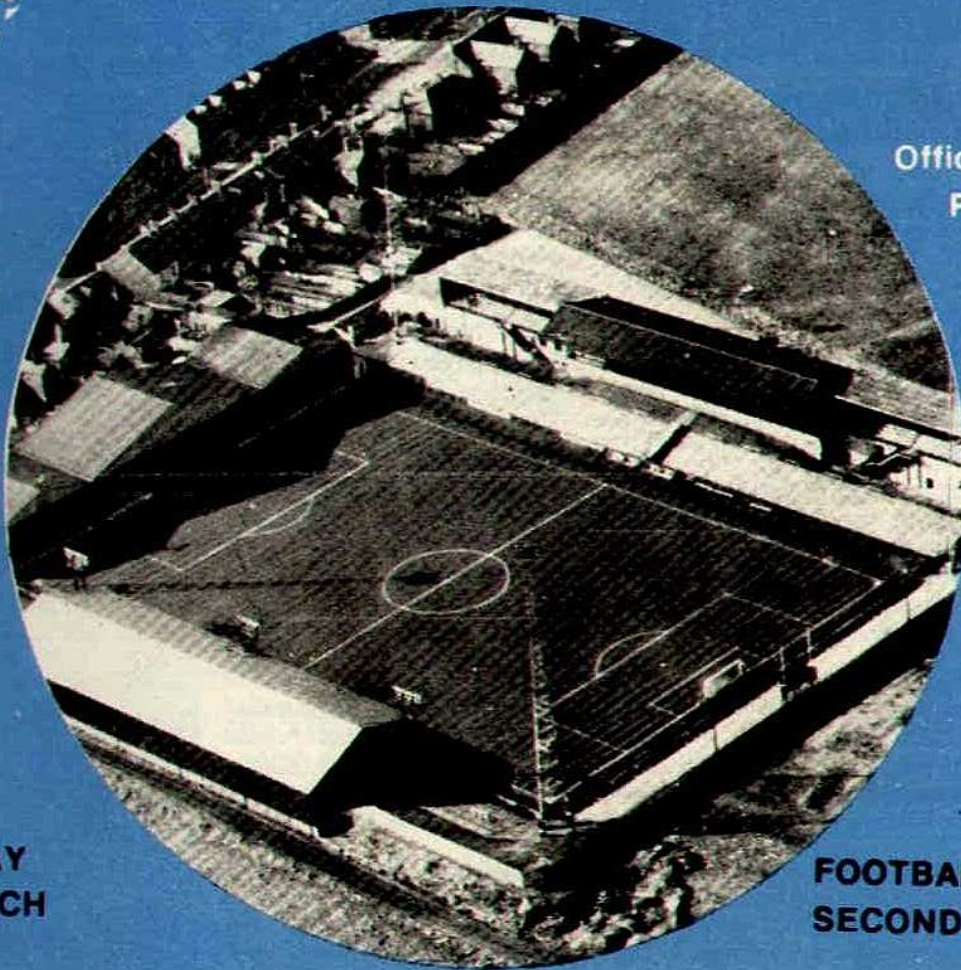

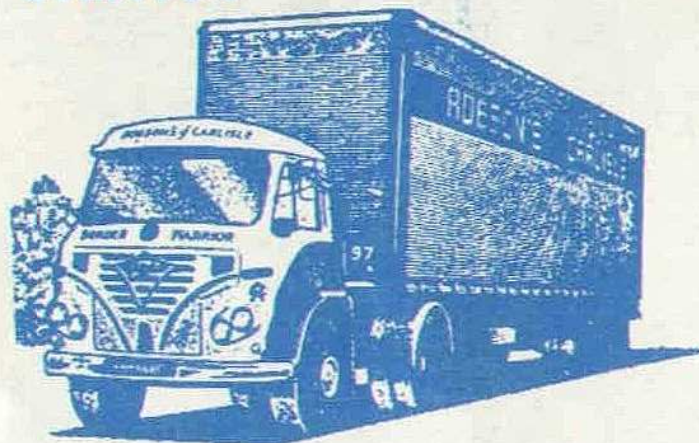

A number of first division managers this week have again condemned the three up and three down system of promotion and relegation between the first and second divisions and signified they'll attempt to have the rule amended at the A.G.M. of the Football League in June.

