# ARFON GRIFFITHS



It's certainly been a hectic week at The Racecourse, especially in the transfer business — but I am delighted to have clinched the deal which brought Dixie McNeil (and goalkeeper Dai Davies) to Wrexham F.C.

I knew as soon as I sold Billy Ashcroft, that I would have to pay extra for any player I bought. I am the first to admit that I probably paid a little over the odds for Dixie. But I got a good deal on the Ashcroft transfer, so we have come out of the transactions the best off. I have now got a player whose goalscoring records speaks for itself — he got more than 90 goals in four seasons with Hereford United!

He has a different style to Billy Ashcroft, but I am sure the Wrexham fans will take to him.

I have been asked if I have paid too much for a player aged 30 — well I don't believe in certain prices for certain ages, Dixie is a specialist. He is deadly in the box, and if he does what I expect him to do, then he will have been a bargain at any price!

Dai Davies of course has given tremendous service to Wales. He is a big, confident 'keeper, and I believe he will quickly settle in and dictate his area. It is a very difficult position for a manager to replace players who have given fine service to a club or drop a youngster such as Eddie Niedzwiecki, who I believe has a great future. He has only had one off game since he came in, and that was at Tranmere, but being a goalkeeper, mistakes usually mean goals. His experience of first team football will have done him the power of good.

I think we have the best footballing side in Division Three our two new players complete the team and add that extra bonus. With Graham Whittle injured it has been left to Bobby Shinton to get the goals and he has been tremendous, but it is easier for opposition to

mark one player tight. Now, when Graham is completely match fit, it will be a different story. Sides will have to watch three strikers — Dixie, Graham and Bobby!

Dixie is a player who thrives on good service — we have the ability in the side to provide him with exactly just that. That is another reason I bought him.

Looking back on our last three games, it was disappointing to get only two points. Ironically, the win at home over Portsmouth was not our best display of the season. Bobby Shinton made the difference between the sides. At Tranmere we gave goals away at the back and failed to score with our chances up front. It is always a tight game at Tranmere but I really was disappointed losing 3—1. At Chesterfield last Saturday we had more of the play than we did there last year and then we won 6—0! Our 'keeper had to make only two saves, apart from the penalty.

We have time to sort out our problems. It is a long season. I think we have only got to get that bit of luck which all successful sides need, and freedom from injuries, and we will be back to normal.

We make a point on watching our opponents before games and although the season is only a month old, we have seen all but three sides — Carlisle, Lincoln and Plymouth. Today's visitors Swindon Town is by far the best side we have seen.

They play our type of open football. They are as good as most of the teams in the Second Division and on their day as good as some in the First! I have always admired Swindon.

If you recall, they played us off the park last season for half an hour and we found ourselves two goals down, but fought back to get a point. Today has the makings of a classic.



# FLASHBACK What The Papers Said

## 10 years ago—Sept. 1967

Wrexham transferred Sammy McMillan to Southend United for £6,000 — McMillan had been Wrexham's leading scorer and had joined Wrexham from Manchester United in 1963 for £8,000.

Wrexham stormed to a 6—0 home victory over Hartlepool United. Ray Smith (2), Terry Bradbury (2), Don Weston, Arfon Griffiths were the marksmen. The attendance was 7,149. The Wrexham line-up was — Livsey, Ingle, Showell, Mielczarek, Stacey, Beanland, Bradbury, Weston, Smith, Kinsey, Griffiths. Sub. Mickey Evans.

In a Monday night match Wrexham missed their chances and ended up with a goalless draw against Doncaster Rovers.

## 15 years ago—Sept. 1962

Wrexham were reported to have made a near £10,000 bid to buy back Arfon Griffiths transferred 18 months earlier to Arsenal. Highbury manager Billy Wright said to be considering the offer.

Wrexham went to their biggest league defeat ... 8—0 at Northampton. The rot set in soon after Peter Jones was carried off after a tackle by John Kurila. Cliff Holt (2), Holton (2), Alec Ashworth (1) and a hat-trick from Barry Lines caused most of the damage.

Wrexham hit back with a 2—1 home win over Carlisle in front of 9,378 at The Racecourse. Ambler and Metcalf were the scorers. Carlisle's Ron Thompson was sent off after a tackle on Metcalf and earlier Alan Fox had been barged into the wall by former Welsh international Reg Davies.

