We met on all possible occasions in Division III (South) during the periods 1920-38 and 1950-58, when Swindon left with the "top-twelve" for Division III. In June, 1963, they were promoted to Division II with Northampton, but they stayed only two seasons.

but recent results have improved the situation considerably, and they now stand clear of the danger zone.
