news & views

This afternoon we entertain Leicester City, a fine club and one of the outstanding teams in the country. Five months ago they appeared in the F.A. Cup Final at Wembley. Unfortunately, not only did they lose that game, but later were relegated to Division II. Most critics in the football world thought Leicester City very unlucky to lose their place in Division I. They considered them a fine footballing side.

The Leicester team contains many well known players: Peter Shilton (goalkeeper); Peter Rodrigues (full back), whom we remember at Cardiff City; David Nish (full back and captain); John Sjöberg (centre half); Andy Lochhead (centre forward) from Burnley; Len Glover (outside left) from Charlton. Talking of Leicester players reminds us of Frank Large, who did so well for that club a season ago. We were sorry indeed to see he was sent off last Saturday. That wasn't the Frank Large we knew. A great trier, but really a gentle giant, the last man to cause trouble.

It is with real pleasure we welcome back to the County Ground the manager, Mr. Frank O'Farrell, one of football's real gentlemen. We remember him in his early days as manager of Weymouth Town, when he visited Swindon in the Wessex Youth League, and later as a highly successful manager of Torquay United. We wish him well in the task which lies ahead of him.

Now to something quite different. We were very pleased to receive a letter regarding the programme from one of our supporters, Mr. Peter Taylor. This is the first letter we have had for several seasons. That fact answers one of his requests, namely a permanent column for letters from supporters who wish to air their views. Several seasons ago we ran a feature called "In off the Post", whereby we asked for letters which we printed, and where necessary gave an official reply or explanation. The response was most disappointing and the whole idea faded out.

We wish supporters would write to the Club, but for some reason best known to themselves, they prefer the "Press".

Regarding "Team Sheets", we have frequently pointed out that these cannot be printed on the back of the programme because the covers are produced at the beginning of the season. We have endeavoured to meet this request by putting the teams on the first page in two vertical columns. To my knowledge we have never promised to print them on the back of the programme.

However thank you Mr. Taylor for your suggestions and comments, many of which I fully agree with — namely advertisements, etc. We will be in communication with you again after several of your points have been discussed. I don't really think we can tell supporters what part to go to when they visit other grounds. Football supporters have varying ideas of the best vantage points suitable to them. It is just as well, otherwise some parts of the ground would be crowded and others vacant.

One very salient point: a few seasons ago we asked twenty (20) people at random why they purchased a programme. Fifteen (15) said simply to see the teams and the key to the half-time scores — nothing else. The remaining five (5) just bought a programme for no real reason. Food for thought!

Probably the happiest couple of football fans at the match with Charlton Athletic were Mr. and Mrs. H. Matthews, of 77 Arlington Avenue, Toronto, Canada. Mr. Matthews used to live in Victoria Road before he emigrated to Canada in 1911. The last match he saw Swindon play before leaving for Canada was the F.A. semi-final cup-tie with Chelsea. After returning to England in the Canadian Forces during World War I, he went back to Canada and is now retired. When the mail service was more regular — and a great deal cheaper — he looked forward each week to the arrival of the "Football Pink" but now has to rely on the football news in his local Canadian paper. He told me that Ernie Hunt put on a splendid performance in Canada, whilst on tour, but thought that the Charlton game was "just great". Nice to know that Old Swindonians are still interested in the "Town" — and he joined the Supporters' Club after the match and went away with this year's and last year's Handbooks.

The Social Club darts teams started off this season's Independent Clubs competition with two good wins. The "A" team beat the Alliance Club 4—2, whilst the "B" team (a new combination this season) came from behind to beat RAFA by 3—2.

The football teams in the Sunday League, however, didn't do so well. The Supporters' Club, away to Wheatsheaf, lost 6—4 (at least there were plenty of goals) whilst the Social Club football team lost at home to Akers Athletic by 5—1. The West Swindon Thistles also fell by the wayside, losing away to M. & B. 0—7.

Pen Pictures 1969/70

PETER SHILTON

He was the youngest goalkeeper ever to play for the Club in League Football when at 16 he played against Everton in season 1965/66. He is one of City's best discoveries since the war and signed professional on 29th June, 1966. He has gained honours for the England schoolboys, youth and Under-23 sides.

PETER RODRIGUES

Full back Peter is a Welsh international who was signed from Cardiff City on 31st December, 1965. He is fast and a deadly tackler who uses the ball with intelligence. He has returned to his best form after a run of injuries.

ALAN WOOLLETT

Full back Alan is a Leicester born player who started as a centre half but has played many matches at full back for Leicester. He signed as a professional in August 1964.

