

Comment

GOOD evening everyone and welcome again to Deepdale. We are now entering a very important period with three consecutive home matches having played ten at home and fifteen away. It is rather unfortunate that the fixtures have fallen this way, but our performance of staying in touch with the leaders while playing six out of the last eight matches away is extremely good. The big disappointment of course was our home defeat by Mansfield. While we did not play particularly well we should still have won the match-but that is fcotball. At Chesterfield last Saturday week, the match was played in extremely dangerous conditions as was proved by the fact that one of the opposing team broke a leg. One penalty area was as hard as concrete and covered with ice, while the other end was fairly soft. A real lottery this match, but at least we took a point. We have in fact had similar conditions here at Deepdale but fortunately we were allocated experienced referees who immediately saw the dangers involved by calling off these games. Fortunately too, none of our players sustained serious injuries during the Chesterfield match so we finished the match rather thankfully.

At Brighton last week luck deserted us but despite losing an early goal we fought back strongly. Through our adventurous tactics in trying to equalize we paid the penalty and lost a second goal when Brighton broke away very quickly. The newpapers gave us a good write up which is always pleasing and the Brighton manager Alan Mullery admitted that it took a tip-top

performance by his boys to crack us. Our lads all gave of their best and if they continue with the same pattern of skill and effort then we have little to worry about.

So to another hard match this evening. Swindon have recorded some outstanding performances of late, so we know it will be a difficult match for us. They scored four against Brighton before the match was abandoned, gave Fulham a thrashing in the Cup and nearly added Everton to their list of conquests.

On the injury front I am pleased to say that Dave Sadler is on the mend. He played for the 'B' team on Saturday in our 2-2 draw with Tranmere. Although the 'B' team is our youth side, the rules do allow us to play up to two senior players in certain circumstances. While on the subject of our youth, I feel I must offer a word of congratulations on their recent victory over Liverpool Youths. It is not very often that we can match the might of Anfield but this was a particular pleasure and was in fact our first win of the season—well done lads.

... Swindon Town

The Club

Swindon Town F.C. was formed in 1881 by a clergyman and they became one of the founder members of the Southern League in 1894. They took the championship of that competition on two occasions before they joined the Football League in 1920.

During their Southern League days, Swindon twice reached the semi-final of the F.A. Cup.

It was in 1963 that they moved into Division Two for the first time in their history. They lost their place two years later but it wasn't long before Swindon were destined for their greatest achievement—when they beat mighty Arsenal 3-1 at Wembley in 1969 to win the League Cup!

Swindon also regained their Second Division place that season, holding it until relegation over-

took them again in 1974.

The Players

Swindon players are very much home-loving characters. For, on their own County Ground they have been hitting goals right, left and centre—they crushed Bromley 7–0 and Fulham 5–0 in the F.A. Cup and Sheffield Wednesday 5–2 in the League.

The goalscorers are David Moss with 13, David

Syrett (11) and Trevor Anderson (10).

Take top scorer David Moss, for example. Only three of his thirteen goals have been claimed away from home. Of Trevor Anderson's ten goals, all but two were scored at Swindon while David Syrett hit ten of his eleven at the County Ground.

Moss and Syrett are both locally discovered players who came into the side in the early seventies. Syrett spent a short period on loan to

Wolves a couple of seasons ago.

Anderson is a regular member of the N. Ireland team and his two World Cup appearances this season took his cap total up to ten. Trevor was playing for Portadown when Manchester United paid £20,000 for him in 1972. Trevor made some twenty First Division appearances for the Reds and joined Swindon for £25,000 in 1974.

Ray McHale, Ken Stroud and Tony Taylor have been playing in midfield for most of the season, though John McLaughlin, normally a full-back,

played here recently.

McHale joined Swindon from Halifax early this season after topping the Shay club's scoring list last term. Once a Huddersfield apprentice, Ray moved to Chesterfield before opening his League career in 1971. He was their top scorer in 1972–3 and he moved on to Halifax two years later.

Ken Stroud emerged from the reserve team in 1971-2 but it was last season that he firmly estab-

lished himself as a first-teamer.

Taylor, signed from Southend last summer, is a versatile player who can also play on the left wing. That was his position when Crystal Palace signed him from Morton in 1968. He later switched to left-back and was transferred to Southend in 1974.

McLaughlin served his apprenticeship with Colchester, making his League debut in 1971–2. Swindon signed him three seasons ago.

Bill Dixon, Colin Prophett, Steve Aizlewood and

John Trollope are the possible back four.

Dixon began with Arsenal, though he didn't play in their first-team. A move to Reading in 1969 enabled him to establish himself in League football. He transferred to Colchester in 1973 but, before he had played for the club, he was on the move again to Swindon.

Prophett played in the First Division for Sheffield Wednesday and made well over 100 appearances for the Hillsborough club before a £45,000 transfer took him to Norwich in 1973. He remained only one season at Carrow Road, however, and joined Swindon for a £20,000 fee. He was appointed captain this season.

Swindon paid £12,000 to sign Aizlewood from Newport County on the eve of last season's transfer deadline. Steve won five Welsh under-23 caps in

his Newport days.

Trollope is one of the most consistent players in the Football League. He first came into the Swindon side in 1960 and in one incredible run he made 368 successive appearances until a broken arm ended the run. He now holds the club record with over 670 League appearances.

Jimmy Allen has had another chance to establish himself in goal this season, being preferred to Jim Barron. Jimmy played his first League game in 1971–2 and in 1973–4 he held the position for most

of the season.

One familiar face usually missing from the Swindon side this season is Don Rogers. He began his career with Swindon in the early sixties but left on a £140,000 transfer for Crystal Palace in 1972. He later went to Q.P.R. before rejoining Swindon last season.

The Manager

As a player, Mr Williams was a one-club man—he totted up 25 years' service with Rotherham United. His playing days ended in 1960, after a run of 460 games in their League team.

After a short break out of the game, Mr Williams returned to Rotherham in 1962 as manager. After three years in the job he decided to retire to open a shop in Bournemouth. Swindon were then seeking a manager and, eventually, he agreed to join them while keeping his business by the sea.

In 1968-9 he produced the side which gained


promotion to the Second Division.

Sheffield Wednesday, who had been struggling for some while, gave him their manager's job.

He was unable to halt their slide into the Second Division. He then left Hillsborough and, mid-way through the 1971-2 campaign, he took over at Mansfield before rejoining Swindon in 1973.






