

Carrow Road Notebook

This afternoon Swindon Town provide Norwich City with their last League opposition at Carrow Road at the end of a memorable 1971-72 season. And, following last Saturday's narrow defeat at Middlesbrough, this has become the most vital last home match in the Canaries' history. In thanking supporters for their encouragement over the past nine months, therefore, we ask for one last, full-blooded 'push', for on the outcome of today's game may well depend the fare that will be on offer next

There can be no minimising the importance of today's game. It dwarfs the vital nature even of the home fixtures with Millwall, Birmingham City and Queen's Park Rangers, and in extending a warm welcome to Swindon Town we will be forgiven for being wholly partisan and wishing the Canaries a con-

vincingly successful afternoon.

Even without the prize dangling so temptingly in front of us, the visit of Swindon would still have provided above-average end-of-season fare. It provides the opportunity for the team's fifth double of the campaign, and the chance to complete the 1971-72 term without a home League defeat. Though these are, of course, minor considerations when the picture as a whole is taken into account.

These are momentous days, and although the League curtain officially closes on Carrow Road at the end of today's match we hope there will be further opportunity for the fans to salute the players who have done so magnificently to keep the Norwich flag flying at the top of the Second Division for so much of the

season.

Swindon are among the Canaries' oldest soccer acquaintances. Meetings between the clubs date back to our first season in the old Southern League, in 1905-6, and the Wiltshire club are this afternoon making their fortyfourth appearance in Norwich with league points at stake. In the previous forty-three they have won nine times and drawn twelve, leaving City with twenty-two victories. Since the last war, however, Swindon's successes here have been limited to two wins (5-1 in 1946-47, 4-2 ten years later) and six drawn.

In each of the past two seasons City have been successful by the only goal at Carrow Road (Glen Self scored it last season, in his home League debut; Albert Bennett the season before), and it was by the only goal that we won at Swindon last December. Scorer that day was Peter Silvester, who was making his 100th League and Cup appearance in City's colours.

Despite the fact that they have never been higher than the Second Division (their best season in this section was 1969-70, when they finished in fifth place), Swindon have a proud record in British football. Formed in 1881 and turning professional in 1894, they had to wait until 1963, when they were runners-up to Northampton in Division Three, for their first taste of Second Division soccer. Two seasons later they were relegated; but in 1969 they were back in Division Two again, with Watford, and this time they have had little difficulty in retaining their place.

Last season they finished in a respectable mid-table position, and they are similarly placed this term. And with Dave Mackay as team manager they have high hopes of improving on their League status in the not too distant future. In any case, their away record this season gives City good reason to treat them with considerable respect. They have won five, drawn five of their away fixtures, the

clubs' respective records reading:

P. W. D. L. F. A. Pt. 0 39 16 32 9 16 28 15 20 12 8 Norwich (h) 19 5 Swindon (a) It is in cup matches, however, that Swindon have shown their ability when under pressure. They have twice reached the semi-finals of the F.A. Cup-though that was in their Southern League days, in 1910 and 1912-and in recent years they have proved themselves outstanding trophy fighters by winning the Football League Cup and the Anglo-Italian Inter-League Clubs competition. It was in 1968-69 that they covered themselves with glory. This their second promotion season, also saw them reach the League Cup final at Wembley where, having previously disposed of Torquay, Bradford City, Blackburn Rovers, Coventry City, Derby County and Burnley, they beat Arsenal 3-1, two of their goals coming from Don Rogers, the other from Roger Smart.

PETER DOWNSBOROUGH. Halifax-born keeper and one of the soundest in the Second Division. A product of local football in Halifax, he started his League career with Halifax Town, for whom he made nearly 150 appearances before moving to Swindon in August, 1965. Has been Town's regular keeper for a number of seasons.

ROD THOMAS. Welshman from Glyncorrwg who joined Swindon from Southern League club Gloucester in 1964. He has made well over 200 appearances for the Wiltshire side, has gained Welsh international honours, and is one of the most sought-after defenders in League football.

