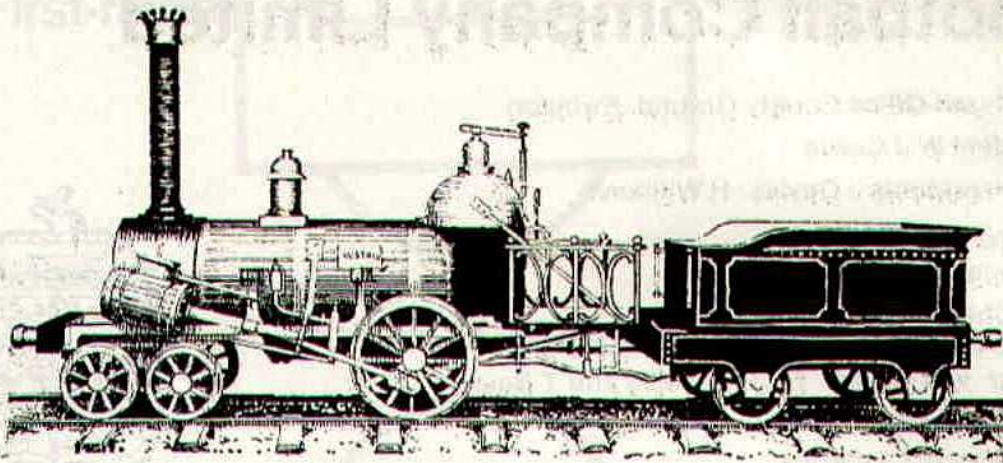

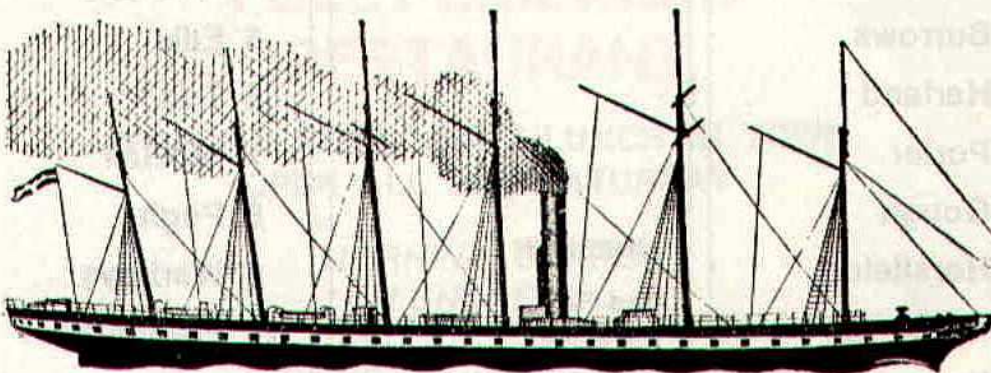

# news & views

We have now gained a draw away from home, thank goodness, because everyone connected with the Club felt there was a jinx against us when playing on opponents' grounds. Certainly the players were beginning to feel depressed. It seemed fate was against us as at Birmingham, a goal by the home team in the last second; Norwich, where we lost 0-1 right against the run of play; Fulham (League Cup, 0-1), a very lucky deflection producing the only goal. It was little consolation at Leicester to be told by the officials and Manager that Swindon was the best team they had played this season. Certainly it was a great game and most entertaining for the spectators, but brought no reward to Swindon.

Whilst the match at Oxford was by no means a classic display of football, it was indeed very hard fought, and really it was a typical local 'Derby'. Few would deny the fact that Swindon deserved a point.

To me the Oxford ground seems a difficult one to play on with its size and slope, and close proximity on all sides of the spectators. The high bounce of the ball often creates difficulties and yet Oxford's home record is very poor. Out of nine matches played they have won 3, drawn 3, and lost 3; with a goal average of 10 for and 13 against.

Compare this with their away games – won 5, lost 2, drawn 2; with 14 goals for and 9 against. It is quite the reverse of the usual course of events, and most observers would consider Oxford's pitch an advantage to the home team.

Swindon's record is just the opposite. Today we welcome for the first time in a League match Sheffield Wednesday, with whom we now seem to have quite an association due no doubt to the fact that we 'transferred' our former Manager to that Club. Obviously he still carries out his intentions to play open, attacking football judged by their goal average – 24 for, 29 against.

We are indeed pleased to see 'Danny', a great guy, a tough and hard, straight-as-a-dye Yorkshireman, one of the most genuine men in football. A man who made a great impression on the

Town in so short a space of time.

Good luck, Mr. Williams, but I'm afraid we shall show no sentiment or sympathy, if we can win 5-0, or even 10-0, we will, we need the goals and the points.

Whatever the outcome, we are sure it will be a bright little gathering afterwards, and a smile and chuckle on that bright, cheerful face.

Many supporters will remember the last game against Sheffield Wednesday, played at Hillsborough on Saturday, 17th February, 1968. We were unlucky to lose 1-2. Roger Smart scored in the first half and Wednesday scored two in the second half, the first a fortunate long shot by right-back Smith (recently transferred to Coventry for £100,000) and the second a splendid header by centre-forward Ritchie.

