We often mention how quickly fortunes change in football. Last season on 24th April 1976, Walsall came to the County Ground; almost still in contention for promotion, whilst Swindon was struggling to move away from the bottom four places.

Today the position is almost reversed, whilst we are in quite a good position, but now I am afraid out of any hopes of promotion, Walsall is at the moment in fourth position from bottom in the League table.

We were almost desperate but the game produced our best win of the season, and assured us a place in Division 3 again. I expect many of you remember the game, if only for the award of four penalties by Referee Mr. L.C. Shafter. Anderson converted three for Swindon, and Buckley one for Walsall. Moss and Syrett added further goals, with the final result 5 goals to 1.

Earlier in the season, in the second league game, we drew 1-1 at Walsall, scorer Peter Eastoe.

It is sad to see the Manager Mr. Doug Fraser has left the club. He led the club to its great victories over Manchester United and Newcastle as Walsall went to the fifth round of the F.A. Cup two seasons ago, and last season produced one of the best teams ever fielded by the club.

Now the management has been taken over by Mr. Dave Mackay and Mr. Des Anderson, two people we know.

We wish them well with their new club, one which we shall always remember, in spite of their many difficulties, and opposition from Division I Midland Clubs as one which gave a warm friendly welcome to all their visitors.

One wonders, sometimes, what makes men struggle on, keeping clubs going, when faced with such tremendous odds. It speaks volumes for the Board, and its officials, that in spite of everything Walsall is still a club with a fine reputation.

In the early sixties they spent a short spell in Division 2. In 1961 along with Bury they gained promotion, but in 1963, they and Luton Town were relegated, and their places taken by Northampton Town and Swindon.

It was during that short period that Walsall won at Swindon by 3 goals to 2, after leading by three goals at half-time, in the F.A. Cup Competition.

### Walsall

### MICK KEARNS (Goalkeeper)

Mick is now one of Britain's finest goalkeepers, a regular member of the Republic of Ireland team. Mick, who now has nine caps, distinguished himself particularly at Wembley last September when the Irishman showed England how to play and were unlucky only to draw 1–1.

League record: Oxford 67 aps; Plymouth (loan) 1 ap; Charlton (loan) 4 aps; Walsall 170 aps.

### BRIAN TAYLOR (Defender)

Brian, who also plays in midfield and who continues to swop around a bit, was unlucky with three League clubs - Coventry, Oxford and Northampton - before eventually breaking into the competition with Walsall in 1971.

League record: Coventry nil aps; Oxford (loan) nil aps; Northampton (loan) nil aps; Walsall 183 (12) aps., 24 gls.

### DAVID SERELLA (Defender)

David signed for Walsall towards the close of last season. There was a time, in 1972/73, when he was a regular member of Nottingham Forest's senior team, but in recent times he had been only a deputy.

League record: Nottm. For. 65 (3) aps; Walsall 40 (3) aps.

### ROGER HYND (Defender)

Roger played in the European Cup-Winners' Cup final in 1967 while with Glasgow Rangers. Crystal Palace signed him in 1969 but after only one season, he was transferred to Birmingham City for whom he made over 170 League appearances. He joined Walsall last season.

League record: Rangers 22 (2) aps., 1 gl; C. Palace 30 (1) aps; Birmingham 162 (9) aps., 4 gls; Oxford (loan) 5 aps; Walsall 56 aps., 1 gl.

### BRIAN CASWELL (Defender)

Brian developed in the club's junior teams and made his League debut in 1972/73. For much of this season he has been holding the left-back position though he has also played in midfield.

League record: Walsall 75 (10) aps., 3 gls.

#### MICK BATES (Midfield)

Walsall paid a club record £25,000 to sign Mick from Leeds last summer and he was quickly appointed club captain. Mick was for long periods a regular senior player at Leeds where he made his League bow in 1966/67.

League record: Leeds 106 (21) aps., 4 gls; Walsall 28 (1) aps., 1 gl.

#### NICK ATTHEY (Midfield)

Nick is the Saddlers' longest-serving player and is not far short of the club record of 459 League appearances set up by Colin Taylor in 1973. Nick made his debut in 1963/64.

League record: Walsall 425 (9) aps., 16 gls.

