap, Jackie Bestall. Grimsby is known throughout the football world for its wonderful hospitality and generosity of gifts. The Board Room at Blundell Park is built to represent the bridge of a ship.

WRIGHT, Charlie (Goalkeeper)

Signed from Workington in February, 1963 and played major role in helping Grimsby escape relegation that season with some brilliant, fearless keeping. Formerly with Glasgow Rangers, he was born in Glasgow.

THOMPSON, Jimmy (Right Back)

Product of St. Mary's Boys' Club, Gateshead. Aged 22, made rapid progress through Juniors to a League place. League debut v. Sunderland March 23rd, 1963. Fast, hard-tackling player.

COCKERILL, Ron (Right Half)

Tall, attacking wing half who packs a powerful shot in either foot. Signed from Huddersfield Town on August 8th, 1958 after making 40 first team appearances for the Yorkshire club. A regular with Grimsby, at 29 years old was also a useful League cricketer.

CLIFTON, Brian (Centre Half)

Joined Grimsby Town from Southampton as a wing half or inside forward in October, 1962. Has had bad luck to suffer a series of injuries, but returned during last season to shine as pivot with accomplished, cool displays.

JOBLING, Keith (Left Half)

Local boy who made good. Signed from local football as a wing half and made League debut against Barrow on February 13th, 1954. Has been club's regular centre half in recent years until introduction of 4-2-4 system late last season, when he switched successfully to left half spot.

TEES, Matt (Inside Right or Left)

Signed in July, 1963 from Airdrie for whom he played 43 senior games in two seasons. Replacement for former Grimsby goal-getter Rafferty and like him is good with his head.

HILL, Brian (Outside Left)

Signed in July 1960 from Ollerton Colliery. Formerly played for Mansfield Boys. League debut against Torquay in April, 1961. Introduced into League side in 1962-63 and rapidly made name as promising raiding winger.

TAYLOR, Graham (Wing Half or Full Back)

Signed for club as an amateur in August, 1961, turned professional July, 1962. Made League debut against Newcastle at left back in September, 1963. Promising, two-footed defender.

LANCASTER, Raymond (Wing Half)

Signed in December, 1964 from Rotherham United for whom he made over 70 League appearances. Constructive player; use of ball very good.

COLLINS, Douglas (Inside Forward or Wing)

A Rotherham boy; signed on March, 1963. Ball player, plays inside forward or wing.

WAINMAN, Harry (Goalkeeper)

A native of Hull, signed on September, 1962.

ROSS, Bobby (Inside Forward)

Transferred from St. Mirren in June, 1965. Played 75 Scottish First Division games in two and a half seasons; was with East Fife before joining St. Mirren. Plays inside forward or wing half.