NORMAN TROLLOPE. Born Wroughton. Longserving member of the Swindon side, for whom he has made some 500 appearances. He and Thomas form an experienced, capable full-back partnership.

RAY BUNKELL. Midfield player who was given a free transfer by Tottenham at the end of last season and was promptly snapped up by Swindon. He recently celebrated his first term at the County Ground with his first goal for the club, in the home game against Cardiff City.

FRANK BURROWS. Larkhall-born Scot and strong man of the Swindon defence. He joined Swindon from Scunthorpe United, for whom he made over 100 appearances in three seasons, and he has well exceeded that number of outings for the Wiltshire club. Formerly played for Raith Rovers.

JOE BUTLER. One of several Geordies in the Swindon side. Born at Newcastle, he made a few senior appearances for Newcastle United before moving to the County Ground, where he has been a regular for several seasons.

TERRY HUBBARD. Born Sebastopol. Discovered and developed by Swindon, he is a

youngster who has made his impact on the League side only this season.

ROGER SMART. Locally-born midfield player who has played all of his League football with his home-town team, for whom he has made over 300 appearances, scoring nearly 50 goals.

ARTHUR HORSFIELD. Another of Swindon's Geordies. Born at Newcastle, he started his Football League career with Middlesbrough, where he established his reputation as a striker, scoring over fifty goals in just over 100 appearances. He subsequently moved to Newcastle United, for whom he had twenty-odd outings before being transferred to Swindon, where he has maintained his scoring record.

PETER NOBLE. Third of the Newcastle brigade in the Swindon line-up. He joined Town from his home side, United, and since moving to the County Ground has this season topped the fifty-goal mark in approaching 200 appearances,

DON ROGERS. Born Paulton, Somerset, and one of the most respected strikers in League football. He joined Swindon as an apprentice after leaving school and was soon hailed as a future star. Made his first appearance in 1962-63

season and, developing into a talented, goalscoring winger, became much sought after by leading League clubs. However, despite his record, and selection for England's Under-23 side, he preferred to remain at the County Ground.

DICK LEGG. Youngster who signed professional forms for Swindon last August and been knocking on the door of League side in recent months. Top scorer for Town's Combination side.

ONE OF SOCCER'S 'GREATS'

One of football's 'greats', Dave Mackay joined Swindon Town this season as a player after an illustrious career with Hearts, Tottenham and Derby County. Taking over as team chief from former manager Fred Ford, however, he has recently concentrated mainly on building up the Swindon side for next season and said after the 3-1 home victory over Cardiff City that he did not intend to play again this term. Joining Spurs from Hearts in 1959, Mackay became an integral part of the successful Spurs side of the next decade, then moved on to Derby, where his influence helped to guide the Rams into the First Division. Capped for Scotland at schoolboy, Under-23 and full international levels, he has twice during his playing career made a completely successful comeback after breaking a lee. career made a completely successful comeback after breaking a leg.



For our final home Football League match of the season we give a warm welcome to Mr. B. J. Homewood, who is in fact paying his second visit to Carrow Road this term. He commenced his refereeing career in Middlesex in 1948-49 season officiating in both Youth and Senior Amateur Leagues before being appointed to the Southern League where he served for five seasons on the line and eight in the middle. Promotion to the Football League line followed for a further five seasons and then he was appointed to the middle. Some of his more important appointments were as linesman in the F.A. Cup Final West Bromwich Albion v. Everton and he also officiated in the Anglo-Italian Competition, and Texaco Cup semi-final as referee.

Mr. Homewood is married and is employed as a computer engineer and his hobbies include tennis, walking and gardening. Most seasons he referees over sixty matches and still enjoys his amateur games as well as the Football League matches.

He is assisted today by linesmen, Mr. D. R. Smith from Enfield, Middlesex, and Mr. R. N. Morphew from Ipswich.