It's not surprising, it has been under fire since it was passed by the clubs last June and it might be argued that we haven't had enough time yet to analyse its benefits outside the first division. Up there of course it isn't going to benefit anybody.

In fact the main argument against it from the men who aren't promoted anywhere except into Europe if they're in the top three but have an extra noose dangling over their heads, is that three teams relegated has brought a fear and a caution into their game where it becomes essential not to lose, and it extends a long way up from the bottom three places....involving half the first division in fact.

Didn't we have some of that when only two clubs were relegated? A million words must have been written last season about negative, defensive football that helped to keep the fans at home, so I doubt if one extra relegation place has been responsible for all of it. And has there been anything negative about the attempts of the clubs most in trouble to get out of trouble.

A more valid point I feel is that when there are eight or nine clubs little more than a lost game away from that third place from bottom, a manager doesn't dare to introduce young players into the side he would normally introduce at this stage of the season.

What really amazes me is that seemingly a lot of club chairmen actually voted for the proposal when the manager of their club was against it. That's like having a dog and barking yourself...a 'you mightn't like it but you're stuck with it' attitude.

There should be interest to support the change on the basis that it maintains crowd interest for more clubs for a lot longer, but sadly you look around for it in vain at Brunton Park. The team are in the middle of a fight that could bring first division football for the first time and judging by an attendance that was below 7,000 for the Palace match, the public doesn't want to know.

Now is the crunch time with all the clubs sharing the same ambition set to play each other and if the pattern remains as it has done all season a record low points total could see a club up into the top flight. If there aren't ten or twelve thousand people in these parts sufficiently interested to come along and give the lads a little more backing, atmosphere and lift that might just make a vital difference, the future must be even more precarious than I thought.

If doubts still exist about whether first division football is wanted, the short answer is ask the players. They count and nobody can stop them from wanting it.

And if they withdrew that extra promotion place, this season could be the best chance United will ever have.

THE VISITING CLUB by Tony Pullein

There now seems little hope of Swindon avoiding relegation. They have occupied one of the bottom three positions almost throughout the season, the Robins have been in 22nd place since January 20, and a run of eleven games without a win — coming at a time when they needed to show some signs of recovery — has left them a long, long way behind the safety target.

The re-engagement of manager Danny Williams — the man who plotted the club's famous defeat of Arsenal in the 1969 League Cup final — was a positive move by the board to try and save the situation. Mr. Williams, who subsequently managed Sheffield Wednesday and Mansfield, succeeded Les Allen but time was very much against him from the outset.

Swindon may now have reason to regret the sale of their two international players earlier this season because, in present circumstances, the experience of Welsh international defender Rod Thomas (sold to Derby for £100,000) and Republic of Ireland striker, Ray Treacy, who went to Preston for £30,000, would be invaluable.

Treacy has been particularly missed. Top scorer last season with 14 goals, he has not yet been effectively replaced. The only player who scored with any regularity was Peter Eastoe, who was on loan from Wolves and who was later recalled. But on the eve of the transfer deadline they completed his permanent transfer for £70,000.f

Swindon have also missed the devastating running and shooting of Don Rogers, who left last season for Crystal Palace.

