news & views

Unfortunately, these notes have to be written well in advance because of the Christmas holiday, before the Queen's Park Rangers game in fact. May the result of that game be as happy as the one in London the previous week.

We seem to report each programme about departures from the County Ground. We have had a change on the Board of Directors, Mr. Cowley replacing Mr. Earle. It is difficult for me to comment, all I can say is to repeat what was written regarding Mr. Ford - 'He deserved a better fate'.

If one really believes what appears in the Press, other moves are imminent. Football finance is an amazing business, but how can one equate a reported sum of £90,000 for one of our players with £15,000 which we received for Stan Harland. Such sums and names are mostly surmise, but I am sure this kind of news is not good for the game, and especially for clubs and players.

We are sorry to see our ex-player Ernie Hunt in trouble, and very surprised at his outburst. That is not the Ernie we knew - rather the reverse. Not being able to play for three weeks will be the hardest part for him - still there's always the 'Milk-Cart', rather than the carol singing.

Now the great news - Arsenal at Swindon. Just the fillip we needed, and one to put everyone on their toes.

Supporters still remember the great victory at Wembley, and no doubt many

Swindonians can recall the visit of the then very famous Arsenal in 1929. The game almost did not take place, as a heavy fall of snow occurred overnight. However an army of volunteers cleared the snow from the pitch and piled it around the ground.

Arsenal were just beginning to be built into a great team by probably the finest manager of all time, Herbert Chapman. He it was who built the Huddersfield Town team to win the First Division Championship three years in succession (1924/5/6), and repeated that feat at Arsenal in 1933/4/5.

It was in 1929 he introduced what was then known as the 'stopper' centre-half, with Herbie Roberts acting in that capacity, although he did not play at Swindon owing to injury. Seddon took his place.

The game at Swindon was an excellent one and resulted in a 0-0 draw, while the return match at Highbury drew a capacity crowd, and Swindon were very unlucky to lose 0-1. The game was controlled by an outstanding referee, Mr. Jack Howcroft, who always had a soft spot for Swindon and their manager Mr. Sam Allen.

Archie Archer, still helping in the family business in Commercial Road, and approaching eighty years of age, had a great game in the replay. Also in the team was Wally Dickenson (captain), still hale and hearty, 'Tober' Weston, Ted Nash, Danny Bew, Harry Morris, Jack Johnson, Bert Davies and Bert Denyer.

Another person for whom this game will revive nostalgic memories is Mr. Tom Parker, captain of the Arsenal on that occasion, and still a frequent visitor to the County Ground as scout for Southampton.

Still very fit, and a real gentleman.

However, enough for the time being of Cup football, we still face two important League games before the 15th January, 1972. Next week we travel to Fulham, and the following Saturday entertain Carlisle United. A good result is very urgently necessary, not only to improve our League position, but both these clubs occupy lowly places in the table.

Today's game is bound to be hard fought. The County Ground is one of Portsmouth's lucky grounds. Last season's fixture produced an excellent match despite the very bad conditions. A heavy storm prior to the game almost made the pitch waterlogged, and the ball was often held back in a pool of water. Swindon were much the superior side in the first half, and scored twice through Horsfield and Noble. Portsmouth got on top in the second half, and Storrie scored ten minutes from the end of the game, but they failed to equalise. Despite the foul weather, the attendance was very good; 14,682 spectators watched the game, which was excellently refereed by Mr. G. C. Kew of Leeds. In the return game played at Fratton Park on Easter Monday, Swindon caught 'Pompey' very much off form, and won by 2 goals to nil.

Again I would like to recommend to our supporters the Combination games. Our young reserve team is putting on some splendid performances, full of life and vigour, plenty of running and lots of goals, yes goals. Against Bristol Rovers we saw in all five really good goals, as the result of well thought out moves. These lads improve with every game.

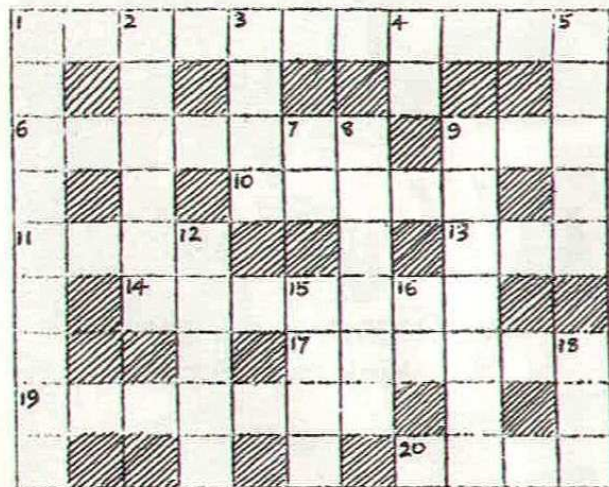

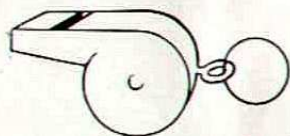

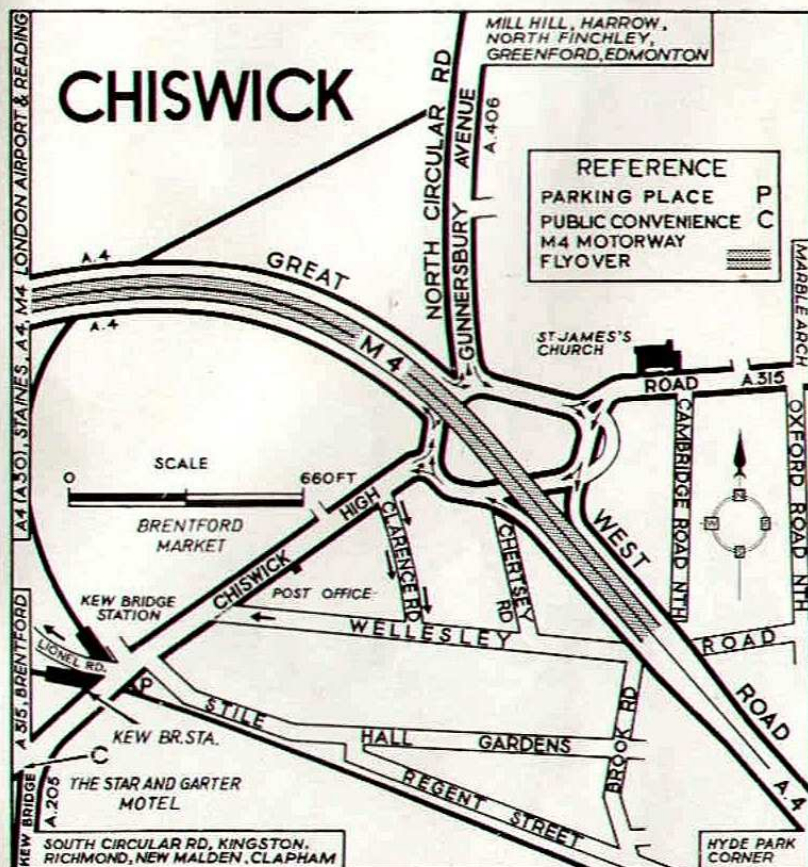
