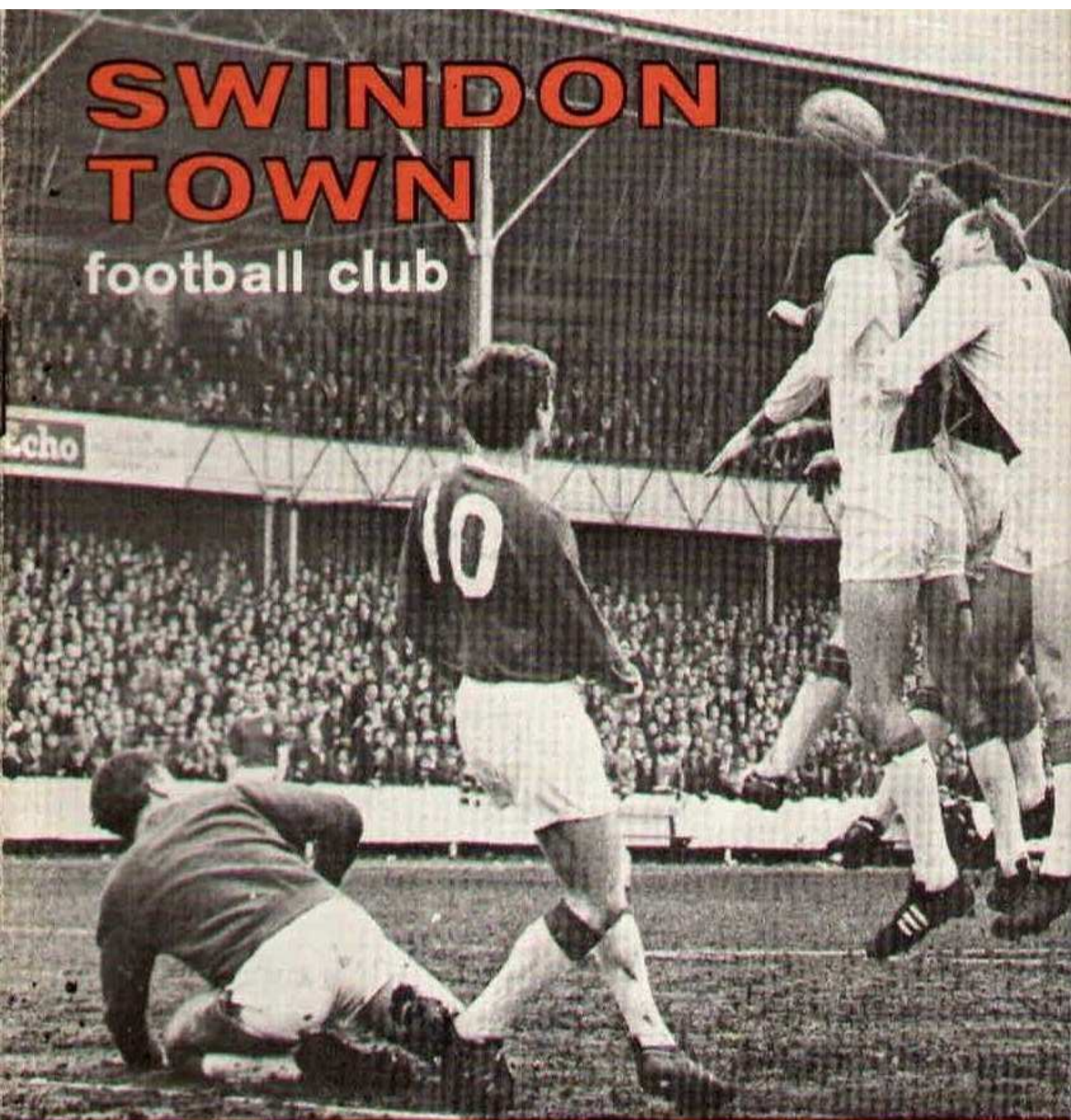

NEWS and VIEWS

The news is certainly brighter. A point gained at Swansea as the result of a two all draw. We were probably rather fortunate to be losing by only two goals at half-time (it could easily have been four), but a team that can fight back, two goals down, away from home, deserves at least a point, and every credit. It was very good to see Roger Smart, and Joe Butler among the goals. No team ever had two more hard working players. They are the link men—the runners, and what runners, they must cover miles in one game. Many of our supporters don't really appreciate the work done by Smart in the cup-ties—two hours non-stop against Nottingham Forest.

Did you notice the attendance at the Swansea game? 5,816 people present. At the time of writing, it appears certain we shall take quite double that number to Villa Park. What fantastic support we enjoy—something like a hundred coaches booked. We only hope they now feel the journey was worth while, and also they will continue to flock to the County Ground in their thousands.

Today we welcome to Swindon, after a very long absence Torquay United. The last time the teams met was in Season 1961-62. As this year the games were played during the Easter Holiday period. Torquay came to Swindon on Good Friday and won by one goal to nil. In the return on Easter Monday, the home team won by three goals to nil, thus completing the double. In spite of these results Torquay finished

the season in twenty-first position, and was therefore relegated to Division IV, only returning at the beginning of this season. The fixtures this year are reversed, we trust the results will also be in reverse from Season 1961-62. Our final placing that season was ninth with seventy-eight goals scored for, and seventy-one against, points gained, forty-nine.

With Lord Willis's Bill likely to be passed in Parliament, a good deal of controversy is taking place, regarding the position of professional football. The Football Association circulated all clubs on this matter, regarding the taking of gate money for Sunday matches starting after **2 p.m.** Result: in favour 226, against 36.