DAVID NISH

At 21 became the youngest City captain and is an all rounder at sport. Apart from achieving distinction at football, he has played badminton for Staffordshire, his birth place was Burton-on-Trent, and tennis for Leicestershire.

BOBBY ROBERTS

A half back who was signed from Motherwell in September 1963. He has made 200 League and Cup appearances up to 1968/69 and held the captaincy in season 1967/68. Has played at wing half and inside forward for City.

JOHN SJOBERG

Centre half John is the longest serving player on City's books. Signed in August 1958. Previously played for the Aberdeen club, Banks O'Dee, and broke into League Football in October 1960. Completed 250 League and Cup appearances last season.

GRAHAM CROSS

One of Leicester's best known players is half back Graham Cross. A product of Leicester schools football, he became a professional with the club in November 1960, and has gained international recognition at Youth and Under-23 level. Cross has been a cricketer with Leicestershire since 1961.

PAUL MATTHEWS

A local Leicester discovery who has developed through the Club's ranks. A winger, he signed as an apprentice in September 1963 and as a full professional the following August. He has First Division experience.

RODNEY FERN

Like Nish, Rodney was born at Burton-on-Trent. A forward of the thrustful type who is a strong runner and promising marksman. Made his debut at home to Leeds on 3rd February, 1968.

ANDY LOCHHEAD

A centre forward who was signed on 30th October, 1968 from Burnley. Debut for Leicester versus Newcastle at St. James Park on 2nd November, 1968. Born Renfrew. Gave notable service to Burnley at prompter and marksman for nine seasons. Scored 100 League goals for the Turf Moor club. Scottish Under-23 international.

DAVID GIBSON

One of the most skilful ball players in League football today. A Scot from Winchburgh, near Edinburgh, he played for Hibernian until his transfer in January 1962. He is a full Scottish international.

LEN GLOVER

Len is a fast, tricky winger. He was signed from Charlton in November 1967 and made his debut at home to Arsenal on the 18th November, 1967.

ALISTAIR BROWN

Junior from Musselburgh, signed 13th April, 1968. Made League debut against Sunderland, May 1969, scoring both home goals in 2-1 win. Height 5ft. 11ins. Weight 11st. 8½lbs.

