MINEWS and VIEWS

The promotion issue is still very much open but, by virtue of the fact that we obtained three points out of the four at stake in our two away games during the Easter Holiday, we enhanced our chances.

It was a fine achievement on the part of our team to obtain those above-mentioned points. As is our custom we came back again after our home defeat by Watford. Both the clubs we played, Crewe Alexandra and Shrewsbury Town, are in the relegation zone, and are making strenuous efforts to escape the dreaded drop. This made both games doubly hard, so a win and a draw were splendid results.

These notes must be produced early, on Easter Monday to be exact, so the result of the Bournemouth game will not be known. I hope for one thing only.

On Saturday evening we held a one point lead over Luton Town, with seven games to be played. Our goal average, 59—32 (1.84) is .02 better than that of Luton Town, 62—34 (1.82), so we need every goal possible, and no more against.

On Tuesday evening next we play our third consecutive home game, against Crewe Alexandra. We hope by then to have greatly strengthened our position with six more points, and at least as many goals. After that game we shall have two more home games, against Mansfield Town and Barrow, and two away matches, at Rotherham and Walsall respectively. No games are easy, especially at this period of the season; but these two are doubly difficult, points are hard to come by at both of them.

Have you noticed what an attraction our team has become away from home? Almost invariably, we draw the highest

attendance of the season, e.g., Plymouth 20,000, who, the following week, drew a gate of 11,000 for their next home game.

There are three reasons for this. Firstly, as League Cup winners, every team is out to defeat the Cup-holders. Secondly, we are very much in the running for promotion, and thirdly, probably the chief one of all, our tremendous following away from home. We do thank those supporters who seem to travel to almost every away game. We had a large contingent at Crewe on Good Friday and on Saturday at Shrewsbury, Swindon's supporters outnumbered the home spectators. At least they did by the vocal support and the display of red and white favours.

This wonderful support away from home is a great asset to the team. Can we hope for such support at Rotherham (we'll show these tough Yorkshiremen — not "Danny Boy" but the "Fly be on the Turnip") and Walsall?

This afternoon we renew acquaintance with our old and trusted friends from Bristol Rovers, and also welcome back to the County Ground Team Manager Fred Ford. Although his spell at Swindon was quite short, we all remember him with great respect for his fine work at Swindon, especially with the apprentice professionals. Although we are always pleased to see him at the County Ground we rarely do so as he is so busy at Bristol. One thing, Mr. Ford, why didn't you beat Luton Town for us last week?

Early this season, on the 18th and 21st September, we lost two successive away games, first at Bournemouth 0—2, and then on the Saturday 1—2 at Bristol Rovers. (What wouldn't we give for two of those points now?)

The Swindon team on that occasion was Downsborough; Dawson, Thomas; Butler, Blick, Harland; Heath, Noble, Smith, Smart, Rogers. Sub.: Jones.

On the following Wednesday we came right back to form to defeat Blackburn Rovers 1—0 in the Third Round of the Football League Cup, and on the Saturday defeated Shrewsbury Town 3—0, and so began our great run of success in League and Cup.

Last season we gained four points from Bristol Rovers. The home game, played on Tuesday, 23rd April, 1968, was one of the most entertaining of the season. Good open, attacking football by both teams, and five excellent goals.

HAROLD JARMAN



On his day one of the best wing-halves in the Third Division. Joined the Club from Reading in 1965. He was at Elm Park for two seasons, after serving several years with Arsenal. Signed for Bristol Rovers last season on reaching his 18th birthday, and made his First Team debut at wing-half shortly afterwards. Frank, who comes from South Wales, is one of a number of bright Rovers' prospects from this area.

Born in Treorchy, talented Wayne Jones joined Bristol Rovers as an amateur in 1964/65 and played in their Youth Teams for two seasons as often as possible. PHIL ROBERTS

18-year-old, Phil is another young Bristol Rovers' player to sign as a full-time professional last season after completing his apprenticeship. A strong playing full-back from South Wales. Height 5ft. 10ins.

TOM STANTON

Full-back, signed during the close season 1968 from Mansfield Town, for whom he made 40 League appearances. Aged 20 and from Scotland, Tom has also had spells with Liverpool and Arsenal.

LARRY TAYLOR

Twenty-one-year-old Exeter-born goalkeeper of great promise. Joined Bristol Rovers on leaving school, soon becoming regular Reserve Team goalkeeper. First Team debut arriving after the serious injury to Bernard Hall. Has now over 50 League appearances to his credit. Height 5ft. 11ins.

STUART TAYLOR

Bristol-born centre-half who joined Bristol Rovers' amateur ranks in the summer of 1964 from a local amateur club. Tall and commanding, Stuart stands 6ft. 3½ ins. and weighs 13st. 11lbs. He became a full-time professional in April 1967. Age 21.

20-year-old goalkeeper, born in London. Ray made his League debut with Southend United whilst still an apprentice. Signed for Bristol Rovers July 1968.






