



They have enjoyed a great season, and at the time of going to Press, are third in the League Table with forty-five points.

Whatever the position it will be a local derby with keenness and enthusiasm running high.

Since Oxford came into the League Division III, our record against them is quite good:—

Season 1966-67 Home 3-0 Away 0-0

They have yet to score a goal against Swindon, unless they succeeded on Good Friday.

Neither game last year was very entertaining. The match at Oxford on 10th December, 0—0, was spoiled by a high wind and light ball.

The return—our last home game of the season—6th May, 1967, was quite a scramble. Again a dry ground and light ball. The result was three goals to nil in our favour but Oxford had much more of the play than Swindon but missed many chances.

Much is written about football tactics, formations (4-2-4, 3-3-4 etc.) defensive, and attacking football. It is interesting to read the comments of Stanley Cullis, one of the great managers of today, with a wealth of experience both as a player, and manager.

"You would imagine that football has now entered the jet age of scientific formula, which have no relation to the past". He strongly challenges that idea, and goes on to say.

"Conceding the training, coaching and style of play have all undergone distinct changes and improvements, let me insist that the fundamental character and purpose of the game remains constant.

No one will persuade me that there is no room for orthodox wingers in our present football set-up while, for particular games it may be necessary to include a defender with number 7 or 11 on his back, a Finney or a Matthews would not be too 'old-fashioned' for me.

changed to some extent, in as much as they are not expected to merely hug the touchlines but to have more variety in their play and this applies to defensive as well as attacking qualities, and to be involved in the ninety minutes more than in the past. They are expected to tackle and challenge for the ball, and it is worthy of reflection that Tom Finney could tackle for possession as well as any defender".

Then Mr. Cullis goes on to say, "Centres from the wing produce their fair quota of converted goals today, although there may be a variety of numbers actually putting the centres across, but with more defensive players crowding the goalmouth it seems logical that a fast striding winger going round the outside of the traffic has a more vital role than ever to play".

It is interesting to note after reading these comments, that Birmingham City (Manager Mr. Stanley Cullis) has scored more goals than any other team in the four leagues.

Facts surely prove something. Looking at football objectively. How it is played, where it is played.

One team is trying to get the ball into the goal, and the other preventing it.

League Football today is much faster, and much more stereotyped, but whether it is as entertaining, as the good old fashioned "long ball" is a matter of opinion. Ball control, has greatly improved, but it required a fair amount of skill to produce a pass, say of 40 yards.

Height 5ft. 11½ins. Age 23. Jim signed from Chelsea in March 1966, and an automatic first team choice until an injury when Sherratt regained the "sticks". Extremely agile and credited with some fantastic performances.

BRIAN SHERRATT (Goal)

Height 5ft. 11½ins. Age 24. Signed from Stoke City in 1965, Played regularly until Barron was signed in 1966. An injury to Barron in January 1967 gave him his opportunity again, and he held his place to the end of the season. Incredibly daring and a real menace and deterrent to any forward.

RON ATKINSON (Right Half and Captain)

Height 5ft. 11½ins. Ron signed from Aston Villa in 1959. An everpresent member of the team and a 100 per cent effort player. His captaincy and driving of the team has yielded many Club successes. Nick-named the Tank on account of his sturdy build.

Height 5ft. 10½ ins. Age 24. Signed from Birmingham City in 1960 following his elder brother to Oxford. Was tried at centre forward last season with some success, scoring more goals than anyone else during the season. Always a danger when in possession.

KEN HALE (Inside Right)

Height 5ft. 9½ins. Ken signed from Coventry City in 1966. A good ball player with a stinging shot from both beet. A forward line linkman with plenty of experience.

JOHN EVANSON (Inside Left or Left Wing)

Height 5ft. 9\(\frac{1}{2}\)ins. Age 21. Signed from Towcester as an amateur in 1964 and professional forms in 1965. Made his first team debut last season. He is one of the best ball players on the books. Vital experience is his main requirement to blossom out.

MICHAEL BULLOCK (Centre Forward)

Height 6ft. Age 20. Michael signed from Birmingham City during the close season for a substantial fee. He is a player with plenty of top class experience and has a great future ahead of him. Has a brother who plays for Colchester United.

COLIN HARRINGTON (Outside Left)

Height 6ft. 1in. Age 24. Signed from Wolves in 1962. A family tradition of sprint training and athletics undoubtedly makes this player the fastest in the Club. He has commanded a regular place on the wing ever since he joined Oxford United. Has the potential to develop into a top class player.

MAURICE KYLE (Centre Half)

Height 6ft, 1½ins. Maurice joined Oxford United from Wolves in 1959 and has been an ever-present member of the team since then, scoring his first league goal last season. His height makes him a very difficult player to beat in the air. Anticipation of the highest order.

CYRIL BEAVON (Right Back)

Height 5ft. 11ins. Cyril signed from Wolves in 1959 and is now in his ninth season with the Club, making non-stop appearances as always. Reliable defender with the ability to attack when called on to do so.

RODNEY SMITHSON (Right Half)

Height 5ft. 11ins. Signed from Arsenal in 1964. Is a very consistant player and an attacking wing half. Given little first team opportunity as understudy to captain Ron Atkinson, but due to team positional changes through injuries last season, proved himself more than adequately for first team selection.

PETER HIGGINS (Centre Half)

Height 6ft. 1in. Peter has been with Oxford United for seven years but has been unable to gain a regular first team place due to the ever-present Kyle. However, he has also deputised as full back when required to, with great success.

JOHN SHUKER (Utility Player)

Height 5ft. 10½ins. John signed amateur forms for Oxford United in September 1960 and professional forms in June of next year. Left half, wing or inside forward, and even a full back, this adaptable player is a real asset to any side. Has scored many goals from outside the penalty box with his fierce shooting.

PETER HATCH (Left Half)

Height 5ft. 10½ins. Age 18. Peter joined the Club as an apprentice in April 1965 and signed professional forms in October of last year. Is a very promising player who also has been tried with some success on the wing, and is useful in goal as well. Recently been selected to play in an Hellenic League representative match. Has yet to make his first team debut.

KEN SKEEN (Outside Right)

Height 5ft. 10½ ins. Ken signed from Swindon Town during the close season having been a member of the very successful Cup side last year. Started his career with Swindon Town as an amateur before signing part-time professional forms with Trowbridge Town. Returned to Swindon Town as a full-time professional making his debut against Crystal Palace. He has played in every position on the field except right back.
