Club Notes

Swindon who visit the County Ground today for the Cobblers first league match of 1968 have been opponents for many years, going back to the Third Div. South. But we also have something else in common. Swindon were our colleagues in promotion to Division Two five years ago.

Now Swindon are making strong efforts to regain Division Two status. They are third in the table and possess a capable team. This includes our former leader, Pat Terry.

The Cobblers have not played a league match since the visit to Tranmere on December 30th. That ended in a 2-2 draw with our boys giving one of their best performances this season.

The match saw the debut of Johnny Byrne, who was signed from Peterboro' the previous night. In the deal Jim Hall went to Peterborough. We wish Jim a successful time, and also offer a warm welcome to Johnny. Another "best wishes" message goes to our new wingers, Eric Weaver from Notts County, and formerly Swindon, and Tommy Knox, from Mansfield.

This trio created a fine impression at Prenton Park. All those local fans who travelled were satisfied that their journey had been worth it, and that the new men had made a big hit.

On the dark side is news that Barry Lines leg, which was broken in October, has not made the expected progress. He has had the plaster off again, and now has had a third plaster put on. We hope things will take a turn for the better as soon as possible.

Congratulations to Neil Townsend. This apprentice professional from Long Buckby has been chosen for the England Youth against Crystal Palace Youth, at Crystal Palace Recreation Centre tomorrow. Neil has made good progress since joining Northampton. He was in the party called up for training by England, at Uxbridge as well.

Our friendly match at Southend a fortnight ago produced a goalless draw, but quite a keen game. We should have followed next day with another friendly at the County Ground against Port Vale. But when Sir Stanley Matthews, the Vale general manager, was unable to turn out we thought, in fairness to our fans, it was best to postpone it.

The heavy snow last week forced us also to postpone the dance at the Salon arranged for the agents of our competitions. This has now been re-arranged for March 25th.

The Cobblers flag will fly over Wembley Stadium at the Football League Cup final, on March 2nd. The flags of the last 22 clubs in this season's competition will be flown from the Wembley masts that day.

PETER DOWNSBOROUGH (goal-keeper). Born Halifax. Signed in August 1965 from Halifax Town, where he was a product of local football. A fearless agile player who has done much to strengthen the Town's defence. Height, 5' 10½", weight, 12st 5lbs.

MEL NURSE (centre half). Born Swansea. Signed from Middlesboro' in Aug. 1965. He played for Wales 12 times gaining 9 of his Caps while with Swansea Town where he did 7 years service before being transferred to Middlesbrough in Sept. 1962. His ability and experience has done much to strengthen the Town's defence. Height, 6' ¼", weight 12st. 12lbs.

WILLIE PENMAN (inside forward). Born Wemyss, Fife. Signed from Newcastle United in Sept. 1966, for a considerable fee. Formerly with Glasgow Rangers. A clever ball playing inside forward who has also appeared at centre forward with the Club. Height, 5' 8", weight 11st. 7lbs.

DON ROGERS (outside right or left). Born Paulton. Probably the most sought after player in the team. He was signed by Swindon when only 15 and quickly came to the fore. Gained many England Youth International Caps and subsequently played in the England under 23 International Team. Was the Club's top goal scorer last season with 33 goals.

ROGER SMART (inside forward). Born Swindon. Another local player who joined the Club direct from Swindon Schoolboys Team. At 17 he was appearing regularly at centre forward in the Reserve Team, but he excels as a deep lying inside forward. A versatile player who is able to play at wing-half. Height, 5' 11", weight, 11st 4lbs.

PAT TERRY (centre forward). Born Lambeth. Signed last season from Reading where he was the leading goal scorer. Prior to this he played for Charlton, Swansea, Gillingham, Northampton and Millwall. A forceful leader who is particularly dangerous in the air. Height, 5' 9½", weight, 12st. 6lbs.

