NEWS and VIEWS

At last we have broken the ice a little. Have we turned the corner? We sincerely hope so. The draw at Doncaster (these notes must be written before the Shrewsbury game) ended our sequence of defeats after four in succession. This time, we did not score first, but fought back, after being in arrears. This to my mind is the most pleasing feature. In the earlier games our opponents have come back after our goal, but in most cases it was the home team.

To make a draw was most pleasant, but to equalize away from home is better still, obviously the fight and determination are still there, all that is wanted now is a resounding win and the restoration of confidence. May that be forthcoming this evening, because the winners of tonight's game have an attractive fixture at home versus West Bromwich Albion. The progress in the League Cup (this is our fourth game in the competition) helps to create interest and keep football alive. We badly need league points, but success breeds success. Incidentally our goal at Doncaster was scored by Joe Butler playing at inside left, with Roger Smart at right half. At the last moment Keith Morgan was unable to travel, because of a knee injury.

This season the League Cup Competition is most successful. Every team with the exception of the F.A. Cup and Division I winners is taking part. When it first began in Season 1960-61 it was not greatly favoured by the bigger clubs, and five, Arsenal, Sheffield Wednesday, Spurs, West Bromwich Albion and Wolverhampton did not enter. Swindon lost to Shrewsbury after three games in Round 2. The ultimate winner was Aston Villa, by an aggregate of three goals to two, after a two-leg final with Rotherham. We rather think our present manager played in those two games, or maybe he was the manager by

then. We are not quite sure as rarely will Mr. D. Williams talk about his successes.

The following season ten clubs did not participate. The five mentioned previously were joined by Burnley, Chelsea, Everton, Manchester United and Liverpool. The winners this time were Norwich City who beat Rochdale 3-1 in a two-leg final.

In season 1962-63, two more clubs, Ipswich Town and Nottingham Forest joined the list of absentees. Things did not look too bright for the competition which was won by Birmingham City who defeated Aston Villa 3-2 in a two-leg final.

Since that date however, the bigger clubs have realised the value of the League Cup Competition, and all enter, especially since it has become a stepping stone for entry into European Football. The gate in these matches is divided three ways. After expenses have been met the home club receives 40% of the net proceeds, the away club 40% and the remaining 20% is paid into the league pool, for equal distribution to all clubs taking part. This then is a case of the wealthier clubs helping their poor relations.

So this evening for the third time in twelve days we meet Doncaster Rovers. A fine club, which has received many setbacks, during the last few years. As stated in a previous programme, they were relegated from Division II and Division III in successive seasons, due to some extent, to a serious injury (a broken leg in an under 23-years-of-age international at Bristol) to their young and very promising player Alick Jeffrey. This season with the above named player really coming back to form after many years, came a real disaster. He was badly injured in a road accident, and it is very doubtful if he will play again this season. In the same accident, the captain, and centre half was killed. Doncaster has sadly missed these two players, and is still struggling to get a settled team.

A most hospitable club, with which many famous names have been associated. Mr. Jack Crayston, at one time manager, a real gentleman of England and Arsenal fame. Mr. Peter Doherty, a great Irish inside-forward, player-manager, and later manager of Bristol City. Like Swindon, Doncaster play in red shirts, and white shorts, but tonight will probably play in all-white strip, with red facings.

This week Mr. Matt Busby has come right out on the side of those who advocate the appointment of full-time referees, with a commensurate salary. There is much to be said in favour of the formation of such a panel. One point in Mr. Busby's suggestions is that today players are valued in thousands of pounds, some a hundred thousand, and receive up to one hundred pounds a week. The referee upon whose decision so much depends is in charge of twenty-two such players, total value, impossible to assess, and for discharging the most onerous duty he is paid the princely sum of ten guineas, and is purely part-time. Should the scheme come into being, the men chosen will train full-time with professional players, and become acquainted with their attitude to the game, and see their point of view. In our opinion, what is most needed, are men of the right type to be in charge of a group of people. Probably our best referees today, come from the executive class. Men with experience in giving orders, and men with personality, able to command. It is interesting to study the age and occupation of some of our present men of the whistle. We are sure you will recognize some of the names.