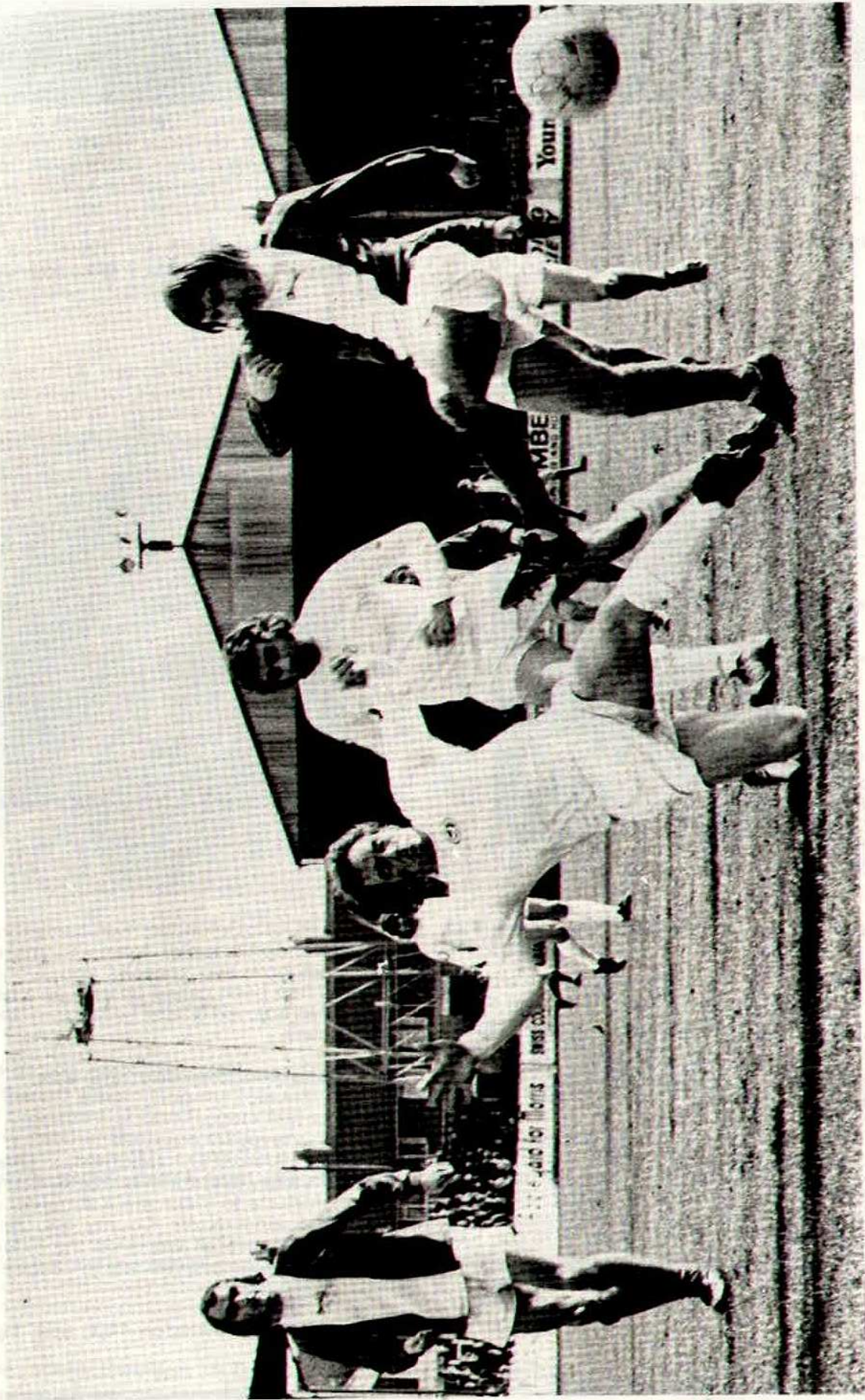
Perhaps Swindon's one consolation at the moment is that they have many young players in their team. Goalkeeper Jimmy Allan, defenders John McLaughlin and Ken Stroud, midfield man Terry Hubbard, plus forwards David Moss, Dave Syrett, Dick Legg and Roy Compton are all still fairly new to League football and, while all show great potential, they have some way to go before maturing to their peak form.

With but three points from drawn games at Preston (1-1), Orient (0-0) and Oxford (1-1), Swindon are the only Second Division club without an away win to their credit. The Robins' last away victory in the League was at Middlesbrough (2-0) in November 1972. Since then they have not chalked up a victory in 27 away League matches.

For much of the season Swindon cushioned themselves against such dismal away form by achieving good results on their own ground. Until February, Bristol City, Middlesbrough and Millwall were the only visiting teams to win at the County Ground. Then they picked up only one point from four home matches, a slump which put them in their present uncomfortable position.

Two Frank Clarke goals earned us a point at Swindon in November, when Peter Eastoe netted twice for the home side. Last season's meeting at Brunton Park ended 3-0 with Bobby Owen and Chris Balderstone (2) getting our goals. Our League record against Swindon:

MEN OF THE OPPOSITION

JIMMY ALLAN (Goalkeeper). Jimmy won the first-team job this season after deputising several times over the previous two seasons. He became the first League player to exercise his option not to play on a Sunday when Swindon played Bolton in February.

League record: Swindon 49 aps.