#### MIAH DENNEHY (Forward)

Miah has won eight Republic of Ireland caps, gaining the first while with Cork Hibs. Notting-ham Forest paid £20,000 for him in February 1973 and he moved on to Walsall last season.

League record: Nottm. For. 37 (4) aps., 4 gls; Walsall 76 (1) aps., 13 gls.

#### GEORGE ANDREWS (Forward)

George kicked off with Cardiff City but moved on to Southport in 1967. After heading their scorers list in 1968/69 he moved on the following season to Shrewsbury, remaining until linking with Walsall in 1973.

League record: Cardiff 43 aps., 21 gls; Southport 116 (2) aps., 40 gls; Shrewsbury 123 (1) aps., 50 gls; Walsall 143 (3) aps., 34 gls.

#### ALAN BUCKLEY (Forward)

Alan, Walsall's top scorer ever since he joined the club from Nottm. Forest for £18,000 in 1973, once again leads the way with 15. His tally from 1973/74 on has been 24, 27 and 35 a phenomenal achievement in modern football.

League record: Nottm. For. 16 (2) aps., 1 gl; Walsall 169 aps., 88 gls.

#### DAVID ROBINSON (Defender)

David started with Birmingham City and, following his debut in 1968, he remained in the team for over three years. Walsall signed him for £12,000 in 1973.

League record: Birmingham 110(2) aps, 2 gls; Walsall 156 (1) aps., 3 gls.



## Clough Right To Say No

Could things ever have been quite the same again at Derby for Brian Clough? Could the champagne days of their Championship success have been re-lived with older players or could he have motivated a new generation of young Rams as he did with McFarland, Gemmill and the rest before? Was it the emotional pull, rather than any astute analysis of the situation (and the skeletons remaining from his previous reign), that had Clough even considering a return to the Baseball Ground?

There are still probably too many antagonistic forces at work within the Baseball Ground to make a second Clough coming truly successful at this stage. And it was probably after a cold assessment of these facts that he finally decided to let his head rule his heart, and to pledge his continued allegiance to Nottingham Forest.

It is very rare for any man to prove as successful in his second spell as manager of a club. This season there were six managers having a second go at leading their clubs to success. Apart from one, all achieved far greater successes at the first attempt.

Our manager Danny Williams set himself a high target when he returned to the County Ground, hoping to repeat those great days of 1969 when we beat Arsenal in the League Cup final at Wembley and also gained promotion to the Second Division?

Frank O'Farrell was honest enough to admit the other day that he was finding it difficult to motivate himself now he is in his second stiny with Torquay United. "To be quite honest I don't think I could face the slog of climbing out of the Fourth Division all over gain," he said.

O'Farrell's case is slightly different in that he was persuaded to come out of "retirement" as a personal favour to chairman Tony Boyce, an old friend. Both agreed that the appointment would be on a temporary basis, to be confirmed or broken when both sides had considered the situation at the end of the season.

O'Farrell realised how he felt earlier than anticipated and felt it in the interests of the club to make a statement so that they would have time to find another manager for next season. Now he has handed over to former Plymouth defender Mike Green who has become Torquay's playermanager.

When Alan Ball senior was previously with Halifax Town he led them to their most successful season on record — promotion for the only time in their history. Since returning last season, he has been relegated with them and they don't stand any hope of promotion at the moment.

Things aren't quite the same for Tom Johnstone back at Huddersfield, either. Last time he was there they were a successful Second Division outfit but at the moment they are struggling to lift themselves out of the Fourth Division.

Only Tom McAnearney has managed to win any honours at the second attempt. Since returning to Aldershot he led them to promotion in 1973 for the first time in their history.

Even his tale hasn't a happy ending because the Shots dropped back into Division Four last year.

It is too early to say how Harry Potts may find things in his second spell at Burnley. Yet, it's an odds-on bet that he will NOT enjoy winning the League Championship in the foreseeable future. Neither can he hold out much hope of leading them out at Wembley for the-F.A. Cup final. He was the architect of both those triumphs in an earlier spell in charge at Turf Moor.


Burnley were one of the country's top clubs under his astute guidance in the 'fifties and early 'sixties. Now Mr. Potts will consider it a satisfactory achievement to keep the club out of the Third Division.