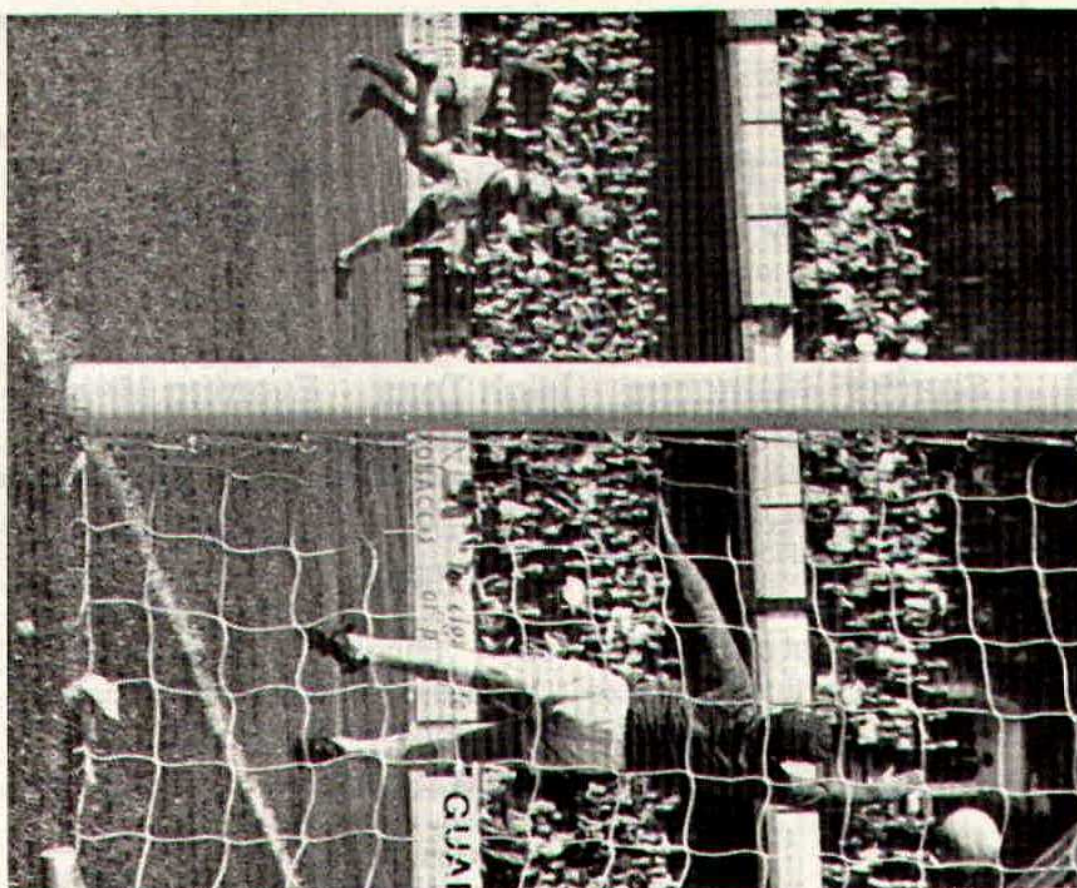

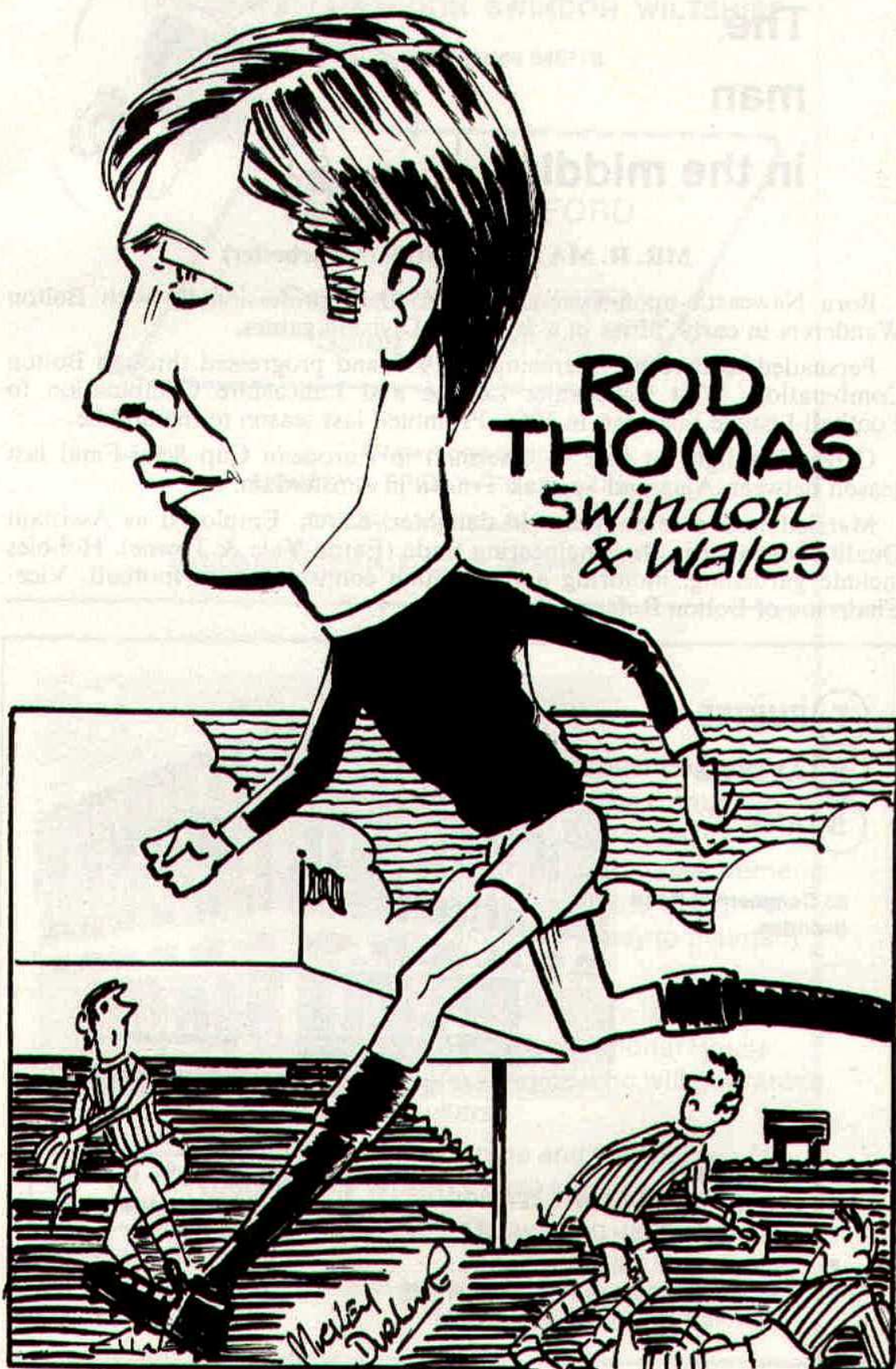
