THE CHAIRMAN'S

First and foremost I extend to all our supporters from the directors, officials and players at the Orient our very best wishes for a happy Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

I am happy to add that I believe we can also successfully wish you all a successful New Year for the Orient, despite the fact that we have

fallen away a little after our very bright start to the season.

Elsewhere in this programme Jimmy Bloomfield, our playermanager, details the reasons why we go into 1969 with confidence so it will suffice for me to say that with certain injuries behind us we are all hopeful of a real run of success starting from this holiday time.

Some responsibility for ensuring this success still rests with our supporters. We were delighted that our efforts to improve the side produced an increase in our gates for the best part of the season so far but in the last one or two games they have fallen away badly.

Now I know that one or two unwelcome results and calls of pre-Christmas duties will have had some effect on our attendances but if we are to pursue our policy of strengthening the team we must not be forced into too heavily subsidising the day to day working of the club because of extremely poor attendances.

I know we will give you reason to support us in the New Year and I am confident you will respond with your support.

Finally I would like to pay a very special tribute to our youngsters who, as well as performing with distinction in our reserve London Midweek League football, approached Christmas still unbeaten in any under-18 competition this season.

This Christmas brings us to the half-way stage in Orient's season and player-manager Jimmy Bloomfield to the task of assessing our achievements so far. A glance at the Third Division table later in the programme will reveal that we have slipped from our early high League position into the bottom half of the division. But statistics rarely tell the full story. Jimmy explains:

Leyton Stadium that we have recently been unable to sustain the promotion challenge with which we launched into the 1968-9 season.

But it is hard for any of us to define precisely why this has happened. For example I don't think we are playing anywhere near as badly as our last few results have suggested.

In most of our away games the team have been playing the better football and either winning or drawing well into the match, yet we have come home without a point. Take our most recent away match—at Northampton. We were level at 1-1 with only 18 minutes to go yet were beaten 4-1 after some atrocious luck with two vital goals.

I don't like to harp on this question of luck but the lack of it in the last couple of months has been crucial to our season so far.

We have not had the services of Peter Brabrook since September 21st and another winger, John Key, has also been out of action all that time. This has served to unbalance our side and the ball has not run for us either.

But for all that I believe you make your own luck in football and that is what we shall be trying to do in the second half of the season. We should have a boost with the imminent return of Brabrook to match fitness and the many young players in our side will have half a season's experience to draw on to help us give a tighter team performance.

At the same time no effort is being spared to bring new players to the club—in fact I hope we will sign at least one forward shortly—and with the continued spectacular advance of our youngsters I know Orient are moving in the right direction.

1 Peter DOWNSBOROUGH

Signed in the summer of 1965 from Halifax and has since commanded a regular first team place in Swindon's goal.

2 Owen DAWSON

This former youth international full back has recovered from serious injury to reclaim the first team place he secured when he signed from Portsmouth six seasons ago.

3 Rod THOMAS

Represented Wales at under-23 and full international level. Signed from Gloucester City in 1964 and first won a place when Dawson was injured. Has now claimed the other full back place for himself.

4 Joe BUTLER

Signed from Newcastle United in 1965 and has successfully switched from full back to wing half.

5 Frank BURROWS

Scottish-born Frank began playing with Raith and then spent three seasons with Scunthorpe before joining Swindon.

6 Stan HARLAND

Regular left half since making his debut at the beginning of the 1965-7 season after transferring from Carlisle. Formerly with Everton and Bradford City.

7 Don HEATH

Learned his footballing craft as an apprentice at Middlesbrough before moving to Norwich from whom he joined Swindon in September, 1967.

8 Roger SMART

Swindon-born player who joined the club from local schools football. Scheming inside forward who has also played with distinction at wing half.

9 John SMITH

No stranger at Orient. John a former under-23 international, was with us for one season. Has also played for West Ham, Spurs, Coventry and Torquay.

10 Peter NOBLE

Goalscoring inside forward signed from Newcastle in January this year.

11 Don ROGERS

One of the most sought-after players in the game but still happy with the club he joined at 15. England youth and under-23 international honours. Top scorer last season with 28 goals.

12 Willie PENMAN

Former Glasgow Rangers inside forward signed from Newcastle in September 1966 for a large fee.

Seats for trips to these and all away matches are bookable in advance by telephoning 539 7709 during the day. Telephone bookings must be made at least two days in advance and a five shilling deposit sent or taken to the supporters office at the ground. Coach details for the next two games are:

TO HARTLEPOOL: Coaches leave the ground at the

midnight before the game at a return fare of 31/-.

TO CREWE: Return fare 26/-. Coaches leave Marsh Hill at

8 p.m. and our ground at 8.15.

For those fans preferring to make their own way to the

above matches we offer the following information:

BY ROAD:

THE RAC RECOMMEND THE FOLLOWING ROUTES: Hartlepool (266 miles): Take the M.1 then M.18 to the intersection with the Doncaster by-pass, then the A.1 and A.168 to Thirsk, the A.19 via Stockton to the junction with the A.689 where turn right to Hartlepool.

Crewe (180 miles): Take the M.1 to the M.45 then follow signposted route to M.6 at Gailey intersection. Proceed North along M.6 to intersection No. 17 then follow signs "Sandbach"

and continue on A.534 to Crewe.

BY RAIL:

Hartlepool: There is no convenient return service from

Hartlepool by British Rail.

Crewe: Second class return fare 96/-. Depart Euston at 12.05 and arrive Crewe 2.17. Return depart Crewe at 5.15 or 5.50 arriving back at Euston at 7.15 or 8 p.m. respectively.