## 20 years ago—Sept. 1957

Wrexham centre-forward Barry Smith scored in the fifth minute against his home town club Bradford City but visitors Wrexham missed chances of making the game safe before half-time — and finished 3—1 down. The attendance was 9,258.

In a mid-week match at The Racecourse Wrexham lost 1—0 to Crewe in front of only 3,048. The only goal of the game came from a 30-yard shot from Arthur Rowley.

In a reserve team match against Chester which ended in a 1—1 draw Wrexham goalkeeper Billy Waters was sent off after an incident with Fields — and Tommy McNab went into goal.

### CHESTERFIELD 1 WREXHAM 0

*Sunday Express* — "As the match crept into the last minutes Wrexham stepped up their pressure on the Chesterfield goal area in a last ditch effort but with each attack coming to nothing Wrexham knew this was not to be their day".

*Sunday People* — Wrexham missed two sitters and went behind when Hill pulled back Parker — and the Chesterfield striker hit home the resultant spot kick.

The Welshmen were left to reflect on their lack of punch up front. Shinton and Sutton shot wide, Lyons headed over and had a shot blocked.

*News of the World* — The Welsh side never looked like scoring let alone repeating the 6—0 thrashing they gave Chesterfield in the corresponding fixture last season.

They missed two early sitters and spent a great deal of the second half attacking Chesterfield's goal but the final punch was lacking.

Player-manager Arfon Griffiths decided to bring himself on from the subs' bench towards the end but even he could not inspire his side to find an equaliser".

*Wrexham Leader* (Ron Chaloner) — Wrexham's best effort, which followed splendid work by Mel Sutton and Bobby Shinton was a powerful drive by Mickey Evans, who did well in his midfield role, but it was brilliantly turned aside by Steve Ogrizovic. Alas for Wrexham, most of the rest of their scoring attempts were about as straight as Chesterfield's famous crooked spire, which was the reason they remained pointless after giving Chesterfield a roasting for much of the second half.

*Shropshire Star* (David Lovett) — The point is: If you don't score, you can't possibly win — and Wrexham wasted gilt-edged chances. Bobby Shinton, Mel Sutton and John Lyons all squandered glorious openings which would have put the issue beyond doubt had they been tucked away.

But even with Graham Whittle back in action, the attack never really clicked and consequently Wrexham were once again left wondering what might have been had those chances been converted.

*Daily Mail* — "Wrexham suffered another set back to their hopes of renewing their promotion challenge. They lost 1—0 at Chesterfield who have taken maximum points from the first four home games and lead Division Three".

*Daily Mirror* — "Stuart Parker's penalty could not paper over the cracks in an unconvincing performance and Wrexham showed why they hope to sign Hereford striker Dixie McNeil this week".

*Daily Post* — "Wrexham's finest moment came shortly before half-time when Mickey Evans cleverly spun around to hit the ball towards the goal and it took a brilliant save from Ogrizovic to push it away to safety".

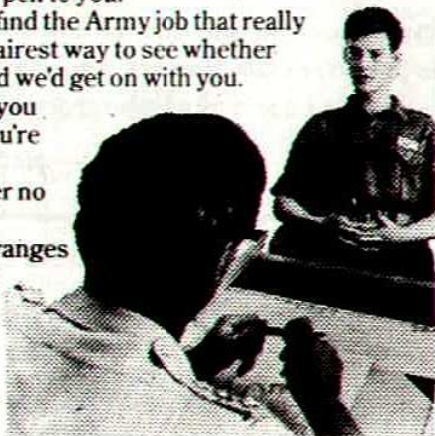

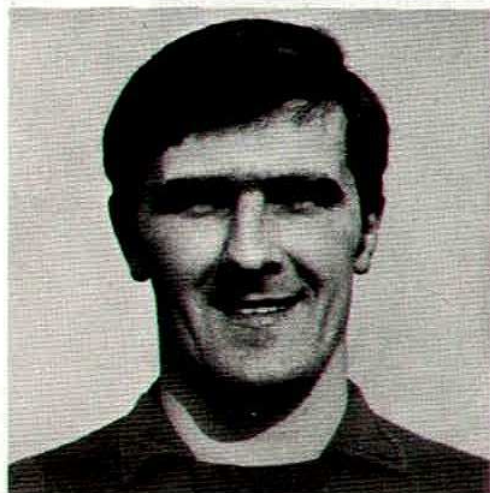

# Side Lines



Wales and Everton goalkeeper **Dai Davies** became the 'Second Leg' of Wrexham's big transfer buys this week.