Articles have appeared in the press, both in favour and against: one writes as follows. "The switch to Sunday Soccer is commonsense. Access to the big stadiums will be easier, parking easier. What is often the dragging bore (what an admission) of a Sunday afternoon could be filled by the pleasure of watching the big game.

On the Continent, the stadiums stage a whole day's sport, athletics, cycling, schoolboy and youth soccer is part of the preamble to the big match. Some clubs have created facilities for the family day out. Families would not put-up with shoddy facilities, radio entertainment, club rooms and refreshment bars, and their comfortable seating must become standard."

Another paper prints the headline "Sunday Soccer? Not for me: bottle throwing, bad and obscene language, fighting on

the terraces and in the streets, windows of motor coaches smashed, supporters beaten up, vandalism and train wrecking, is that your idea of a quiet pleasant Sunday afternoon?"

So it goes on, still more detail, and problems such as obvious transport difficulties, and remember the time stated at the beginning **2 p.m.**

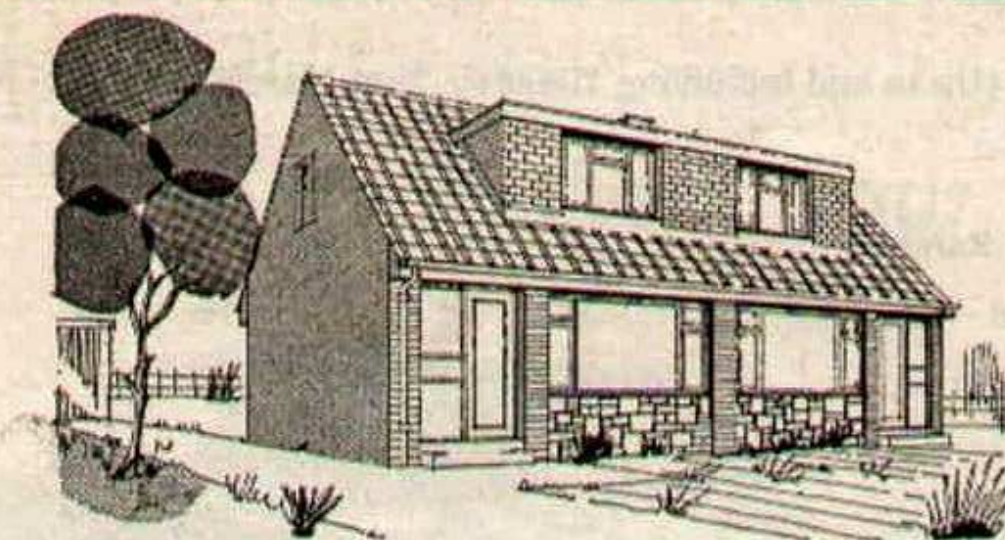

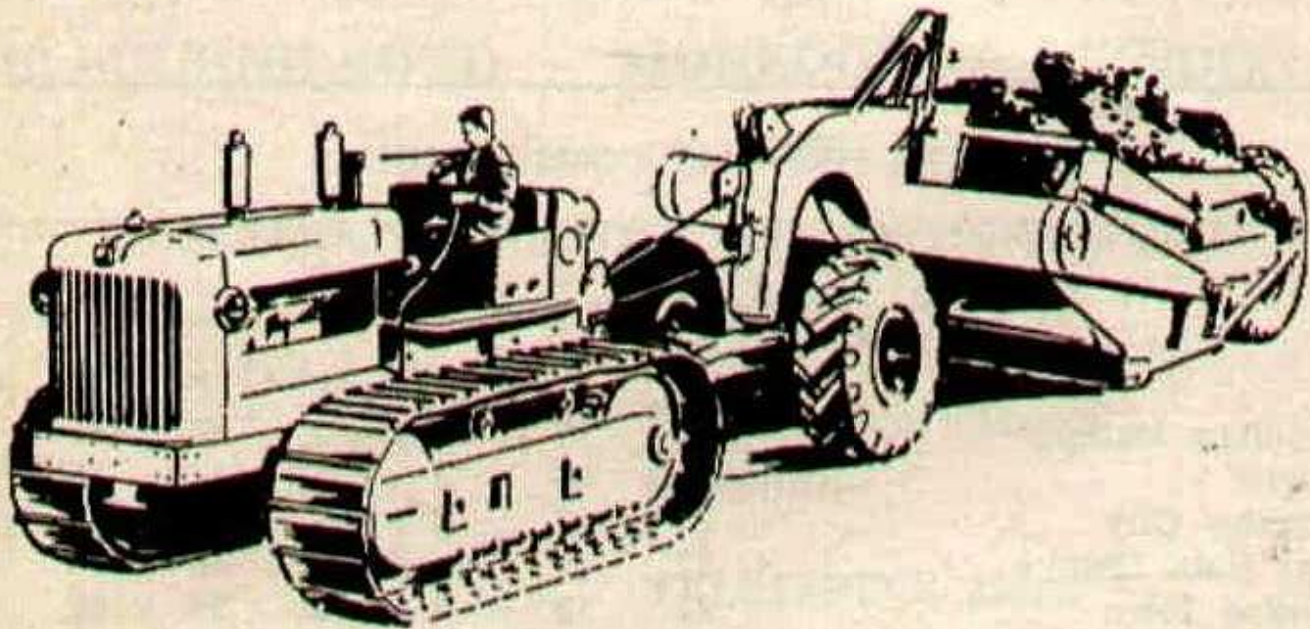