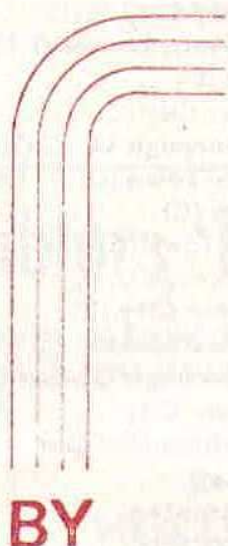

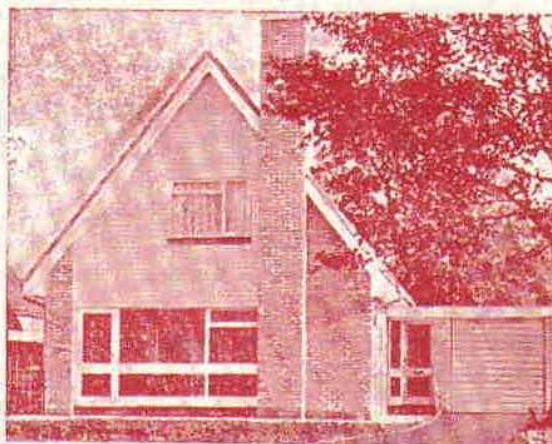

DES TALKING

"From the time he was first able to kick a ball around, he was destined to be a professional soccer player. By instinct, ability—and single-minded determination and dedication."

That isn't *me*, I can tell you that right off. From the time I was first able to kick a ball around I was destined to be anything but a professional. No: that wonderful commendation is about the £100,000 Everton and England star, Alan Ball, and it appears on the dust jacket of his book "BALL OF FIRE." Now I'm no particular mate of Alan's, but it's a recent book, and reading it shows you crowd that I'm not just hogging this programme because I tell jokes. (Waddya mean, what makes me think I tell jokes?).

I really do love to read about football. Mind you I like reading about other things as well. But I'm fussy about titles. They have to be

right. I mean, "Gone With The Wind," put me right off. I thought it was an advert for bicarb! I couldn't be bothered with "King Solomon's Mines" because I figured it would be like the Cobbler's box office around kick-off time, when all the gate money's in. "Hornblower" really fooled me. I was halfway through the first chapter before I realised it wasn't the story of a Referee who'd lost his whistle.

Of course those of us in show business do a lot of reading. First thing we do when we arrive at a theatre is to read the posters to see if our name is the right size. Then we read the names on the dressing room doors to make sure we aren't labelled a troupe of performing dogs from the week before. A lot of artists read in their dressing rooms to pass the time waiting to go on. Some have even got to reading words of *two* syllables! Chorus girls are all very good readers... and fast. I never met one who couldn't read my mind in two minutes flat.

Coming back to football, though, I see that Alan Ball and I do have something in common after all... promises we made to our dads. Alan promised his dad that if he would let him take up professional football as a career, he would never let him down. I promised mine that I would give myself ten years to make it as a comedian. He said: "Son, you watch you don't get ten years for trying."

I suppose I'm still trying really. All of us who perform in public are, whether we are entertainers or footballers. We can't know it all. So remember when the match out there on the pitch gets a bit heated and you feel the urge to join in... it's only a game.

And a broken bottle butters no parsnips—or somesuch saying.

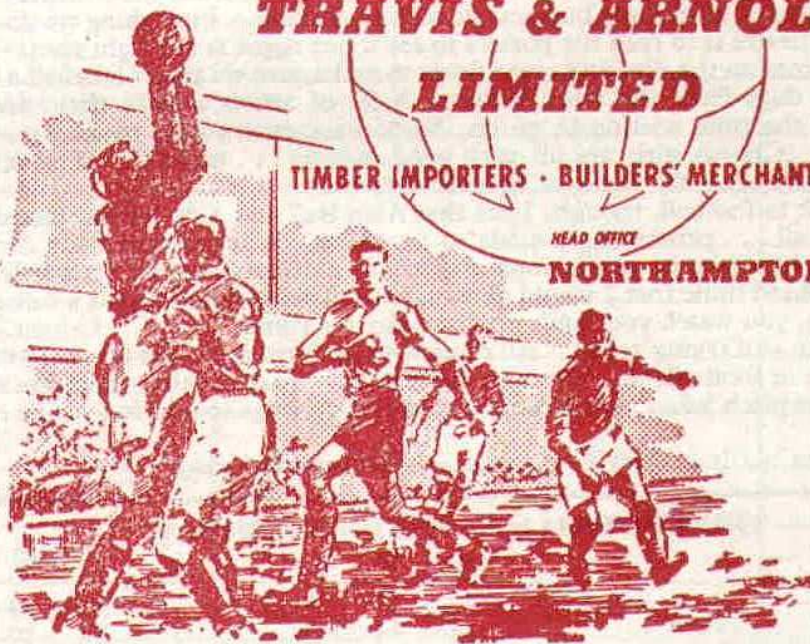