Dai signed on Thursday soon after returning from Kuwait. The fee was in the region of £10,000.

"Never has a team achieved so much in one season only to be cruelly denied promotion at the very end" Wrexham F.C. chairman Mr. Fred Tomlinson speaking at the annual shareholders' meeting. Mr. Tomlinson was re-elected chairman. The shareholders decided to buy a gift for John Neal to mark the work he did for the club before leaving for Middlesbrough.

**GRAHAM WHITTLE** took a parcel of fruit from his team-mates for his pal **DAVE SMALLMAN** now recovering from a broken leg sustained during his comeback bid in an Everton Reserves match. Smallman has had about every possible set-back since moving to Goodison Park — but he is determined to get back into action as soon as possible.

Wrexham F.C. hope to have their international ground status back by the beginning of May. The club will apply for a Ground Safety Certificate on the 18th October and hope to have a 16,000 limit by January and 25,000 by May. A lot of improvements on the 'Kop' are to be carried out. "We have had a great deal of help from Clwyd County Council and seeking a solution to this problem," said secretary Norman Wilson.

**STEVE KENWORTHY** Wrexham's brilliant young defender and striker **PETER WILLIAMS** had a two-day training session with the Welsh

Youth Squad in Cardiff this week, in preparation for the Youth World Cup match against Iceland at Cardiff at the beginning of next month.

Tickets for the **Wales v. Scotland** World Cup match at Anfield on October 12th are now on sale at The Racecourse — and the Secretary warns those who want to buy them to act quickly because they will be returned for sale in Scotland on October 4th. Ground tickets are £1.50p and paddock £2.50. Stand tickets are also available at £5 with season ticket holders getting first choice on production of cup-tie voucher K.

Middlesbrough's **BILLY ASHCROFT** was back in town this week — and he called in to see his old team-mates at The Racecourse. Billy who scored a goal and had nother disallowed in his First Division home debut against Birmingham City is enjoying his move to the top flight.