JOHN McLAUGHLIN (Defender). John won a regular place in Colchester's team last season, though only 18 years of age. Swindon signed him earlier this season.

League record: Colchester 66 aps. 2 gls.; Swindon 11 aps. 1 gl.

RON POTTER (Defender). Ron learned his craft as a West Bromwich apprentice and made his League debut for the Throstles in 1968/69. Swindon signed him in 1970 and he took over as dual centre-back last season.

League record: W.B.A. 8(1) aps.; Swindon 67(1) aps.

DAVID MUNKS (Defender). A former England youth international, David began his career with Sheffield United, making many First Division appearances. Portsmouth signed him in 1969 and he moved on to Swindon this season.

League record: Sheff. Un. 108(4) aps. 1 gl.; Portsmouth 132(5) aps. 2 gls.; Swindon 13 aps.

JOHN TROLLOPE (Defender). John has been on parade -- apart from a short injury absence continually for 12 seasons. In one unbroken run he played 368 consecutive games and a few weeks ago he set a new club record when he surpassed Maurice Owen's achievement of 554 League appearances completed in 1963.

League record: Swindon 565(1) aps. 17 gls.

ALAN SPRATLEY (Goalkeeper). Alan got his first chance in Swindon's senior team when Allan refused to play on Sunday, for religious reasons. He later won a recall for several games. Swindon paid Q.P.R. £8,000 for him last summer.

League record: Q.P.R. 29(1) aps.; Swindon 7 aps.

KEN STROUD (Defender). Ken came through from Swindon's junior teams to make his first-team bow two seasons ago. Until this term he had been called up only as a deputy but he has enjoyed one or two runs in the side this season.

League record: Swindon 22(2) aps.

TERRY HUBBARD (Midfield). One of Swindon's key players in midfield, Terry had the misfortune to dislocate a shoulder while playing against Notts County and he has since spent several weeks on the sidelines. Swindon first introduced him to League football in 1970/71.

League record: Swindon 44(1) aps. 1 gl.

MICK McGOVERN (Midfield). Mick grew up with Q.P.R. but didn't get many chances in their first-team. He spent a short while on loan to Watford prior to transferring to Swindon for £10,000 last season.

League record: Q.P.R. 10(2) aps.; Watford 4 aps.; Swindon 25(2) aps. 2 gls.

DAVID MOSS (Striker). David usually raids down the left wing, filling the role left vacant by the departure of Don Rogers last season. David is another Swindon discovery.

League record: Swindon 46(9) aps., 9 gls.

DAVE SYRETT (Striker). A former Swindon apprentice, Dave made his League debut this season and was tried on several occasions as substitute before coming in for a lengthy spell in attack.

League record: Swindon 16(7) aps. 3 gls.

TOMMY JENKINS (Midfield). Swindon paid a then club record £50,000 fee to Southampton for Tom last season. Once discarded by West Ham and Orient, Tom drifted into non-League football with Margate until given a come-back chance by Reading in 1969. Within weeks he was the subject of a £60,000 transfer to Southampton.

League record: Orient 1 ap.; Reading 21 aps. 5 gls.; Southampton 84 aps. 4 gls.; Swindon 48(2) aps. 2 gls.

BILL DIXON (Midfield/Defence). Bill began his career with Arsenal but it wasn't until transferring to Reading in 1969 that he got his chance to play League football. He left Reading for Colchester at the end of last season but, as he didn't get into their first-team, he signed for Swindon shortly after this season had opened.

League record: Reading 150(3) aps.; Colchester nil aps.; Swindon 12 aps.

JOE BUTLER (Midfield/Defender). Another survivor of Swindon's 1969 Wembley victory Joe, who was signed from Newcastle in 1965, has played in several positions for Swindon, proving one of their most valuable players over the years. He recently shifted again from defence to midfield.

League record: Newcastle 3 aps.; Swindon 310(2) aps. 14 gls.

PETER EASTOE (Striker). When Peter was recently on loan to Swindon he scored seven goals in 11 League games and he was sorely missed when Wolves, hard hit by injuries, recalled him. Fortunately for Swindon the position eased at Molineux and they completed his £70,000 transfer on the eve of this season's deadline. Peter made his debut for Wolves two seasons ago but got only rare subsequent chances in their senior eleven.

League record: Wolves 4(2) aps.; Swindon 13 aps. 7 gls.
