The visit of Swindon Town to Borough Park can have vital repercussions to the Town, according to the result of the game, for they are in direnced of precious points to get them out of the relegation zone.

In the last two or three weeks they have eased the situation as far as they themselves are concerned, but they are still in danger of being one of the bottom four to go down, that is if the teams below them make a successful attempt to keep their heads above water. Two points gained at Borough Park today should almost see them clear.

Swindon Town were in the original Third Division when it was formed in 1921, in general they have rarely finished in the bottom half of the table, and on a number of occasions have come almost within an ace of promotion. In 1957-58 they had their most successful season, scoring 57 points. That was the last year of the Northern and Southern sections of the Third Division. The following season Swindon were members of the newly formed Division III, and although having a moderate season, they gradually stepped up the pressure until they gained promotion to Division II in 1962-63. They tasted the sweets of their richly won promotion for one season only, because the following season nothing would go right for them, and down they came back to Division III. Last season saw them struggling hard to retrace their steps, but when the final table was published, they had gathered 51 points, one below Workington. The present season has not been a happy one for them, and they will be pleased when it is over, especially if they remain in Division III.

Last season Reds took three points from their visitors, winning 1-0 at Borough Park, and gaining a point at Swindon for an effort of 1-1. When we visited Swindon early during the present season we were well beaten 3-0. Today should offer us the chance of revenge.

Hard luck at Watford last week, an eye-witness informed me that our youthful goalkeeper Mike Rogan was unmercifully bundled into the net as he made an effort to clutch the ball in the air. The papers I read confirmed this statement. I am further told that man to man and as a team we were equally as good as Watford for 75 per cent. of the game. The only difference was that Watford were on the lucky side of the fence.
