



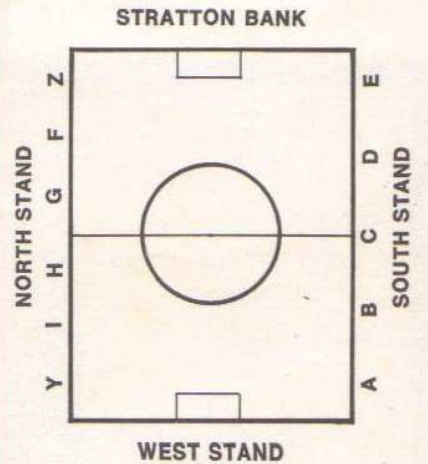

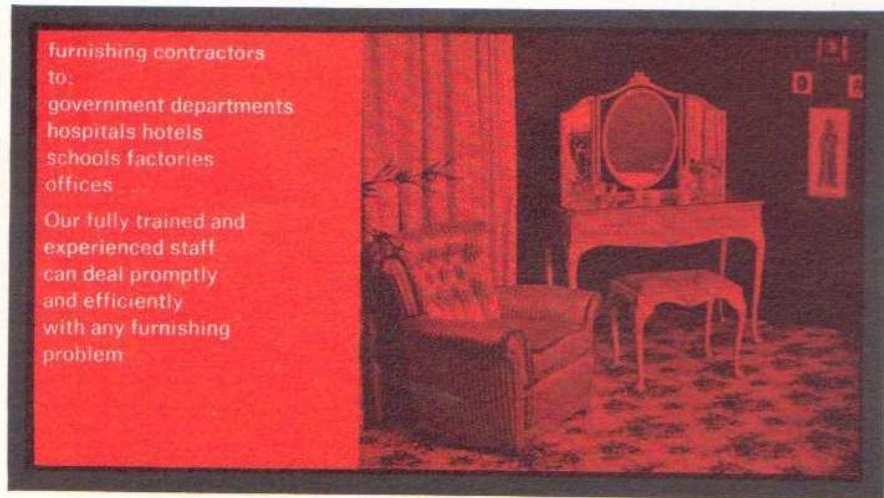

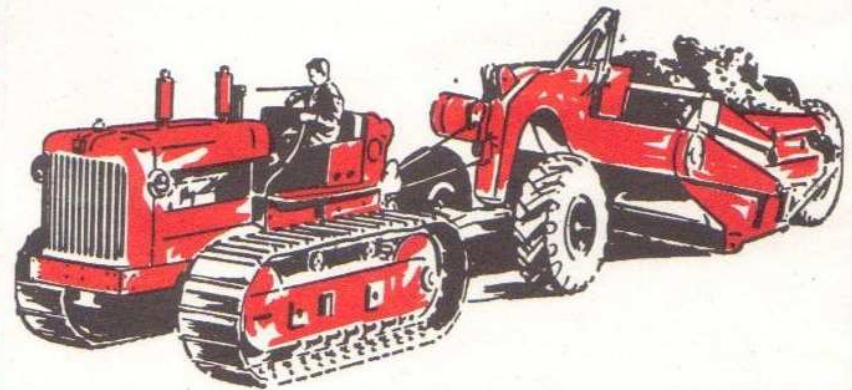

NEWS and VIEWS

Some weeks ago we wrote in the programme, asking supporters to write to Mr. Collins (Public Relations Officer) regarding ideas for improving Customer/Board relations, and also for suggestions regarding programmes, refreshment bars, etc.

The response was rather disappointing — only one letter from Swindon itself, others from farther afield, even from Paris. Several wrote with complaints, mostly justifiable, and these have been dealt with. Others wrote about the programme, especially the team sheet. It was suggested this be on the back of the programme, and the names to be in a vertical line. This seems a good idea, but nothing can be done this season, because of advertising rights, and the teams cannot be printed on the cover itself, because all these are printed at the beginning of the season.

Several asked for information regarding the New Stand. The only thing we can tell you at present is that negotiations are still proceeding for the erection of this stand.