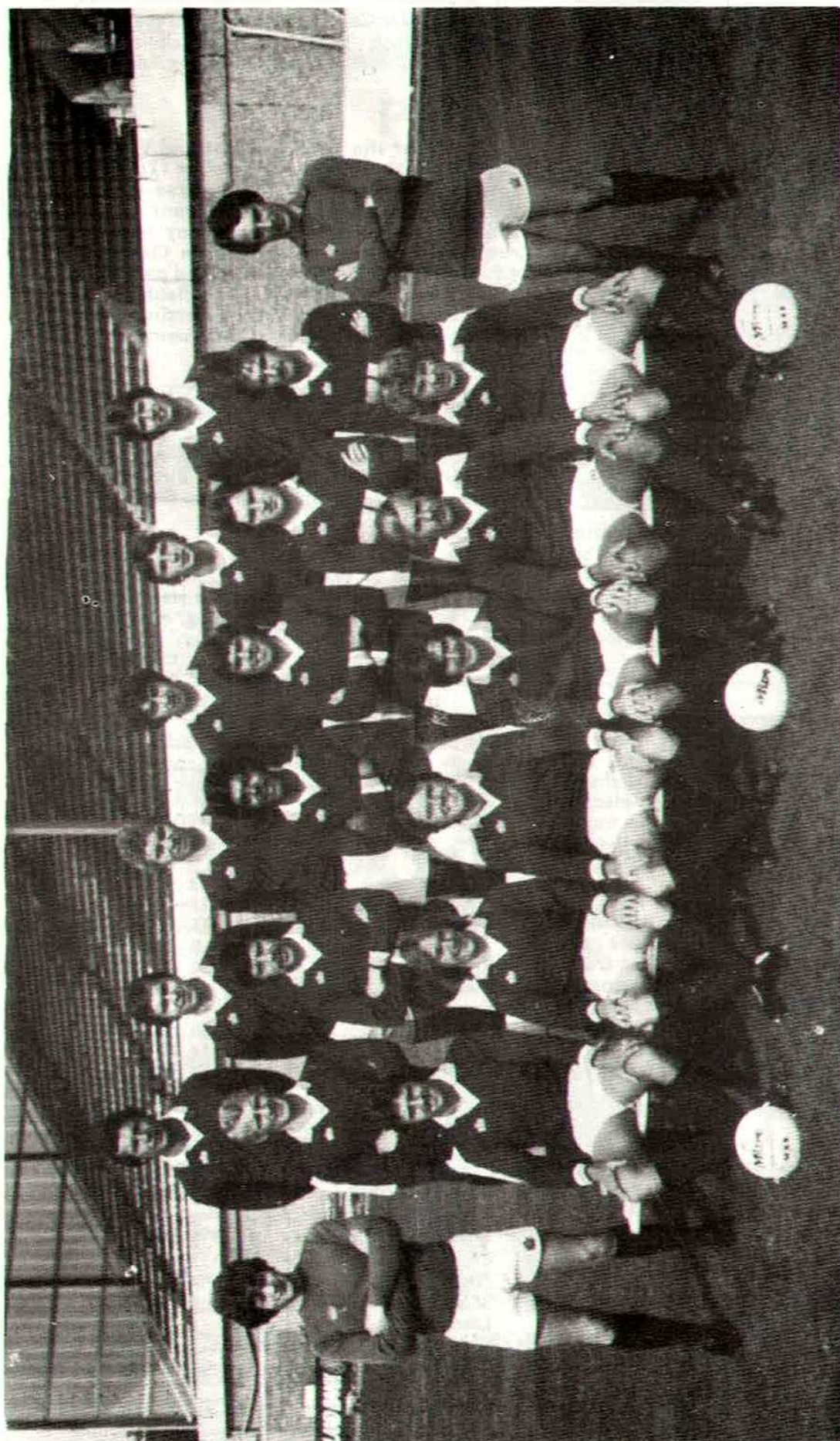

# SWINDON TOWN

## PEN PICS 1977/78 SEASON

Up to and including last Saturday, Swindon had made a good start to the season lying in sixth position. Their League results:

**Home** — Peterborough 2—0, Portsmouth 3—1, Chesterfield 2—1, Bury 1—1,

**Away** — Sheffield Wednesday 1—1, Walsall 0—2, Preston 1—1,

Swindon are through to the 3rd round of the League Cup. In the first round they beat Swansea away 3—1 and at home 2—1 and in the second round they thrashed Cardiff 5—1.

Joint top goalscorers are Chris Guthrie and Trevor Anderson with 5 League and Cup goals each. The rest of the goals have gone to Moss 3, McHale 3, Kamara 2, and Trollope and Ford each have 1.

### JIMMY ALLAN (Goalkeeper)

Born in Inverness, he was signed from Brora Rangers in October 1970 as an apprentice. Signed on full terms in July, 1971, he made his League debut two months later, but had only occasional spells as first choice until last season by the end of which, he had made a total of 114 League appearances.

### JOHN TROLLOPE (Full-back)

The Club's longest-serving player he is a former apprentice and signed professional in August, 1960. Also holds the Club appearance record with 698 League appearances to the end of last season and around 800 in all competitions. Now the only playing survivor with the Club of the promotion-winning sides of 1963 and 1969 the latter of which also beat Arsenal in the League Cup Final at Wembley. Born a few miles from the ground one of the most loyal and hard-working players in the game.

### ANDREW FORD (Defender)

A Somerset lad, born in Minehead, he played for Somerset Schoolboys and Youths and Minehead in the Western League whilst still at school. Upon leaving school aged 17, he joined A.F.C. Bournemouth as a professional and stayed with them for two years. At 19 he joined Southend United and became a regular member of their first team, winning the 'Player of the Year' award for that Club last season. He was also in the Fourth Division team selected by the P.F.A. after four years with Southend. He joined Swindon in August, 1977. He made 135 first team appearances for Southend.

### KENNY STROUD (Midfield)

Although London-born he served his apprenticeship at Swindon becoming a professional in 1970, but had to wait several seasons to gain a regular first team place. Has played as a central defender but is usually found in midfield from where he scored a spectacular goal against Everton last season which was captured by T.V. cameras.

