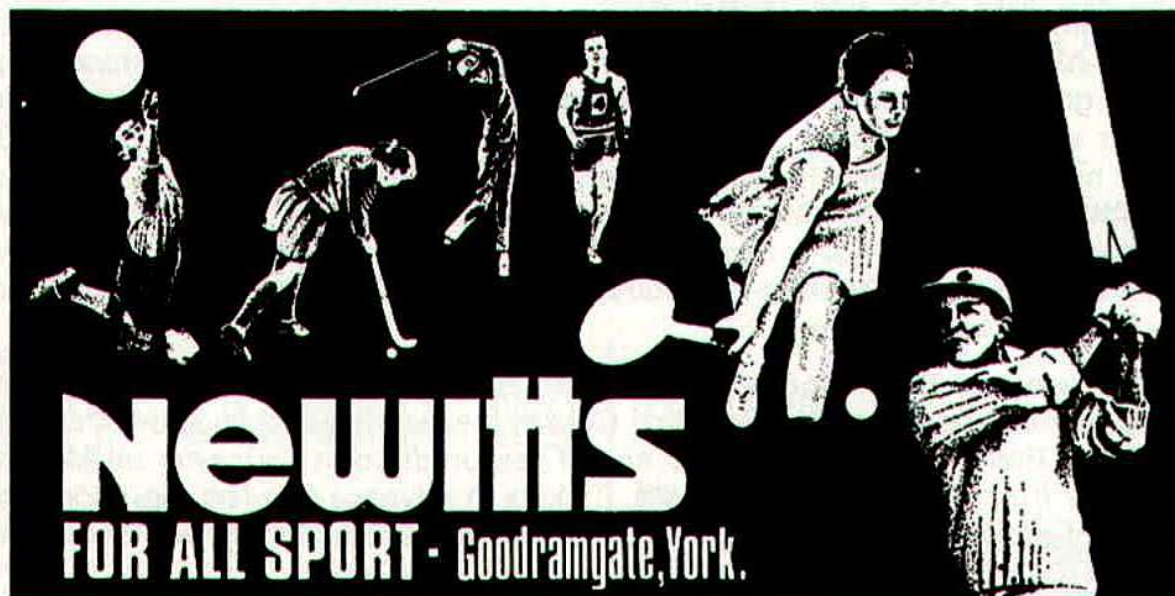

Swindon Town

Swindon Town, one of the highest scoring teams in Division Three have never quite fulfilled the promotion promise expected of them this season.

In fact their best performances seem to have been reserved for the F.A. Cup in which they beat Second Division Fulham 5-0 after drawing 3-3 at Craven Cottage and then held Everton to a draw — losing the replay to the last kick of the game.

Manager Danny Williams is in his second spell in charge of the club. After leading them to success in the League Cup Final in 1969 he became manager of Sheffield Wednesday. He was later in charge at Mansfield Town before returning to Swindon in March 1974.

Goalkeeper JIMMY ALLAN is a Scott who has played close to 100 League games for the club. He has reclaimed the number one spot from JIMMY BARRON, now playing in the States.

JOHN McLAUGHLIN joined the club in December 1973 from Colchester United.

There are fewer more loyal servants in the game than full back JOHN TROLLOPE who has been a professional since August 1960 and has played close to 700 League games. He recently scored his 21st League goal.

Just over a year ago Swindon paid £12,000 to Newport County for defender STEVE AIZLEWOOD - it was the highest fee the Welsh club has ever received. He has played five times for the Welsh under-23 side.

COLIN PROPHETT, 30 last month, played 119 games for Sheffield Wednesday before his transfer to Norwich City in May 1973 for £45,000. He joined Swindon in September 1974, on loan, and signed for a £20,000 fee a month later.

It was a 35 yard goal from KENNY STROUD which earned the club a Cup replay at Goodison

Park in the fourth round of the F.A. Cup. A former apprentice he has been a professional since 1970.

Sheffield born RAY McHALE played for Huddersfield Town, Chesterfield and Halifax Town before Swindon signed him for £17,000 in September. Since then he has scored his 50th League goal.

WILL DIXON was a youngster with Arsenal but did not make his League debut until he joined Reading. He played 153 League games with that club before being released in May 1973.

Northern Ireland international TREVOR ANDERSON — he won his tenth cap against Belgium in November — has been with Swindon since November 1974 when he was signed from Manchester United for £25,000. United signed him for £12,500 from Portadown in October 1972 but he played only 19 games for them. He was top scorer last season and leads this list again this term.

DAVE SYRETT is also a regular goalscorer. He joined Swindon as an apprentice in July 1972 and became a professional 16 months later. He had a two months loan spell with Wolverhampton Wanderers in 1975 but did not appear in the League side.

DAVID MOSS is the third member of the goalscoring front line. He has played all his League soccer with Swindon and has been a professional since 1969.

Swindon signed TONY TAYLOR on a free transfer from Southend in August. He played his first soccer with the Scottish club Morton and was with Crystal Palace before his move to Southend, for £15,000, in August 1974.

MEMORY LANE by DAVID BATTERS

Swindon Town this evening are making only their 3rd league visit to Bootham Crescent. The previous matches have all been in Division 3 and past results are as follows. (City's score first in each instance).

The Clubs first met at York in January 1960. In the Town side were Walter Bingley and John Fountain who were both to join City at the end of that season. Bingley spent 3 years at Bootham Crescent (1960-1963) whilst Fountain had a stay of 4 seasons (1960-1964). Two other personalities in the Wiltshire's team line-up that day were a youthful Ernie Hunt on the right wing and "Bronco" Layne at centre forward. Hunt was later to give Wolves and then Coventry sterling service whilst Layne after a spell at Bradford City went on to do first division duty with Sheffield Wednesday.

The game was played under very wet muddy conditions. City were much the better side in the first half and almost opened the scoring in the opening minutes when Billy Hill after a fine dribble saw his shot fingertipped on to the crossbar by Town keeper Burton. Hill was making one of his rare senior appearances. He had joined City from non-league football in 1955 but most of his 5 seasons at Bootham Crescent were spent in the reserve team. City kept up the pressure and Peter Wragg hit the crossbar with a fine header and the woodwork was struck for a third time when Charlie Twissell hit the post direct from a corner. Layne went close for Town and then Colin Addison broke the deadlock in the 40th minute. Billy Hughes dribbled close to goal and the ball broke to the inside forward who left footed it into the net from six yards. City's midfield supremacy had kept them on top in the first period but after the interval the visitors were more in the picture. Layne spearheaded a number of lively attacks and City had to defend

strongly to protect their slender lead and play was exciting as the sides battled away in the mud. Only a magnificent save by Tommy Forgan prevented a last minute equaliser by Layne and City just about deserved their narrow win which lifted them into midfield with 29 points from 29 games. A disastrous finish to the season, however, with only 9 points from the remaining 17 games ended in relegation whilst Swindon finished in 16th place with 46 points.

Swindon's other visit in August 1965 marked City's first home game back in Division 3 after 5 years in the wilderness. Town had just suffered relegation after 2 seasons in higher company and they ran out deserved winners by 2 goals.

City made a bright start and Paul Aimson and Dave Dunmore tested Peter Downsborough with fine shots but the visitors settled down and opened their account after half an hour with a well taken goal by Brown. City's challenge faded when Don Rogers scored in the 58th minute with a long range shot that Tommy Forgan misjudged. A disappointing start to what was to prove a dismal season for City which ended with them finishing bottom with just 27 points. Swindon finished 7th with 51 points.
