NEWS and VIEWS

Despite the fact that what appeared to be a poor start to the season, we are now in sixth position.

Granted we were defeated in the League Cup at Newport, after a home draw, and we also lost at Stockport, but the last three games (two of them played away from home) have produced four points. By any standards that is quite good going. We may not be showing tip-top form, but we are gathering points, and with a return to form, who knows — shall we repeat our run of last season?

We do not wish to make excuses, because most clubs receive the same fate, but our injuries have been more numerous than what we expected.

Keith Morgan, an outstanding half-back for many seasons, has not yet kicked a ball. Our new signing from Coventry has to date played only for seventy-five minutes in the first match of the season. Our other new player missed two games through injury, and is only now getting back to absolute fitness. Finally, in our game at Barrow two players, Dawson and Downsborough, were injured, the latter rather seriously, and he will probably not play again for four or five weeks.

The goalkeeper position created a problem. The simple answer to most people — “Go out and buy”. That is not easy, even to the richest clubs, because players often do not want to move, or demand the earth.

We heard the case the other week of a player in the reserve side, and it didn't seem likely he would make the first team, when approached regarding a transfer, wanted something in the nature of £60 a week plus bonuses, and a three year contract.

How can clubs (except perhaps the select few, and it is hard to believe the fantastic figures quoted) pay such amounts?

The money is just not there. It is certainly not coming through the turnstiles. One sometimes wishes that such things as Supporters' Clubs, competitions, etc., did not exist. Clubs would have to depend on receipts received, and wages and expenditure balanced accordingly, probably to their real worth.

Consider the gates of Division III on Saturday last, 9th September, 1967. One (and one only) 13,000; one of 9,000; one of 7,000; one of 6,000; three of 5,000; three of 4,000. An average of 6,500 persons present at ten games. We used to reckon £100 per 1,000 spectators. That figure is probably higher now, but if we say £150 per 1,000, a gate of 4,000 would produce £600. How can that cover two weeks wages?

The Football League undoubtedly keeps the position under review. We quote from one of the Press hand-outs: "from the Football League Press office".

"Smile if you like at Exeter City's seemingly penny-wise, pound-foolish economies that left them stranded with only ten professionals available for last Tuesday's League Cup-tie at Torquay.

But sympathise with them that only harsh economic reality and wretched luck had put out four of their staff of only 14 with the season 24 hours old."

This sort of situation started with the disappearance of the maximum wage which, in seven years, has put one-fifth of League registered players into lower-grade football or out of the game.

The undisputed fact that the players we now have are better paid, and have better contracts, should not be allowed to colour the fact that **wage bills have risen out of all proportion to the gate takings** of all but a few of the League's 92 clubs.

To give a true picture of the position, on 1st January, 1954, 3,234 professionals were registered with the League (average 35 per club); January, 1960, 2,866 registrations (average 30

per club); January, 1966, 2,397 registrations (average 26 per club).

Without allowing controversy to colour fact, a simple conclusion must be that income at the gate does not justify the the high wages and incentive demands of many players.

Nor is it only the smaller clubs who are hit. Fulham F.C. Chairman, Tommy Trinder, reveals in his Club's handbook that 17/- out of every £1 Fulham take in at the gate goes on wages.

We would have put the figure higher than 17/-. In fact we are sure some clubs do not take sufficient money to pay the wages. With what result? As Mr. Micawber puts it: "Income £1, expenditure 19/11. Result, happiness. Income £1, outgoings £1 0s. 1d., misery and insolvency."

No doubt most of you, like ourselves, were surprised, even amazed, to learn that Ernie Hunt had moved from Wolves to Everton. It is something we just do not understand. By his conversation and his writings in the local paper, he seemed very happy, and looked upon Wolves as a great club. Ernie is a dedicated footballer (trains hard and keenly), and always gives everything he has to what ever team he plays for. (He was most unfortunate at Swindon in his last season, as owing to illness and injuries he only made somewhere in the region of 28 first team League appearances.)

Ernie has a certain amount of skill and ability, and it seems he means to make the most of those talents, if we can believe all we read.