### STEVE AIZLEWOOD (Centre-half)

Began his League career at the age of sixteen with Newport County Football Club, his home town Club for whom he made 191 League appearances before his transfer to Swindon in March, 1976. He won four Welsh under-23 caps with Newport and had made 43 League appearances for Swindon to the end of last season.

### CHRIS GUTHRIE (Forward)

Born in Newcastle, but only made five appearances for his home town Club before moving to Southend where he made 107 League appearances and in two seasons was leading goalscorer and voted 'Player of the Year' for that Club. Transferred to Sheffield United during the 1975 close season, but although he made 58 League appearances in his two seasons there he did not settle well and moved to Swindon in July, 1977.

### DAVID MOSS (Forward)

Signed from non-League football with Witney, his local team, he made his League debut for Swindon in April, 1972 and has since played 172 League games to the end of last season. Last season's leading goalscorer and 'Player of the Year' he is an orthodox winger and although usually played on the left can play either side.

### TREVOR ANDERSON (Forward)

Comes from Belfast and started his career with Portadown before transferring to Manchester United for whom he made 13 League appearances. Joined Swindon in November, 1974 and has played a number of times for Northern Ireland being a regular cap last season. Very much a player of pace and skill on the ball he had made 101 League appearances for Swindon to the end of last season.

### RAY McHALE (Midfield)

A native of Sheffield he played 123 League games for Chesterfield before moving to Halifax Town in October, 1974. In almost two years there he did not miss a match, making 86 appearances and was leading goalscorer in 1975/1976. Transferred to Swindon in September 1976 he made 41 League appearances to the end of last season and likes to score goals coming from positions in midfield.

**JOHN McLAUGHLIN (Midfield/Full-back)**  
Born in London and served his apprenticeship with Colchester United for whom he made 66 League appearances. He has played for England at Youth level and attracted a £25,000 fee when signing for Swindon in December, 1973. A regular member of the team since then he was originally a full-back and spent most of last season in that position, but has also spent some quite lengthy periods in midfield. Made 136 appearances to the end of last season.

# ***New boy Guthrie bang on target——***

**Swindon Town's record close season spending spree has reaped quick dividends for manager Danny Williams.**

In his second spell at the County Ground, Williams began with free transfer winger Dave Cunningham from Southend.

After selling striker Dave Syrett to Mansfield he took the cash plunge by splashing out £27,500 on Sheffield United centre-forward Chris Guthrie.

Then he snapped up utility player Andy Ford for £8,000 from Southend before capturing Portsmouth's precocious midfielder Chris Kamara for £17,500.

In a run of ten games before today's match that has produced six wins, three draws and one defeat the newcomers have made a swift impact.

**Guthrie scored in his debut and has now notched five times to become joint top scorer with Northern Ireland International Trevor Anderson.**

Kamara managed a goal in his League debut before scoring against his old Portsmouth team-mates. But so intense is competition for places that he recently lost his place to Ford.

Ford was brought into the middle and scored in his first full appearance against Chesterfield a fortnight ago.

The Town also owe much to the consistent form of their old hands.

Last season Swindon's defence proved one of the leakiest in the division. But the backline now has a more watertight look about it.

In front of improving Scots 'keeper Jimmy Allan skipper Colin Prophet and Welsh under-23 international Steve Aizlewood have sewn up the middle.

On the flanks veteran John Trollope — who recently celebrated his 800th Swindon appearance — is playing better than ever along with right-back John McLaughlin.

In midfield Ray McHale, a bargain buy for £8,000 from Halifax a year ago, has provided plenty of goals from the middle in harness with the hard-working Kenny Stroud — a former England Schoolboy international.

Up front the prolific Anderson and Guthrie look to skilful winger David Moss to stretch opposing defences.

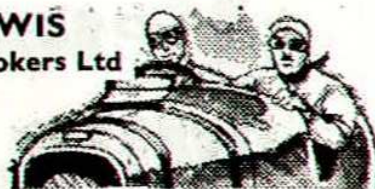

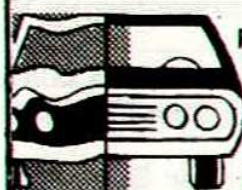
