FROM THE MANAGER'S OFFICE

Win or lose this afternoon, we will continue to do everything in our power to catch up with the Third Division leaders in time to make a serious challenge for promotion.

To this end the first team squad will spend five days on a 'lets-get-away-from-it-all' trip to the F.A. Coaching Centre at Lilleshall next week.

Our own coach, Norman Rimmington, will be in charge, and he will put the players through a series of specially designed training sessions in a bid to give them added pep to face the promotion run-in.

Naturally, though, it would give the lads tremendous heart to go to Lilleshall with a win over high-riding Swindon Town under their belts.

For there is no doubt about it, Swindon are one of the big favourites for promotion. At present they are in third place, two points behind leaders Watford with a game in hand. And they have three matches in hand on second team Bournemouth, who are only one point in front.

What is more, after today, Swindon will have played 15 matches away from home and only ten on their own County Ground. So, obviously, with so many home games still to come, they are sitting pretty. Their home record so far reads: won eight, drawn two, lost none, goals for 17, goals against 2.

However, they have been beaten five times away from home, and with our fine record at Oakwell over the past two seasons—only two league defeats—there is every reason to hope that this could be defeat number six for the Wiltshire Club.

Despite our present comparatively lowly position, on current form we remain one of the strongest promotion outsiders, and this afternoon's clash could be vital. A win could make all the difference to our efforts to come to terms with the leading bunch.

After all, they have been up there all season and must be feeling the strain. We are coming into form just at the right time and if we can continue in the same vein until the end of the season, we must be in with a chance.

Anyway, whatever happens, today's game promises to be a 'cracker'. Swindon have won praise from many quarters for their attacking play which has put them in the final of the League Cup competition, as well as making them one of the best teams in Division Three, and we, ourselves, have recently wowed the critics with our own fluid attacking style.

Last Friday Swindon gave some indication of their prowess by hitting five goals away from home at Tranmere, another of the top teams.

Yes, indeed, if both teams hit form this afternoon it should be a match to remember.

SWINDON TOWN

Swindon Town have this season captured the imagination of the football world by storming their way through to the final of the Football League Cup competition, in which they meet mighty Arsenal, and they are, without a shadow of doubt, one of the most attractive sides in the Third Division.

Managed by former Rotherham United stalwart Danny Williams, the Wiltshire side have served up some swinging soccer and are now within sight of a remarkable double comprising the winning of the Football League Cup and the winning of promotion to the Second Division.

At present they are third in the table, behind Watford and Bournemouth, and they are hotly tipped in many quarters to make the step up.

In outside-left Don Rogers they have one of the most formidable match-winners in the game, and it is little wonder that Swindon rank him in the £100,000 category, as do a number of First Division clubs who have cast envious eyes in his direction.

Rogers, who stands 5ft. 10½ins. and weighs 12st. 10lb., is strong, forceful, fast, is an expert at ball control and possesses a powerful shot which he can unleash from any angle.

Not that Swindon are a one-man team. They have plenty of experience in their ranks, including Willie Penman (ex-Newcastle), John Smith (ex-Orient, West Ham, Spurs and Coventry), Peter Noble (ex-Newcastle) and Don Heath (ex-Middlesbrough) in attack, and Stan Harland (ex-Everton), Joe Butler (ex-Newcastle) and Owen Dawson (ex-Portsmouth) in a defence backed by the agile Peter Downsborough, formerly of Halifax Town.

The last time Barnsley and Swindon met was in the 1962-63 season . . . at the end of which Swindon won promotion to the Second Division! The clash at Oakwell was the first of the season and it ended in a 1-1 draw, O'Hara scoring for the Reds and Jackson for Swindon. The 'gate' was 7,018.

The only member of that Barnsley team still appearing regularly in the senior eleven is skipper Eric Winstanley, who on that day was marking none other than Mike Summerbee, now with Manchester City.

Incidentally, the return match at Swindon has been brought forward from Tuesday, March 11th to next Saturday February 8th, kick-off 3 p.m.

PEN PICTURES

PETER DOWNSBOROUGH (Goal-keeper): Signed in August, 1965, from home club Halifax Town. A fearless, agile player who has done much to strengthen the Swindon defence.

OWEN DAWSON (Full-back): Joined the club from Portsmouth in June, 1962. A fast, tenacious player. A former Youth international. Born Hatfield.

ROD THOMAS (Full-back): A former youth player with the club. Signed from Gloucester City in July, 1964. Has gained Welsh Under 23 caps and full Welsh caps. Born Glynceirwg.

JOE BUTLER (Wing-half): Born Newcastle. joined Swindon from Newcastle United in August, 1965, and graduated to senior ranks through junior teams. Only 5ft. 7½ins. but makes up for lack of inches by tenacity and speed.

