

## MATCH SCENE

SWINDON TOWN captured the imagination of Britains soccer followers a couple of seasons ago when they beat the mighty Arsenal in the final of the League Cup by 3 goals to one.

The outstanding players in that Swindon side at the time were Rod Thomas and Don Rogers — two players that are still with the club despite rumours in the press that they might be moving to more "fashionable" clubs. These two also played a great part for the Wiltshire Club when the Swindon lads reached the final of the Anglo Italian Competition and won the Cup in a trouble-torn game in Naples.

Indeed, Italian fans after that game were wondering why Rogers was with a Second Division club and why he had never played for England?

Swindon's present Manager, is Dave Mackay. He was formerly with Hearts, Spurs, and Derby County as a player and he did have a short playing time with his present club before taking over as Manager following Fred Ford's dismissal a few seasons ago.

Mackay will be seeking to obtain the most from his players this season, especially his two star men, Rogers and Thomas, for he has publicly stated that unless he obtains success as a Manager within a certain time he will pack the whole lot in!

This year Swindon have made a similar start to ourselves. In fact, we are placed just above them in the Second Division table on goal average. Last week the former Liverpool player Steve Peplow was in goalscoring form against Bristol City when he popped one in for the "Railwaymen" in the first half and with eight minutes to go to the end of the match he snatched the winner.

Steve was one of Bill Shankly's bright starlets in the Central League side that won the Championship for two seasons running. However, Steve was unable to get himself a place in the First Division side so he moved away from his home town Club at Anfield and moved to Swindon, at first on a loan transfer and later a full transfer.

Among the other players in the "Mackay Squad" at the moment are:

Peter Downsborough, a Halifax born goalkeeper who was one of the hero's for the Swindon team when they won the League Cup. He has been in the back line of defence now for a considerable number of years.

Joe Butler is one of the favourites with the County Ground crowd. Joe comes from nearby Newcastle and was formerly with them as a player.

Ray Treacy joined the Club from Charlton Athletic during the close season and he looks a useful type of player for the Swindon set-up. He is fast, courageous and he has that happy knack of putting the ball between the posts.

"lan's murder to live with when he's not playing football", that's Isobel Porterfield's candid summary of lan when he is out of action through injury. "It was D. for disaster for me mainly because all my relatives and Isobel's family were already and waiting in the town where I was to be married. However, after a bit of explaining Mr. McColl said it would be alright. I was never more relieved in my life!!"

It was not a happy ending for lan, however, because we were knocked out of the Cup on the Wednesday by Norwich after dominating the whole of the match and a breakaway goal by Hugh Curran, now with the Wolves, beat us.

"It was sickening", adds lan, "but that is the way some of these matches go and there is very little one can do about it".


One of lan's hobbies is looking after the garden and now he is thinking again about taking up golf although he was advised against it about a year ago.