It seems hard if the figure of £80,000 is correct that Swindon, who nurtured him from schoolboy football to full professional standard, has to increase prices in order to attempt to balance the budget. The development of young players is a difficult and costly business. Many promise so much at 15 years of age, but few really make the grade.

SUPPORTERS *CLUB* NOTES

The Supporters' Club is settling down into the normal football season routine, with it's attendant chores for the Committee. Our programme sellers are renewing acquaintances with regular customers, and look forward to meeting new ones — the more the merrier.

Talking about programmes, some of you very often complain that you can't get one, because there are no programme sellers about. I can assure you that every part of the ground approaches — and inside at the Stratton Bank end — are covered. We have tried inside the ground several times, but found it uneconomic, as most people, once inside, are more interested in getting a good place to stand than in stopping for programmes. This, however, is not the reason why sellers are not on view. It is because they have sold out, and have returned to base.

The number of programmes available is the responsibility of the Club. This is not an easy estimate to make, as it is a waste of money to print too many. The estimate is roughly based on the expected gate. I believe it has been found, in practice, that about one third of the actual gate is very close to the number of programmes sold. Now that the gate is announced over the Club public address system, try estimating the gate before you attend a match, and then compare this with the actual figures. You will be surprised at how far you can be out. Nevertheless, whenever the number of programmes appear to be too low, the fact is reported to the Club, for information. So, please, don't get at our programme sellers when you can't get a programme.

Full marks to the Football Club's new policy of including in their News and Views the latest bulletin on the progress of injured players. I am sure supporters like to know how they

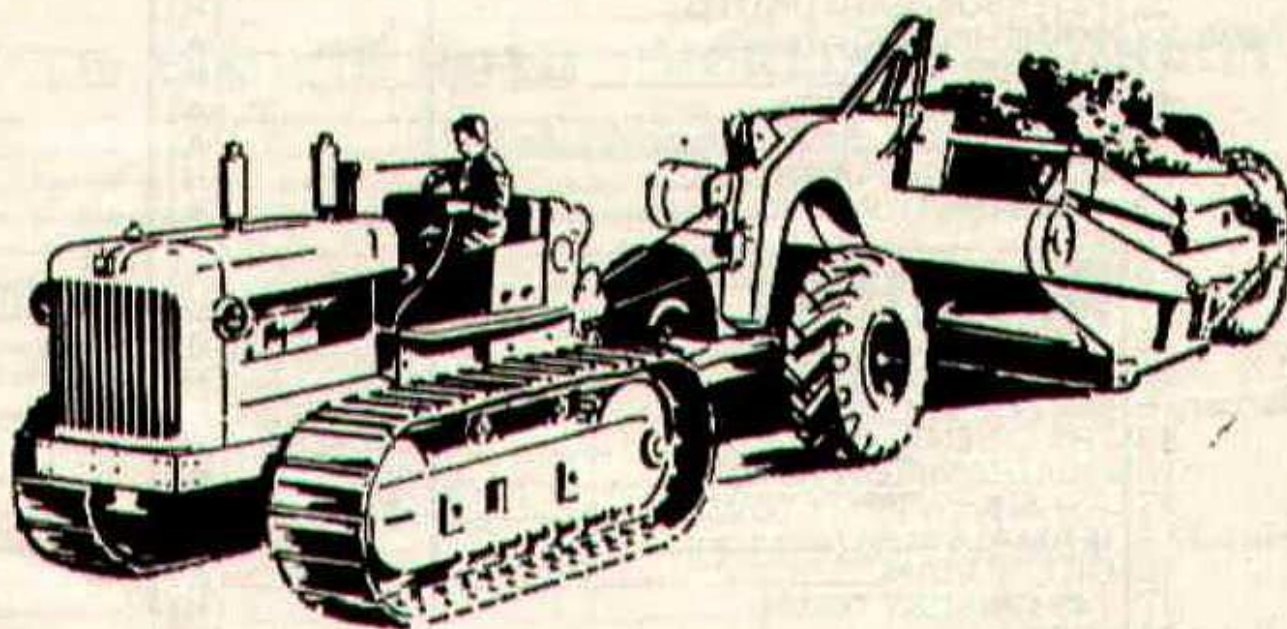