FRANK BURROWS (Centre-half): Born Larkhall, Scotland, and formerly with Raith Rovers. Also played three seasons with Scunthorpe before joining Swindon.

STAN HARLAND (Wing-half): Signed from Carlisle United in July, 1966. Formerly with Everton and Bradford City. A regular at left-half since making his debut at the beginning of the 1966-67 season. Born Liverpool.

DON HEATH (Outside-right): Started his career as an apprentice professional with Middlesbrough. Then moved to Norwich, from where he was signed in September, 1967.

WILLIE PENMAN (Inside-forward): A clever, ball-playing inside-forward signed from Newcastle United in September, 1966 for a considerable fee. Formerly with Glasgow Rangers. Born Fife.

JOHN SMITH (Centre-forward): Born London. Signed from Torquay United in June last year. Formerly with Orient, West Ham United, Spurs and Coventry. Former England Under-23 international.

PETER NOBLE (Inside-forward): Joined the club from Newcastle in January last year after four years service. Born Sunderland. Prefers an attacking role.

DON ROGERS (Outside-left): The most sought-after player in the team. Signed by Swindon when only 15 and quickly came to the fore. Gained many England Youth international caps and subsequently played in the England Under-23 international team. Was the club's top goalscorer with 28 goals last season.

No. 10—Question and Answer

AND JUNIORS . . .

Q—If the cross-bar is knocked off during the game and it is not possible to replace it, can a rope be used as a substitute?

A—No. In the event of the cross-bar becoming displaced and there is no available means of replacing it, the match shall be abandoned. The substitution of the bar by a rope in order to finish the match cannot be allowed.

Q—What happens if the referee is knocked out by the ball and a goal is scored while he is unconscious . . . does the goal stand?

A—If a referee is struck in the face by the ball and/or temporarily incapacitated and a goal be then immediately scored, he, having obviously seen nothing of it, shall only allow the goal if, in the opinion of the linesman nearer to the incident, the goal was properly scored.

Q—If a spectator runs on to the field and prevents the ball going over the goal-line when it would otherwise have been a certain goal, can the referee allow the score?

A—No. A goal cannot be allowed if the ball has been prevented by some outside agency from passing over the goal-line. If this happens in the normal course of play, the game must be stopped and restarted by the referee dropping the ball at the place where the ball came into contact with the interference.

Q—The referee has given a dropped ball decision in the penalty area. Before the ball touches the ground a defending player strikes an opponent. It must be a penalty.

A—Wrong. If this happens the referee can only caution or send off the offender, and re-drop the ball. He cannot award a penalty kick because the ball was not in play at the time of the offence.

Q—When the referee awards an indirect free-kick, must he signal that he has done so.

A—Yes. An International Board ruling states: "When the referee awards an indirect free-kick he shall signal it by raising his arm and this signal must precede the blowing of the whistle for the free-kick to be taken; no signal is required in the case of a direct free-kick."

Q—If a goalkeeper takes a goal-kick into a strong wind and the ball passes outside the penalty area before being blown back, whereupon the goalkeeper attempts to save but can only touch the ball before it enters the net, is it a goal?

A—No. The referee shall award an indirect free-kick, no other player having touched the ball.

It was good to see John Hobson making such a wonderful come-back after injury in the Reserves' North Midlands League encounter with Halifax Town at The Shay.

John has been dogged with atrocious bad luck in recent years, but always he comes bouncing back with determination and a zest for the game which has to be seen to be believed.

This season a cartilage operation has kept him on the sidelines and the match against Halifax was his first full game since October 23rd when he turned out on the left wing . . . against Halifax!

On that occasion the Reds won 6—1 and at The Shay they completed a resounding double with a 4—0 victory, John hitting a splendid hat-trick.

Without a doubt then, he was Barnsley's star man, but Peter Graham also had an outstanding game at inside-left.

Barnsley's other goal was scored by George Hamstead.

Hobson's bad luck even stayed with him to his intended come-back game against Notts County at Oakwell. The match had been in progress only 39 minutes when it was fogged off . . . the only match to have been so abandoned since the war!

Barnsley's team against Halifax was: Arblaster; Parker, Brookes; Ricks, Raggett, Barton; Ormond, Kerray, Hobson, Graham, Hamstead.

The Reserves next match is away to Grimsby Town on Tuesday night, kick-off 7-30 p.m.

Last Saturday the Juniors pulled off their second successive away victory in the Northern Intermediate League, winning 2—1 at Doncaster Rovers.

In the previous match they had beaten Newcastle United by the same score.

This morning they were due to meet Leeds United Junior at Elland Road and next Saturday they entertain Middlesbrough here at Oakwell, kick-off 3.15 p.m.

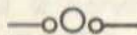

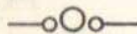
