

MEWS and VIEWS

A great game, and a grand fight back, but unfortunately no points. In the last programme we mentioned the fact that it would be a hard match at Walsall. It was certainly that, but also by far the best seen on that ground this season. We hope the improved form will continue, but it seems we may have acquired another injury.

The Reserve game at the County Ground was a very bright affair; our young lads played well but unfortunately lost by the only goal, and that a penalty.

Last week saw great activity in the transfer market. To judge by what one hears or reads vast sums were involved, yet we frequently hear of clubs in financial difficulties.

A Commission recently considered the present set-up in football. Not only did it recommend the return to Division 3 North and South to save expenses, but also stated many clubs were in a much more precarious position than the general public realised.

On Saturday last the highest gate in Division 3 was 9,132, and that was at our game against Walsall.

How do the two tie-up? Sums in the region of £100,000 and gates of £600!

Surely it leads to one conclusion — a few rich clubs will soon have the monopoly of the top class players.

Few clubs in Division 3 and 4, and many in Division 2, just can't afford to pay even £20,000 without creating tremendous difficulties.

This afternoon we entertain Gillingham. Like ourselves, not a rich concern, but one which has kept football going. In fact the Club was founded in 1893 as "New Brompton". Some of our older supporters may remember the name in the Southern League days. When League Division 3 was formed Gillingham became one of the original members, and have remained in this League except for two short spells. In 1938 they failed to gain re-election, but were re-elected in 1950. When Division 4 was formed they were allocated to that League, by virtue of their position in Division 3 (South). They gained promotion in 1965, and have often proved one of our "bogey" teams, with usually a battle of defences.

Last season we lost at Gillingham by the only goal scored (a penalty) when we were enjoying a good run. The week

previously we had defeated Leyton Orient 5-1.

The return game at Swindon, played 8th April, resulted in a win, 2-0. Willie Penman scored in the first half and Bruce Walker scored in the eightieth minute.

Gillingham has had several well known managers. The longest serving being Mr. Archie Clark (1938-57). Their present one is Mr. Basil Hayward, well known centre-half and centre-forward for Port Vale and Portsmouth. He was signed for Pompey by Mr. Freddy Cox, later to become Manager of Gillingham, and now at Bournemouth.

Mr. Hayward was for some time Manager of Yeovil Town (when we won 2-0 in the F.A. Cup in 1962) and was a

frequent visitor to Swindon.



NEWS AND VIEWS—continued

One of our ex-players was well in the news on Saturday. Michael Summerbee played centre-forward for Manchester City against Arsenal — Match of the Day on B.B.C.1.

He was frequently mentioned by the commentator, Kenneth Wolstenholme. He was much in the game and appeared to play in the same style as at Swindon. He had a great nuisance value but, from what we could see on television, we are not quite sure how far he got, or what he contributed. He certainly gave ninety minutes of effort, as always, but many moves broke down.

Few changes in the Laws of the game have puzzled the public as much as the recent instruction regarding the number of steps taken by the goalkeeper.

What has happened is that a goalkeeper cannot take more than four steps before releasing the ball to another player, although he may bounce it if he wishes. In addition, he can be penalised if the referee thinks his tactics are holding up the game or giving his team an unfair advantage. The penalty for each infringement is an indirect free kick taken from where this offence occurred.

The purpose of these changes is to improve efficiency and increase entertainment value by cutting out the irksome and growing practice of time-wasting by goalkeepers. Both variations were long overdue.

The changes were unheralded and hardly noticed, until one or two goalkeepers protested about the difficulty of clearing comfortably within the four steps, and asking what to do when caught in a quandary. We think the law a good one, and helps to keep the game going.