The New Stand is a real priority. The old one on the North Side, cannot possibly last much longer and also it will be difficult to renew the Insurance premiums. We need many more seats (yes, and comfortable ones). Remember, too, our dressing rooms and office accommodation are some of the smallest and poorest in the League. If we wish to become a Division II club we must have a better image. Yes, we must have a New Stand.

The Football League Review is given away with the programmes. It would be interesting to know how many of you read them. Can you recall an article by Kenneth Wolstenholme in which he writes "Football thrives on enthusiasm; but could we have just a little originality? The modern soccer

fan is becoming a bore. I am writing about those who let themselves rip with songs and chants. There is nothing wrong with songs and chants, but why does everyone sing the same thing? Why not something original? 'WE'LL SUPPORT YOU EVERMORE' — what rubbish. Look what happens after two home defeats.

"A few years ago some clubs had songs associated with them, and it was good to hear them — Newcastle United had Blaydon Races.

"Now everybody is on the bandwagon. Wherever you go they hold scarves aloft and sing (out of tune) 'You'll Never Walk Alone'. Then comes a procession of the same old songs you heard last week and the week before, followed by the same chants and the same obscenities.

"So you fans, please try to be original. If you cannot be, why not just cheer?"

I feel there is a lot in this article (much longer in the Review). What about it Swindon? Sing something original.

A magazine has just produced an article with a diagram showing it needed 243 people to get a football team on the field. Amazing, isn't it? I don't know how many we have at Swindon, but it must be approaching the above figure. Probably the most important, and the one taken for granted, is the Club Secretary. Few people outside the game (and many inside) appreciate just how much rests on his shoulders; few realise that in law **he** is responsible for the administration of a limited liability company.

It is a sobering thought when you realise if the 92 Club Secretaries in the Football League walked out en masse, the game would come to a full stop.

Today we meet once again our friends from Luton. Like Swindon they were members of the Southern League and was one of the clubs to form the Division III (South) in 1920. When football was resumed after World War II Luton Town

made great progress, gaining promotion right up to Division I and appearing in the Cup Final. Then came a period of decline, finally ending in Division IV.

Luton Town is now regaining some of its former glory. Last season they gained promotion to Division III, and now occupy a high position in the League. Swindon visited Luton on Saturday, 9th November, 1968 and were defeated 0—2. Both goals were scored in the second half.

Last season we entertained them in the F.A. Cup, Round 2. What a great game that was; Swindon were two goals up at half-time, but Luton Town hit back, and scored two goals to equalise, but seven minutes from the end Heath scored the winning goal.

KEITH ALLEN (Centre Forward)

At the moment it is difficult to forecast exactly where Allen will settle down. Originally he began at inside right, but spent the bulk of last season in the middle; in the pre-season practice matches, he played at right-half, where he turned in some superlative performances in emergency during last season. This is a position for which competition is likely to be particularly brisk. Was signed from Stockport County in exchange for Derek Kevan and has had previous spells with Portsmouth and Grimsby Town.

TERRY BRANSTON (Centre Half)

For him last season was a personal triumph because, not only was he a member of a promotion team for the fourth time during his career, but he fulfilled his ambition of making the full quota of League appearances. Born at Rugby, where he still lives, Branston spent nine seasons with Northampton Town, accompanying them in their rise from Division IV to Division I.

MICKEY BROWN (Centre Forward)

Goes down officially as a leader but, in point of fact, was seldom in that position last season. Appeared in the First Team on the wings, at inside forward and also at wing half, so it is difficult to see what is destined for him this time. However, wherever he is asked to play he puts up a whole-hearted 100 per cent performance. A Londoner, he was previously with Fulham and Millwall.

GRAHAM FRENCH (Outside Right)

Born at Wolverhampton. Has previously played for Shrewsbury Town, Swindon Town, Watford and Wellington Town, before joining Luton Town in October 1965. Has several Youth International caps for England.

JOHN MOORE (Left Half)

In the opinion of many people was the most improved player on the books and he fell naturally into the task of being a member of the back four. Is beginning his fourth season with Luton Town who stepped in immediately when they heard that Motherwell had given him a free transfer.