Also in the Wednesday team that day was Megson (now coach and captain of Bristol Rovers); Mobley (transferred to Q.P.R.); McCalliog (transferred for a large fee to Wolverhampton); Ritchie (transferred to Stoke for a large fee); and Whitham (transferred to Everton recently for £100,000).

The Swindon team for that match was Downsborough; Thomas, Trollope; Butler, Nurse, Harland; Heath, Penman, Terry, Smart, Rogers. Sub.: Noble. Manager: Mr. D. Williams.

We seem to be a little unfortunate with injuries, especially to our younger players, many of whom were showing good promise at the beginning of the season. Terry Hubbard, who was on the fringe of the first team (he made one short appearance as substitute), has a very persistent injury to the knee, which is becoming difficult to resolve. We wish him well.

## Goal scoring feats by 'Wednesday' players

**DEREK DOOLEY**, in promotion-winning season 1951-52, scored 46 League goals and one in the F.A. Cup - 47. Which total at the time, was a national post-war record. His 46 League goals was also a Sheffield Wednesday club record. Scored five goals against Notts County at Hillsborough on 3rd November, 1951.

In 60 League matches in his brief career he scored 62 goals and in all grades of football for Wednesday scored 180 goals in 168 matches. Dooley had his leg broken - and subsequently amputated - at Preston in February, 1953.

**JIMMY TROTTER** scored 37 League goals in season 1925-26, when Wednesday won the Second Division championship, and was the top scorer in the Second Division. The total was then a Wednesday club record. Trotter also scored 37 goals in 1926-27 in the First Division and was the top scorer in that Division.

Trotter scored five goals against Portsmouth at Hillsborough in the 1924-25 season; also five against Stockport County, also at Hillsborough, in season 1925-26 - the only forward to have scored five goals for Wednesday twice in League matches.

**JACKIE ROBINSON**, Wednesday inside right, scored 93 goals during war-time and transitional seasons (1939-46). In 1942-43 season. Robinson did the "hat trick" six times and his goals' total was 35.

**DAVID MCLEAN**, who joined Wednesday from Preston North End in February, 1911, scored 88 goals in League matches in four and a half seasons. He scored four goals in a match on four occasions; scored three 12 times.

**MARK HOOPER** scored 21 League goals from the outside right position in season 1927-28 and equalled the feat in 1929-30 in League and Cup.

**ELLIS RIMMER** scored 22 goals from the outside left position in season 1930-31 and two more in F.A. Cup-ties.

Ellis Rimmer scored in each round of the F.A. Cup competition of 1935, eight goals all told, including two in the Final.

**JACK BALL**, centre-forward, scored 11 goals for Wednesday with penalty kicks - out of 15 taken - in League matches in season 1932-33. His goals' total for season - 33.

**JIM DAILEY**, centre-forward, scored all five goals for Wednesday against Barnsley in a Second Division match at Hillsborough on 6th September, 1947.

**JOHNNY FANTHAM**. Scored 147 League goals for Wednesday. This is a post-war club record; previously held by Red. Froggatt. (140) The most League goals ever scored for Wednesday are the 200 by centre forward Andrew Wilson before the first World War.

Winger. Born Hayes, Middlesex, 13th September, 1945. Signed for Wednesday from West Ham on 1st August. He won England caps at schoolboy and youth level and joined West Ham in 1963. He soon forced his way into the first team and played in the Final of the F.A. Cup in 1964 and the European Cup Winners Cup Final in 1965.

### **Colin Smith**

Born Sheffield, 24th January, 1954. Inside-forward. Former apprentice professional, Sheffield and Yorkshire Boys player.

### **Peter Springett**

Born Fulham, 8th May, 1946. Goalkeeper. Peter has won Under-23 and Young England honours and won a League Cup medal with Q.P.R. at Wembley in 1967. Joined Wednesday 22nd May, 1967 in unique part exchange deal with Ron.

### **David Sunley**

Forward. Born Skelton, Yorks, 6th February, 1952. Former club apprentice professional.

### **William Thompson**

Born 20th January, 1952, at Liverpool. Centre-half. Former captain of Liverpool Boys, played for Wednesday on their Italian tour in May, 1970.

### **Sammy Todd**

Wing-half. Born Belfast, Northern Ireland, 22nd September, 1945. A product of the Burnley scouting net and this was his only club until his transfer to Wednesday in May, 1970. Seven times an Irish international.

### **Harold Wilcockson**

Born Sheffield, 27th March, 1943. Full-back. Former Rotherham player but transferred to Doncaster from whom Wednesday signed him on 17th December, 1969, in exchange for Irvine and Branfoot. Debut v Arsenal, 20th December.

### **Alan Warboys**

Born Goldthorpe, 18th April, 1949. Centre-forward. Joined Wednesday from Doncaster Rovers in the summer of 1968. League debut v Spurs, away, 24th August, 1968.

### **Gerry Young**

Born South Shields, 1st October, 1936. Wing-half. Member of the 1966 F.A. Cup Final team and England international. Young is one of the Club's most loyal post-war players. Made his debut in 1956 and has played in many positions, once scoring a hat-trick against Manchester United at centre-forward.



## **Danny Williams**

Became Manager of Sheffield Wednesday on July 18th, 1969. He had been very successful while at Swindon, having guided the 'Town' to promotion to Division II and the winning of the League Cup in the same season. During his playing career he made over 600 appearances for Rotherham.


