

After today we have two away games, and so ends a season which opened with great hopes of promotion.

Probably the outstanding feature has been the wonderful support we have received. Our attendance figures are by far the best in Division III, and often much higher than many in Division II. Yet it is most likely a loss will be shown at the end of the Financial Year in May.

It seems changes will have to be made in football finance. Mr. J. Battersby, Chairman of Bolton Wanderers, a club with a great tradition and years of experience speaks out, straight to the point: "Sweeping changes are needed — and quickly — otherwise many clubs will face bankruptcy. The ever-spiralling wage and transfer fee structure is rapidly strangling the life out of all but a few of the 92 clubs. We started it all ourselves when we abandoned the wage maximum and adopted individual contracts. But for heaven's sake, let us admit our mistake and get back to sanity. In falling over backwards to be fair to the players we are ruining ourselves.

Rocketing wage bills and the rise in prices for good players is out of all **proportion to incomes**, and the longer we delay the more precarious our position becomes."

He then suggests a scale of wages should be introduced based on the Divisions. Top figure for a First Division player and lower limits for Second, Third and Fourth.

He also wants a ceiling figure for fees, cutting the top prices by at least a half. It really is fantastic for a club to pay £100,000 plus for one man, a sum far in excess of most clubs' total income in any one season.

Mr. Battersby then goes on to suggest ways and means of improving the situation. First, to sweep away the two-thirds majority rule as a means of facilitating immediate reforms.

He considers an extension of the promotion and relegation system in the two top sections — long overdue — to increase the interest to the end of the season.

"Let us keep the top 44 teams on the move all the time by changing to four up and four down. The more the League changes face, the more interesting life will be for the fans. With four chances of climbing back we can help to kill the fear of relegation."

These ideas provide much food for thought. Certainly the brake will have to be applied to expenditure. Already clubs are suggesting increased prices because of increased costs: Betting Tax (less from the Pools); Selective Employment Tax; Purchase Tax; General Costs (travel, electricity, postal and telephone charges).

One is not sure higher entrance fees would help, except for special games, the attendance could be lower.

Football could easily follow the trend of the theatrical and cinema world. The number of theatres and cinemas becomes less each year, and most are now found only in the big cities.

Will it come to this in League football?

A few weeks ago the top ten in the Championship stakes — Manchester United, Leeds United, Liverpool, Manchester City, Newcastle United, Everton, Tottenham Hotspur, Chelsea, Nottingham Forest and Arsenal — were all clubs from the big cities. It surely is a point for reflection.

Will it come to just a group of top clubs, with the smaller ones going to the wall?



Certainly the smaller clubs cannot possibly survive much longer under the present conditions and regulations. The great majority of League clubs are now living on overdrafts and with greatly reduced professional staffs.

We are bound to agree with Mr. Battersby — urgent action is necessary.

However to turn to football and today's game. We played at Oldham on Saturday, 2nd December. Fortunately we were beginning to reach top form just at the right time — the beginning of the F.A. Cup competition. Swindon won by two goals to nil. Scorers: Rogers and Terry.

Swindon:

Downsborough; Thomas, Trollope; Butler, Nurse, Harland; Heath, Dawson, Terry, Smart, Rogers. Sub.: Penman.

Last season we defeated Oldham Athletic by six goals to three, in what was probably the best game of the season. The visitors scored first through Frank Large (remember him?—now at Leicester City), but Dennis Brown and Don Rogers scored, and at half-time we led 2—1. After the interval Rogers, Brown and Walker scored in that order, so the score line read 5—1. Oldham Athletic staged a fine comeback with two goals by Collins and Towers. The game became most open and interesting, but Swindon finally clinched the issue when Rogers scored near the end. I can only hope we see such a grand game today. The attendance was 10,347. It will be interesting to compare that with today's figures.

The return game was played on 28th April, 1967. Result: Oldham Athletic 1; Swindon Town 0. Attendance: 5,605.

SUPPORTERS CLUB NOTES