MAX DOUGAN (Right Back)

First signing made by Allan Brown shortly after he rejoined Luton Town. A fee of about £7,000 changed hands when this ex-Scottish amateur International left Leicester City, his caps having been earned whilst with Queen's Park. With the arrival of Terry Branston, the idea was to convert Dougan into a right half, but he finally settled in at right back, where he was a regular for the greater part of last season.

ALAN SLOUGH (Right Half)

Is a true local product because he was amateur and apprentice with Luton Town before signing as a full-time player. In his early days he was a full-back and could conceivably still be required for this position, but plays extremely well in either wing-half berth.

MIKE HARRISON (Outside Left)

During the latter part of last season, several favourable reports were submitted on this player, who was then with Plymouth Argyle. These induced the Luton Town manager to make a £7,000 offer to his former Luton Town right-wing partner, Billy Bingham, who is now in charge at Home Park. Born at Ilford, Harrison began his first-class career with Chelsea, from which club he moved on to Blackburn Rovers, where he established a first-team place.

FREDDIE JARDINE (Left Back)

The promotion success must have held particular satisfaction for this player because he, more than any other on the books, experienced things when Luton Town were at their lowest ebb. He is now beginning his eighth season, having come to Kenilworth Road as an outside left when Sam Bartram was in charge. He was given a free transfer by Dundee and it was after showing his paces in practice matches that he was finally converted into a highly useful defender.

BRIAN LEWIS (Right Half)

At the moment, it is by no means clear where Luton Town's most expensive signing for years — from Coventry City — will finally play. In the temporary absence of Ian Buxton, Lewis started the season at inside right where he had considerable experience at Portsmouth and Coventry. However, most of his 20 First Division games last season were in the half-back line.

BILLY McDERMENT (Left Back)

Was signed from Leicester City as a right back, but most of his team appearances were at left back. At one time last season he was almost the permanent substitute and, in all, managed 20 First Team appearances which qualified him for a championship medal.

BILL TAYLOR (Goalkeeper)

Joined Luton Town on trial from Partick Thistle, and was signed last Christmas for the remainder of the season. Luton Town are fortunate to have such an experienced player in reserve.

GEORGE POTTER (Wing Half)

Spent three months at Luton on trial during the latter part of last season and did so well that he was called upon for the First Team during a particularly trying period for injuries. Negotiations with Forfar Athletic during the summer proved successful, a moderate fee changed hands and Potter was given a contract for the whole season.

TONY READ (Goalkeeper)

Began the season, as he did last time, when he missed only three matches, as the first choice goalkeeper. Yet there was a time when it looked possible that he would make a name for himself in the forward line. Probably holds the distinction of being the only goalkeeper to have scored a hat-trick in League football. Was born at Haydock and began his career with Sheffield Wednesday before moving to Peterborough United. Joined Luton Town 3½ years ago.

BRUCE RIOCH (Inside Left)

Without doubt Luton Town's biggest asset as a player and he is only 21. Is a natural footballer whose skill developed quickly last season, when he was easily the Club's leading scorer even though he was used as the midfield link. Was born in Aldershot, but spent most of his schooldays in Luton and has been with Luton Town since he was 15.

RAY WHITTAKER (Outside Left)

A Londoner from Bow, he played for the Arsenal, with whom he gained England Youth International caps before joining Luton Town in March 1964.

JOHN RYAN (Outside Right)

Allan Brown went back to his former club, Wigan Athletic, where he was player-manager and signed the player who was his right-wing partner. Also appeared at inside-forward with success.

IAN BUXTON (Inside Right)

When Rodney Green went down with cartilage trouble early last season, there had to be an immediate search for another striker, and Buxton was signed from Derby County for about £11,000.

LAURIE SHEFFIELD (Centre Forward)

One of Luton Town's big close season signings from Oldham Athletic. Born in Swansea, has previously been with five League clubs.

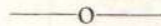

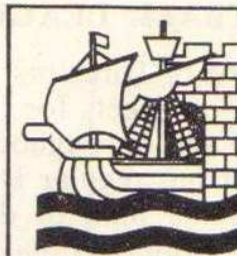
